ITEM TITLE OR DESCRIPTION:

United States Department of Homeland Security Grant to Oakway Rescue Squad

BACKGROUND OR HISTORY:

In March 2005 the Oakway Rescue Squad successfully applied for a Homeland Security Grant that was awarded August 2005. The grant provides funds to purchase a variety of equipment and personal protective gear for the Rescue Squad (list attached). This equipment will serve to enhance the service the Rescue Squad is able to offer the community. The total grant is \$51,557.00. The Federal share is \$48,980.00 and the local match is \$2,577.00. The Oakway Rescue Squad is requesting funds from County Council for the local match share of the grant, in the amount of \$2,577.00.

While the Oakway Rescue Squad should be commended for their volunteerism and diligence in applying for this grant on their own time, proper County procedures were not followed. This grant application was not brought to the attention of the County Grants Administrator, nor was it brought before County Council for pre-approval. As this was the first Homeland Security Grant available to rescue squad units, they were probably uninformed about proper procedure.

SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS OR CONCERNS:

The Oakway Rescue Squad operates as an exemplary unit. They answer over 500 calls per year and have a 98% call response record. Their importance in their community cannot be overrated, as it takes Oconee Memorial Hospital EMS in excess of 20 minutes to respond to a call in the Oakway Rescue Squad jurisdictional area. Oakway also covers a section of I-85. The funds available to the Squad in the Homeland Security Grant will enable them to purchase much needed supplies and equipment. For example, their volunteers answer all calls and perform all related duties in plain civilian clothes. This grant will enable them to purchase personal protective gear, including EMS pants, coats, helmets, goggles, boots, gloves, and traffic vests. Other equipment to be purchased by this grant includes a portable mini-cutter for extrication use in tight and confined vehicle areas. Purchase of an air bag safety device will also ensure that vehicle air bags do not inadvertently deploy on Rescue Squad members as they perform their duties at a crash scene. Another piece of equipment to be acquired, the Zoll AutoPulse, has the ability to circulate human blood at 85% efficiency as compared to the 15% efficiency of hand compressions.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommendation is for the approval of the local grant match of \$2,577.00, as a one-time special appropriation from council contingency funds, with the caution that all future grant requests must come through our normal staff review process, then to County Council for approval prior to applying for any grant. Local share grant matches must also come from a line item within the appropriate public safety or departmental budget.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Total of Homeland Security Grant = \$51,557.00
Federal Share - \$48,980.00
County (Local) Match Requested = \$2,577.00

The County (Local) Match could come from council contingency. Henry Gordon in Emergency Management does not have a separate line item in his budget for matching grants.

ITEM TITLE OR DESCRIPTION:

Award of 2005 Paving Contract

BACKGROUND OR HISTORY:

In the July 8, 2005, Road and Transportation Committee Meeting, the committee decided to develop a more detailed approach to projecting cost and tracking the paving contract process. The new approach includes contracting larger patch work, new construction, milling, and overlays. This approach will require staff to monitor the paving projects more closely, providing guidance and inspections on a daily basis. This "public-private" approach should result in the best quality road paving project at the lowest possible cost. Staff will provide project status updates at each Road and Transportation Committee Meeting.

BID SOLICITATION HISTORY:

As published invitation to bid announcement was made on August 1, 2005. Bid packages were available on August 8, 2005. A mandatory pre-bid conference was held on August 15, 2005, and attended by 12 interested bidders. The Bids were opened on August 29, 2005. Three (3) contractors submitted competitive bids for the paving contract.

SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS OR CONCERNS:

We are all aware that rising fuel costs continue to impact our road paving projects. Not only is the liquid asphalt content directly related to the paving contract, but fuel cost for transporting materials is also increasing the overall costs.

