#### MINUTES, OCONEE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING

The regular meeting of the Oconee County Council was held Tuesday, February 3, 1998 at 7:00 pm in Council Chambers with all Council Members except Ms. Burrell present. The County Attorney was also present.

The meeting was called to order by Supervisor -Chairman Orr who welcomed the guests and media.

The invocation was given by Mr. Thomas.

Mrs. Hughes made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hamilton, approved 4 - 0 (Ms. Burrell absent) that the minutes of the January 20, 1998 meeting be adopted as printed.

First on the agenda was a public hearing to receive written and/or oral comments regarding Ordinance 97-15, "1997-98 OCONEE COUNTY SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE".

There was no one present with written and/or oral comments regarding this ordinance.

Following the public hearing, Mr. Hamilton made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Hughes, approved 4 - 0 (Ms. Burrell absent) that Ordinance 97-15 be adopted on third and final reading.

Upon recommendation of Mr. Jon Caime, County Engineer, & Ms. Marianne Dillard, Purchasing Agent, Mrs. Hughes made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hamilton, approved 4 - 0 (Ms. Burrell absent) that the bid for replacement windows for Pine Street School be awarded to Tri State Glass, Inc. who was low bid at \$60,179.35. Upon recommendation of Ms. Ansley Fraser, ATAX Committee, Mr. Hamilton made a motion, seconded by Mr. Timms, approved 4 - 0 (Ms. Burrell absent) that an ATAX Grant in the amount of \$4,700 be awarded to the Greater Seneca Chamber of Commerce for the Jerry Ryhne Fishing Tournament. (See attachment)

Upon recommendation of Mrs. Geri McSwain, Chairperson, ATAX Committee, Mr. Thomas made a motion, seconded by Mr. Timms, approved 4 - 0 (Ms. Burrell absent) that Ordinance 98-1, "AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE OCONEE COUNTY ACCOMMODATION TAX ADVISORY COMMITTEE" be adopted on first reading in title only.

Mrs. McSwain also addressed Council regarding changing the method ATAX Grants are expended, most counties issue the funds to the ATAX Committee and the committee insures that these funds are spent in a timely manner for the project approved by the committee and County Council and that all unexpended funds are returned to the county.

During this discussion, Council Members expressed feelings that this should be included in the ATAX Ordinance and that a maximum of funds to be expended in this manner also be included in the ordinance.

Mr. Buddy Timmons, CHARTER Cable, addressed Council regarding the "Election of Franchise Fee on Franchise Fee". After discussion, Mr. Timms made a motion that the county accept the fee on fee, however, this motion died for lack of a second.

Upon recommendation of Mr. Henry Gordon, Emergency Preparedness Director, Mr. Hamilton made a motion, seconded by Mr. Timms, approved 4 - 0 (Ms. Burrell absent) that the county apply for a South Carolina Emergency Preparedness Local Government Grant in the amount of \$6,038 to assist children with stress management following a disaster.

Upon recommendation of the Personnel & Intergovernmental Committee, Council adopted Ordinance 97-14, "AN ORDINANCE TO ADOPT THE OCONEE COUNTY PERSONNEL POLICIES AND PROCEDURES MANUAL AND RESCINDING ORDINANCE 80-2" as drafted on third and final reading.

Upon recommendation of Supervisor Orr, Mrs. Hughes made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hamilton, approved 4 - 0 (Ms. Burrell absent) that Larry Harden be appointed to represent West Union on the Sewer Commission.

Mr. Timms informed Council that he had been told by Dirk Reis, SC Appalachian Council of Governments that it was to late for the county to apply for a housing grant in February and the next cycle of grants would be June. All the Council Members expressed an interest in continuing with the Housing & Revitalization Committee and seeking such grants.

