

## LANDFILL RULES

1. All businesses, contractors, property management, rental cleanouts, trash service providers, or anyone doing a job or hauling waste for money or services must purchase a decal and are responsible for tipping fees.
2. Commercial sized loads are defined as any vehicle larger than a standard size pickup and trailer larger than standard residential use trailers may be subject to fees.
3. All contract haulers are required to wear reflective or high visibility clothing when going to the active landfill. All other landfill customers going to the active landfill are encouraged to wear reflective or high visibility clothing. Reflective or high vis clothing will not be provided.
4. Uncovered/unsecure loads may be subject to fines imposed by Oconee County Sheriff's Office.

## LANDFILL SAFETY

1. Safety first! Anyone behaving in an unsafe or unprofessional manner will be required to leave the landfill.
2. Landfills are dangerous construction zones. Disposal is at customer's own risk. All persons and vehicles enter the landfill at their own risk. Oconee County assumes no liability for bodily injury, personal injury, or property damage while on landfill property.
3. Customers must follow the directions of the spotter or landfill equipment operators at the active landfill at all times
4. Be aware of moving landfill equipment and other vehicles and maintain safe following distance. Do not pass moving vehicles.
5. All vehicles are subject to load inspection by Landfill personnel.
6. Landfill equipment operators have the right of way on the active disposal area. All vehicles must yield to operating machinery and to pedestrians.

## Frequently Asked Questions:

### **Q. Why can't I dispose of household garbage at the Seneca Landfill?**

A. The Seneca Landfill is an unlined Class 2 Construction & Demolition landfill, and is not permitted to receive household garbage. Household garbage must be transported to a lined Class 3 Municipal Solid Waste (MSW) landfill that is designed to minimize environmental impacts from household waste. Please dispose of your household waste at a recycle center, or call to see if a private collection service is available in your area

### **Q. Can I dispose of railroad ties and telephone poles at the landfill?**

A. No. These items must be disposed of at the Transfer Station. Special waste requires everyone to pay the current tipping fee.

### **Q. What forms of payment do you take?**

A. The landfill currently takes cash, checks, debit and credit cards except American Express. There is a 3 percent charge for all cards.

### **Q. I am running five minutes late; will you keep the gate open for me past 3:30pm?**

A. Due to SC DHEC regulations, landfill staff is not allowed to keep the gate open beyond the posted landfill hours. Please allow plenty of time to arrive at the landfill before the posted closing time of 3:30pm. As a reminder, all vehicles must exit the gate by 3:45pm



## OCONEE COUNTY CLASS 2 C&D LANDFILL

Per Oconee County Solid Waste Ordinance and SC DHEC regulations, the Class 2 C&D landfill is for the disposal of construction and demolition materials and acceptable materials as outlined in SC Regulation 61-107.19 Appendix I. Tipping fees are applicable to all businesses, contractors, rental cleanouts, and all trash service providers. Fees also apply to all commercial size loads unless prior approval has been granted. Violations of this ordinance can result in fines by the Oconee County Sheriff's Office.

**OPEN** 7:15 am - 3:30pm (all vehicles must exit gate by 3:45pm) Monday-Saturday

## ITEMS ACCEPTED FOR DISPOSAL

- Boats (without motors and fluids) and boat dock floats
- Bricks & masonry blocks
- Dry paint cans and caulking tubes
- Fiberglass matting, floor covering, glass,
- Furniture, couches, wood bed frame, dressers, tables, etc.
- Hardened concrete with rebar, hardened cement
- Insulation material, lumber and treated lumber
- Metal that is connected to cement or concrete
- Mirrors
- Non-Friable asbestos
- Non- motorized bulky outdoor children's toys
- Outdoor furniture/lawn furniture (laminated), plastic, vinyl or wooden
- Pallets & crates
- Plaster/plaster board
- Polyfiberglass (polished, cured material used for shower stalls, roofing)
- Pool liners
- PVC pipes (no metal ones)
- Shingles & roofing materials
- Signs, mailboxes, awning, vinyl siding
- Tile (floor, wall & ceiling)
- Tubing
- Wall coverings
- Wooden swing sets
- Yard debris: such as brush, limbs, tree stumps logs, rocks and topsoil.

## ITEMS ACCEPTED FOR RECYCLING

- \*Materials must be free of other contaminants or waste. \*
- Concrete
  - Asphalt



### HOW TO DISPOSE OF?

**BOAT/JET SKIS:** Boats and jet skis can be disposed of in the landfill, as long as, all fluids and motor have been removed. It is the responsibility of the patron to unload the boat/jet ski safely. Asking to use landfill equipment or attaching to landfill equipment is strictly prohibited.

**FARM ANIMALS, DEER, OR PET CARCASSES:** The landfill is not permitted to take dead animal carcasses. It is the responsibility of the pet owner, farmer, or hunter to dispose of the carcass properly. According to the SC Department of Natural Resources, "Carcasses (including heads, hides, and entrails) should be buried at least 2 to 3 feet deep so dogs or other animals will not dig up the remains and drag them around."

**MOBILE HOME/CAMPER:** The landfill does not accept whole mobile homes or campers. The mobile home/camper needs to be dismantled and all construction materials separated. All metal and appliances should be taken to the Solid Waste Complex or to a scrap yard for recycling.

**CHRISTMAS TREE:** Real Christmas trees can be disposed on in the landfill or at the mulching facility. Artificial trees should be disassembled and placed in household garbage at any of the recycling centers or in the landfill.

**PAINT:** Paint can be disposed of in the recycling center's household garbage or at the landfill as long as it is dry or solidified. To dry paint in a container, first open the container and mix sand, cat litter, oil dry, shredded paper or dirt in the paint and leave the container open until it solidifies.