Consequently, due to rising costs, we have been forced to reduce the number of road projects that we could accept due to budget limitations. These choices were based on the following criteria:

A cost per linear foot of road was calculated. On New Construction Work the top five cheapest roads to construct per foot were chosen. Our working budget projection was still exceeded. The Roads Manager was asked to review the Tentative Overlay Road List to determine if any roads could wait another year to be paved. It was decided that Rocky Knob Road could wait until the next paving contract for overlay. The working budget was still too high. At that time, three roads were chosen from the top five cheapest roads to construct list (New Construction Work) based on the understanding that Council may have made the strongest commitment to pave these roads. Selection of the roads to be paved in this manner allows the most miles of road to be paved for the dollar.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION FOR COUNCIL ACTION:

1. Staff recommends that King Asphalt, Inc. be awarded the 2005 Resurfacing Overlay, Milling, and Reconstruction Contract for \$1,902,863.90 (see Attachment #2).
2. Staff recommends that Thrift Brothers, Inc. be awarded the New Construction Projects at \$536,194.75 for Capps Road (CF 108) .55 mile; Rocky Gap Road (CH 58) 2.28 miles; and Leroy Road (SL 11) .77 mile (see Attachment #3).

June 15, 2006 is the deadline for completion of both contracts.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The 2005 Road Paving Contract will be funded from the FY 2005-06 Budget as follows:

The total projected bid cost for both contracts is estimated to be \$2,439,058.65. Stone from our Rock Quarry will be provided at a cost of \$124,029.03, and an approximate 9% contingency of \$251,354.32 for a total maximum expenditure of \$2,814,442 which matches the available budget above.

Consideration of an action to reduce the County Operating Budget for fiscal year 2005-2006.

BACKGROUND OR HISTORY:

The Oconee County Budget Ordinance for Fiscal Year 2005-2006, Ordinance 2005-10 was adopted on third and final reading on June 29, 2005 after the conduct of seven budget workshop sessions, three readings of the ordinance, and a public hearing on the issue.

County Council Member, Mr. Steven Moore, has requested that the County Council consider an action to reduce the County Operating Budget for fiscal year 2005-2006 by three percent (3%) across the board.

SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS OR CONCERNS:

As a result of extended work by County Council, and after receiving significant public input and consideration of many conflicting priorities, a compromise budget document was drafted. This document provided for an increase of a four and seven-tenths percent (4.7%) increase to the county budget over 2004-2005 levels in spite of specific, identifiable cost increases totaling nearly nine percent (9%).

The budget as originally submitted represented cuts of more than nine million dollars (\$9,000,000) from departmental requests. County Council further reduced that figure by more than two million dollars (\$2,000,000), net of certain strategic additions, during their deliberative process.

The adopted budget required significant cuts to be made in virtually every aspect of the county's operations, including the elimination of more than twenty (20) full-time equivalent positions.

Also, in the intervening time period, global and national events have made it evident that we will experience very large increases in energy costs at least in the short-term that must be funded if current levels of service are to continue.

Additional cuts, as proposed by Mr. Moore, totaling over one million four hundred thousand dollars (\$1,400,000) or three percent (3%) of the adopted budget would require significant reductions in base service and employee levels.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the 2005-2006 County Budget not be amended.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

\$1.4 Million cuts in service and employees.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 2004-31, "AN ORDINANCE
CREATING THE OCONEE COUNTY INFRASTRUCTURE ADVISORY
COMMISSION"

WHEREAS, Ordinance 2004-31 was adopted by County Council and established the Oconee County Infrastructure Advisory Commission; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this Ordinance is to amend Section 2 of Ordinance 2004-31;

NOW BE IT ORDAINED by the Oconee County Council, in council duly assembled, with quorum present and voting, and upon third and final reading the following:

Section 2 of Ordinance 2004-31 is amended to read:

Section 2. Membership and Term of Office.