Mr. Thomas informed Council that at the last meeting, Council voted to engage John Little to appraise the timber on the proposed motor pool site, however, there were no lumber companies that wanted to cut such a small area, therefore it was deemed appropriate that the county cut the timber and carry it to the lumber companies in order for the county to obtain full price for the timber. The county will realize approximately \$2,000 from the sale of this timber.

Mr. Thomas further informed Council that since the discussion at the last Council Meeting regarding the citizens voting to choose the form of government they would like to have he had been informed that the choice would be limited to two forms of government, the present form and one other and he felt Council needed to have discussions regarding which other form to offer.

Mr. Orr informed Council the county has received three requests for proposals to haul waste. The county will have to haul until we get a subtitle "D" landfill, but he further expressed feelings that the county should apply for a permit to construct a landfill on the 512 acre site in Pickens County.

Mrs. Hughes made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hamilton, approved 4 - 0 (Ms. Burrell absent) that Nick Williams be reappointed to represent District IV on the Emergency Preparedness Commission.

Mr. Timms made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hamilton, approved 4 - 0 (Ms. Burrell absent) that Superior Barge, Inc. be extended credit at the Rock Crusher as per Ordinance 91-10.

Mr. Orr informed Council that Ms. M. Frances
Burrell would be resigning her Council Seat, effective March 1,
1998. Mr. Timms made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hamilton, approved
4 - 0 (Ms. Burrell absent) that Ms. Burrell be sent a letter of
appreciation for her service to the citizens of the county as
Council representative from District I.

After being informed by the County Attorney that the motion made regarding Ordinance 97-15 had not been amended to include the changes since the last reading, Mr. Hamilton made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Hughes, approved 4 - 0 (Ms. Burrell absent) that the motion to adopt the ordinance on third and final reading be withdrawn.

#### Dear Tournament Host:

We wish to take this opportunity to thank you for consenting to be the tournament host for The Fisherman's Bass Circuit tournament on Keowee Lake. The tournament dates are March 28 & 29, 1998 with the three preceding days as practice days.

The following are the tournament host responsibilities:

- 1. \$4,000. cash (to be paid in full on March 29, 1998).
- 2. Seven complimentary Motel Rooms for two nights each. (March 27 & 28). One room will be designated for a late check-out on Sunday. Two only complimentary rooms will be furnished on Thursday March 26, 1998.
- 3. A stage at the tournament weigh-in site. This may be a flatbed trailer with two sets of steps.
- 4. Electrical power at the weigh-in site.
- 5. A minimum of six volunteers to help at the weigh-in. They must be available from 2:30 p.m. on Saturday until 5:30 p.m. and on Sunday 1:30 p.m. until 4:30 p.m. These folks will help with various jobs including putting live fish back into the lake. Our live fish release rate is better than 90%.
- An indoor facility capable of seating 350 people for the Friday evening registration and meeting. Must be available from 3:00 p.m. until 9:00 p. m.
  - 7. A backdrop for the stage consisting of 6 2x4's 12 feet long, 6 1x4 8 feet long and 4 sheets of 4x8 lattice.
- 8. A pontoon boat to be used as a check-in boat. This boat should be available from 2:30 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. on Saturday and 1:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. on Sunday.

The combination of brush and rock, were the key to the young angler's success. "All my fish came on either a 3/4 ounce black and blue jig or a 1/ 2 ounce white and chartreuse spinnerbait, in 5 to 15 feet of water," said McCombs. "I felt like everyone else would be in the backs of the creeks, so I targeted the main part of the lake."

Warrior, Alabama native Gerald Swindle held on with his two-day catch of twelve bass weighing 24.94 pounds to claim third place, and a \$3,000 payday.

"On day two of the tournament, I went back to fishing the same way that I ended the first day, I threw a jig on what we call mountain run-offs on the sides of bluffs. The two or three creeks I had saved for pitching and flipping turned in to just red mud, and I couldn't get bit in them," said Swindle. "I caught three fish early today, and then three more later in the day, but I just didn't get the big bite that Lwas looking for."