The Membership in the Oconee County Infrastructure Advisory Commission shall be Fifteen (15) in number. The Cities of Salem, Seneca, Walhalla, Westminster and West Union shall each appoint one member to the Advisory Commission. The person appointed by each respective city shall serve on said Commission until replaced by said respective city. The Oconee County Sewer Commission, Pioneer Water District, Blue Ridge Electric Co-operative, Duke Power Company, Bell South and Fort Hill Natural Gas Company, shall each appoint one person to serve on the Oconee County Infrastructure Advisory Commission. The persons selected by the Oconee County Sewer Commission and Pioneer Water District, Blue Ridge Electric Co-operative, Duke Power Company, Bell South and Fort Hill Natural Gas Company shall serve on the Commission until they are replaced by their respective selecting entity. The Oconee County Infrastructure Advisory Commission shall include four (4) members of the Oconee County government. One of the Oconee County members shall be the Director of the Oconee County Economic Development Commission. One member shall be the Oconee County Administrator. One member shall be appointed by County Council and shall serve until replaced by County Council. One member shall be appointed by the Oconee County Planning Commission and shall serve until replaced by the Planning Commission.

S.C. elderly population spikes in next three decades

COLUMBIA (AP) — Like other states in the nation, South Carolina's aging population is growing quickly, forcing state leaders to find ways to accommodate its elderly citizens.

In South Carolina, the number of people who are 65 and older will more than double in the next 25 years, according to census projections released Thursday. About 1.5 million elderly will live in the state by 2030, according to the U.S. Census Bureau.

If the projections hold true, there will be almost as many people over 65 as under 18 by 2030 — a major shift in population from the 2000 Census when there

were twice as many youngsters as senior citizens.

The Census figures released this week show that states in the South and West will have the most population growth between 2000 and 2030. Though South Carolina's elderly population is expected to spike, the state is in the middle of the pack when it comes to population growth overall.

The growing number of elderly comes from a combination of aging baby boomers and the influx of retirees flocking to South Carolina for its mild climate and relatively low cost of living, said Frank Adams, a spokesman for the state Office on

Aging.

"What you've got is some very profound changes associated with these demographic changes," Adams said.

Those changes will include everything from how businesses deliver services to less mobile customers to how the health care system will care for the growing number of elderly, Adams said.

State leaders that deal with the elderly will be looking for ways to handle those changes next week at a three-day conference on aging. The conference is one of several that will be held throughout the nation and preceding a national White House Conference on Aging this fall.

ITEM TITLE OR DESCRIPTION:

Adoption of ad valorem tax millage rates for 2005.

BACKGROUND OR HISTORY:

This action is for annual adoption of the millage rates required to fund the budgeted appropriations which have been previously approved by County Council for Oconee County, the School District of Oconee County, and the Tri-County Technical College.

Pursuant to South Carolina Statute Section 6-1-320 (C), Council is required to conduct a specially called and separate meeting solely to levy millage greater than the rate limitation provided for in Section 6-1-320 (A) as determined by the State (this year 2.7%). Subsection (C) of the aforementioned State Statute allows the 2.7% figure to be overridden and the millage rate further increased by a positive majority vote of the governing body. The governing body must provide public notice of the meeting notifying the public that the governing body is meeting to vote to override the statutory limitation and increase the millage rate. This required public notice was posted at the Courthouse, the Pine Street Annex, and distributed to the media on September 2, 2005 (copy attached).

The public was provided an opportunity to comment upon the contemplated increase in millage at an advertised public hearing held at 1 p.m. August 16, 2005 in compliance with provisions of South Carolina Code Section 6-1-320.

Per Section 12 of the Oconee County Budget Ordinance, Ordinance 2005-10, "THE GOVERNING BODY OF OCONEE COUNTY, upon recommendation of the Auditor shall levy sufficient mills upon all taxable property in Oconee County, and the Treasurer shall collect all revenues arising therefrom, as may be necessary or desirable for general County and School purposes as provided in SECTION 3 hereof and as may be necessary for the funding of such contingency funds and capital improvements as may be directed by the Oconee County Council." "School purposes" include the necessary millage to fund the Tri-County Technical College.

The millage required to repay the scheduled bonded debt obligations are also provided by the Auditor as information to County Council in order to provide a clear presentation of the overall millage to be assessed.

The proposed rates and the underlying estimates of the net assessment values for School and County purposes have been the subject of concerted study and cooperation. The County Auditor has included representatives of the county offices of Finance and Management & Budget, as well as representatives of the School District of Oconee County who are in agreement as to the appropriate millage to be levied.

SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS OR CONCERNS:

Council and the public will note at attachment #2 that the overall county millage rate (County Council and Schools) has increased only 12.2% over the last 10 years, which is just over 1.2% per year. Millage growth for each entity over a 10 year period are shown below:

	Millage Growth over 10 years (1997-2006) (Operating and Debt)	Average Annual Growth

The recent State Department of Revenue-determined industrial abatement (reduction) related to Duke Power utility assessments increased by more than \$15 million this year, causing a *net decrease in assessment* by almost \$10 million for county tax purposes. Experiencing this reduction, instead of the modest expectation of increase at the time budget forecasts were originally prepared in May 2005, is the reason that the proposed county operations millage is one mill greater than previously expected.

As the school assessment is not affected by the industrial abatement, the projected school millage increase is the same as originally forecasted.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the County Council adopt the millage rates proposed by the County Auditor, and as shown on attachment #1.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

This action will provide that the amounts included in the various affected budgets for revenues from local ad valorem taxes will be realized.

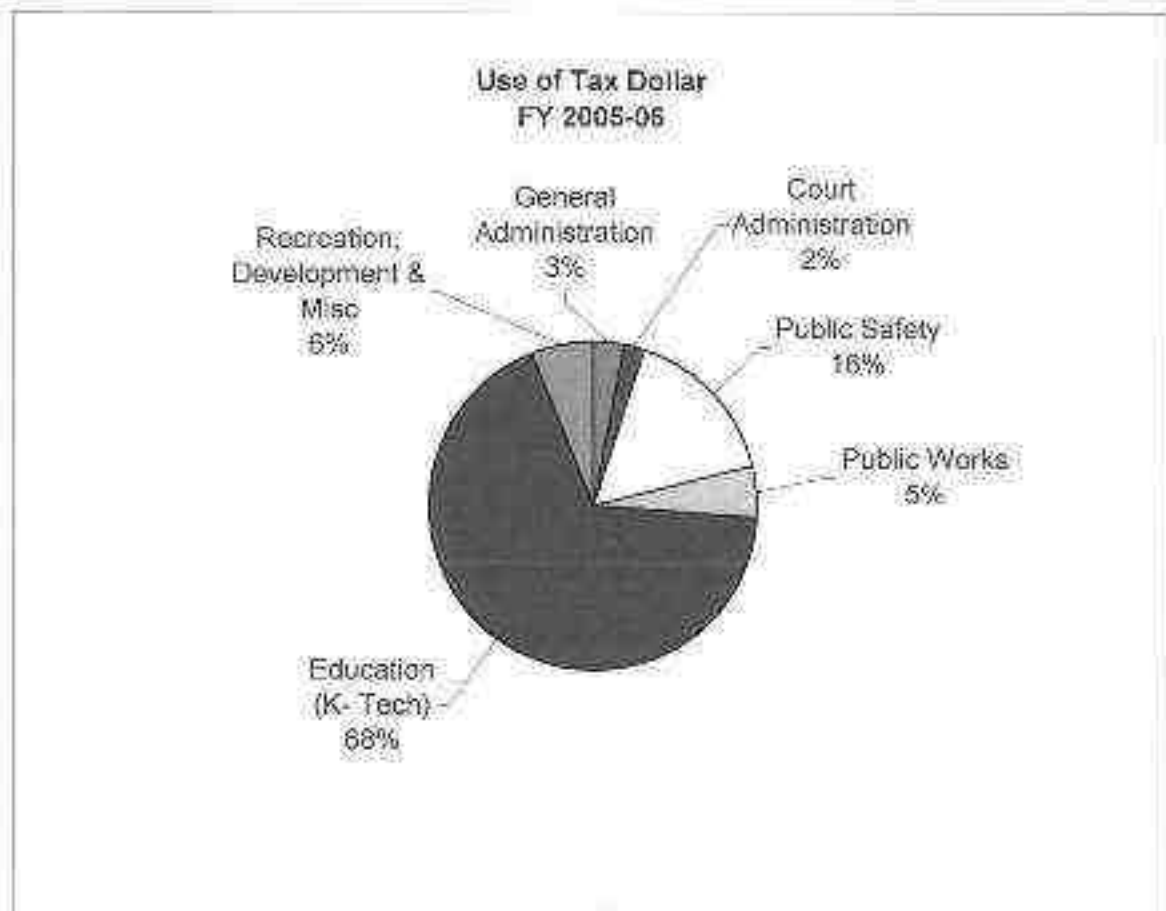

This schedule is the product of many hours of cooperative work between representatives of the South Carolina Department of Revenue, the School District of Oconee County, the County Office of Finance and Management and Budget, as well as personnel in my office.

Although there are as yet still certain manufacturing and utilities for which final confirmation has not been received, we feel that the net assessed values underlying these computations are conservative, and that the budgets will be adequately funded.

I respectfully request that you adopt the millage rates as presented.

Article X of S.C. State Constitution

Whenever there is a merger of governments authorized under Section 12 of Article VIII, tax districts may be created, based upon the services rendered in each district, but tax levies must be uniform in respect to persons and property within each such district. (1976 (59) 2217; 1977 (60) 96.)

SECTION 7. Limitation on annual expenditures of state government and number of state employees; annual budgets and expenses of political subdivisions and school districts:

(a) The General Assembly shall provide by law for a budget process to insure that annual expenditures of state government may not exceed annual state revenue. (1985 Act No. 10, Section 1, eff February 26, 1985.)