Swindle concentrated his efforts on the White Oak, Crooked Creek and Wright Creek areas of the lake using a Bubba's Bug Jig with a black and blue Biggy Back trailer to bring six fish limits to the scales each day.

- The controversial 13-16 inch slot limit imposed upon the lake by Alabama Wildlife officials, which had most of the anglers upset, was taken in stride by the local fishermen. "It really

# Keowee "Big Bucks" next event

The deep, clear waters of South Carolina's Lake Keowee, is the next stop on the 1997 Fisherman's Bass Circuit trail, on March 22-23. The second of three "Big Buck\$" team tournaments scheduled for the year, this event has already reached its full field, and is now closed to further entries.

As a result of the full field, the total payout of the tournament has been adjusted accordingly says FBC president Jerry Rhyne.

First place is now worth a total of \$25,500, which includes a fully rigged Ranger Boat, matching RangerTrail trailer, either a Johnson FastStrike or Evinrude Intruder 150 outboard. OMC 12/24 trolling motor, OMC Raker prop and Delco Voyager Marine Batteries, plus a check for \$5,500.

The second place team will receive a prize package worth \$21,500. This package includes a Ranger boat with matching RangerTrail trailer, Evinrude Intruder or Johnson FastStrike 150, OMC 12/24 trolling motor, OMC Raker prop, Delco Voyager Marine Batteries and a \$1,500 check.

Third place will receive a check for \$5,500, fourth place will be worth \$3,500, and fifth place will receive \$3,000. The 6th through the 10th place teams will receive \$2,500 per team, 11th through 15th earn \$2,000 per team, 16th through 20th receive \$1,500 and 21st through 25th earn \$1,250.

Ten additional places will be paid, and 26th through 35th will be worth \$750 to those qualifying teams. These changes bring the total payout for the event to more than \$100,000, the largest in the history of the Fisherman's Bass Circuit!

Lake Keowee, situated amid the towering mountains, and rolling hillsides of what is known as South Carolina's "Golden Corner." The lake offers anglers more than 18,000 acres of surface area with more than 300 miles of shoreline. Impounded in 1971, Keowee is the first lake developed as part of Duke Powers Keowee-Toxaway Complex.


- Both smallmouth and largemouth bass inhabit the waters of Lake Keowee, and according to Duke Power environmentalists, populations of both species of black bass are thriving:

The area is steeped in history, spanning more than 1,000. The Cherokee Indians were the first identifiable clan to inhabit the area, followed by the Creek In-

dians from Mexico. It is thought that the Creeks brought with them the first tomato seeds, making the area the first in North America where the tomato was cultivated. A clan of Iroquois Indians from what is now New York State, settled on the banks of the Keowee River about the same time the Creeks moved up from Mexico. The nearby city of Seneca derives its name from the Iroquois.



AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE OCONEE COUNTY ACCOMMODATION TITLE: TAX ADVISORY COMMITTEE

#### SECTION I PREAMBLE

Whereas, the General Assembly for the State of South Carolina has imposed a tax upon accommodations for transients and has codified the same in Chapter 36 of Title 12 of the South Carolina Code of Laws; and,

Whereas, §6-4-25, South Carolina Code of Laws Annotated (1976), as amended, provides that a County receiving more than Twenty-Five Thousand and No/100 (\$25,000.00) Dollars in revenue from the accommodations tax and County areas collecting more than Fifty Thousand and no/100 (\$50,000.00) Dollars shall appoint an advisory committee to make recommendations on the expenditure of revenue generated from the accommodations tax; and,

Whereas, the Oconee County Council, as the governing body for Oconee County, South Carolina has determined that it is necessary and appropriate to enact an ordinance providing for the creation of a local Accommodation Tax Advisory Committee for Oconee County.

NOW THEREFORE, the Oconee County Council, in session, duly assembled adopts this ordinance for the purposes stated herein.

#### SECTION II TITLE

The title of this Ordinance shall be "An Ordinance Providing for the Creation of the Oconee County Accommodation Tax Advisory Committee".

#### SECTION III PURPOSE

The purpose of this Ordinance shall be to create and provide for an advisory committee for the purpose of advising the Oconee County Council concerning the distribution of revenues received by Oconee County and generated from the accommodations tax.

#### SECTION IV MEMBERSHIP AND FUNCTIONS

A) Upon the effective date of this Ordinance, the Oconee County Accommodations Tax Advisory Committee shall be reorganized and reconstituted as set forth herein. Members of the Committee shall be appointed by the Oconee County Council in session, duly assembled. The Advisory Committee shall consist of seven members with a majority being selected from the hospitality industry of the County. At least two of the hospitality industry members shall be from the lodging industry. One member shall represent the cultural organizations of the County. Membership of the Committee shall be representative of all areas of the County with a majority of the

membership coming from no one area. Each member shall serve a term of three (3) years, EXCEPT that the initial term of four (4) members shall be for a period of two (2) years, with the initial term of the remaining three (3) members to be for a period of three (3) years, and thereafter, all members shall serve for a three (3) year term or until their successors in office are duly appointed. No member shall vote on any matter in which he has an economic interest for himself, a member of his immediate family, individual with whom he is associated, or a business with which he is associated.

- Removal of Members. Members of the Committee may be removed at any time by a majority of the Oconee County Council for cause. If or in the event any member shall fail to attend fifty (50%) percent of the regularly scheduled meetings within a period of twelve (12) calendar months, such member shall be deemed to have resigned his position and may be replaced without notice by action of the Oconee County Council. PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that if such absences are excused by the Chairman of the Committee and/or the Supervisor-Chairman of the Oconee County Council, then this provision may be waived.
  - Function and duties of the Committee. The Advisory Committee shall adopt guidelines to fit the needs and time

- D) <u>Compensation</u>. Members of the Advisory Committee shall serve without compensation, but shall be entitled to be reimbursed according to the County reimbursement policy, <u>per diem</u> for travel outside of Oconee County when the same is necessary in the furtherance of the Committee's business and that of the County Council upon prior approval of the Oconee County Council.
- E) Organization. The Advisory Committee shall meet as often as is necessary and shall enact its own by-laws governing the conduct of its meetings. From its own number, to serve a term of one (1) year, the Committee shall select a chairman, vice-chairman,

secretary and treasurer and such other officers as the Committee deems necessary and appropriate. All officers, including the chairman, shall have the right to vote on any question coming before the advisory committee. All officers may be re-elected to serve successive terms during their membership.

#### SECTION V

All Ordinances, Motions, Resolutions and Acts of the Oconee County Council inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed. All actions and recommendations of any Advisory Committee established by Oconee County for the purposes of making recommendations for the distribution of ATAX Funds and approved by the Oconee County Council are hereby ratified and affirmed. If any word, phrase, sentence, paragraph or provision of this Ordinance is held invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining words, phrases sentences, paragraphs and provisions shall survive such action and shall remain in full force and effect.

On November 26, we sent a letter notifying you of the recent decision by the Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals regarding the "fee on fee " issue. This decision established that gross revenues from a cable operator may now include franchise fees for the purpose of calculating and paying franchise fees. The purpose of the letter was to determine whether or not Oconee County preferred that franchise fees be included as part of gross revenues before it actually went into effect on February 1, 1998. We asked that we receive your response in writing within 30 days if you preferred that franchise fees not be included as part of the gross revenue calculation.

Our deadline to implement this change has been extended until January 5, which allows us a few more days to receive your reply. We realize that your council may not be convening until the month of January due to the holiday season. However, we ask that you take a few minutes to mark the appropriate election on the attached page in order for us to determine what decision Oconee County has made regarding this crucial issue or if you need an extension. 