(b) Each political subdivision of the State as defined in Section 14 of this article and each school district of this State shall prepare and maintain annual budgets which provide for sufficient income to meet its estimated expenses for each year. Whenever it shall happen that the ordinary expenses of a political subdivision for any year shall exceed the income of such political subdivision, the governing body of such political subdivision shall provide for levying a tax in the ensuing year sufficient, with other sources of income, to pay the deficiency of the preceding year together with the estimated expenses for such ensuing year. The General Assembly shall establish procedures to insure that the provisions of this section are enforced. (1976 (59) 2217; 1977 (60) 90.)

(c) The General Assembly shall prescribe by law a spending limitation on appropriations for the operation of state government which shall provide that annual increases in such appropriations may not exceed the average growth rate of the economy of the State as measured by a process provided for by the law which prescribes the limitations on appropriations; provided, however, the limitation may be suspended for any one fiscal year by a special vote as provided in this subsection.

During the regular session of the General Assembly in 1990 and during every fifth annual regular session thereafter, the General Assembly shall conduct and complete a review of the law implementing this subsection. During such session, only a vote of two-thirds of the members of each branch present and voting shall be required to change the existing limitation on appropriation. Unless that is done, the existing limitations shall remain unchanged.

Upon implementation of the provisions of this subsection by law, such law may not be amended or repealed except by the special vote as provided in this subsection.

The special vote referred to in this subsection means an affirmative vote in each branch of the General Assembly by two-thirds of the members present and voting, but not less than three-fifths of the total membership in each branch. (1985 Act No. 10, Section 2, eff February 26, 1985.)

(d) The General Assembly shall prescribe by law a limitation on the number of state employees which shall provide that the annual increase in such number may not exceed the average growth rate in the population of the State measured by a process provided for in the law which prescribes that employment limitation; provided, however, the limitation may be suspended for any one fiscal year by a special vote as provided in this subsection.

Upon implementation of the provisions of this subsection by law, such law may not be amended or repealed except by the special vote provided in this subsection.

The special vote referred to in this subsection means an affirmative vote in each branch of the General Assembly by two-thirds of the members present and voting, but not less than three-fifths of the total membership in each branch. (1985 Act No. 10, Section 3, eff February 26, 1985.)

SECTION 8. Payments from treasuries.

Money shall be drawn from the treasury of the State or the treasury of any of its political subdivisions only in pursuance of appropriations made by law. (1976 (59) 2217; 1977 (60) 90.)

SECTION 9. Statement of receipts and expenditures.
