MINUTES, OCONEE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING

The regularly scheduled meeting of the Oconee County Council was held Tuesday, September 17, 1996 at 3:00 pm in Council Chambers with all Council Members and the County Attorney present.

Members of the press notified (by mail): Journal/Tribune, Keowee Courier, Westminster News, Anderson Independent, Greenville News, WGOG Radio, WBFM Radio, WCCP Radio, WYFF TV & WLOS TV.

Members of the press present: Dick Mangrum - WGOG Radio, Allison Glass - Anderson Independent & Ashton Hester - Keowee Courier.

The meeting was called to order by Supervisor-Chairman Crain who welcomed the guests and media.

The invocation was given by Mr. Williams.

Ms. Burrell made a motion, seconded by Mr. Orr, approved 5 - 0 that the minutes of the September 3, 1996 meeting be adopted as printed.

Upon request of Mr. Dewitt Mize, Rural Fire Marshal, Mr. David Matheson, Chief, Long Creek Fire Department, and Mr. Bobby Williams, Vice Chairman, Rural Fire Commission, Mr. Orr made a motion, seconded by Mr. Williams, approved 5 - 0 that a 1984 Ford L9000 truck, serial number 1FDYU90J2EVA34225, which is no longer used by the county be given to the Long Creek Fire Department.

Mr. Strickland made a motion, seconded by Mr. Orr, approved 5 - 0 that the county provide maintenance on this vehicle.

Upon request of Mr. Mize & Mr. Williams and upon concurrence by Ms. Marianne Dillard, Purchasing Agent, Mr. Strickland made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hamilton, approved 4 - 1 (Mr. Orr voting against) that the bid procedure be waived and two (2) pumper trucks be purchased from Advanced Fire Apparatus, Inc. at \$352,514 which is the same cost as last year as per Section B. Formal Bid Process, Subsection 2. When it is to the advantage of Oconee County to acquire goods and/or services on the basis of a previously awarded bids or contracts.

Upon request of Mrs. Martha Baily, Library Director, Mrs. Maria Macaulay & Ms. Libby Lincoln, Library Board Members, Mr. Orr made a motion, seconded by Ms. Burrell, approved 5 - 0 that \$30,000 be taken from contingency and placed in line item 10 010 00150 00870 to purchase a new bookmobile if the Library can secure a state grant in the amount of \$20,000 and match it with private funds.

Upon recommendation of Mr. Buddy Hawk, Rightof-Way Technician, & Ms. Marianne Dillard, Purchasing Agent, it was the unanimous consent of Council that the bid for 911 materials be awarded to low bidder per item as delineated on the attached bid sheet:

Mr. Strickland made a motion, seconded by Mr. Williams, approved 5 - 0 that the county secure an option for a tract of land in the Long Creek area to be used as a manned convenience center and that sufficient funds to have the tract surveyed be appropriated.

Upon recommendation of Mr. Tommy Crumpton, Rock Crusher Director, and Ms. Dillard, Mr. Strickland made a motion, seconded by Mr. Williams, approved 5 - 0 that the technicality of the successful bidder being within one hundred, fifty (150) miles of Oconee County be waived as it would be in the best interest of the county and the bid for a two thousand (2,000) gallon water tank be awarded to Amthor International, Inc. who was low bid at \$19,975. (See attached bid sheet)

Upon recommendation of Ms. Dillard, Mr. Hamilton made a motion, seconded by Mr. Strickland, approved 5 -O that the bid for the sale of scrap metal be awarded to Glenn's Scrap Metal who was high bid at \$907. (See attached bid sheet)

After considerable discussion, Ms. Burrell made a motion, which she withdrew after point of order was called as she voted against placing a referendum regarding the matter on the November ballot (this motion was adopted by Council) that the county accept the hospital's letter to the county as a withdrawal of the proposed land exchange and to rescind the motion to place the matter on the November ballot in the form of an advisory referendum.

After more discussion Mr. Hamilton made a motion, seconded by Mr. Orr, approved 3 - 2 (Mr. Strickland and Mr. Williams voting against) that the motion to have a referendum regarding the proposed land exchange be rescinded and the county accept the withdrawal of the hospital to exchange the property adjacent to the landfill for the property on which the hospital is situated. (See attached letter)

Mr. Orr made a motion, seconded by Mr. Strickland, approved 5 - 0 that Proclamation 96-1, "A PROCLAMATION DECLARING SEPTEMBER 16-20 INDUSTRY APPRECIATION MONTH" be adopted on first and final reading.

Upon request of Mr. Marion Lyles, Airport Manager, & Mr. Randy Abbott, Vice Chairman, Aeronautics Commission, Mr. Orr made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hamilton, approved 5 - 0 that an architect for the proposed terminal building at the airport be selected through Talbert & Bright as per the rules and regulations of the SC Department of Commerce, Division of Aeronautics, the Federal Aviation Administration and the EDA Grant. Further, that Talbert & Bright be permitted to engage in preliminary discussions with the architect.

Ms. Dillard, Purchasing Agent, informed Council there were several departments who had requested to have parking lots paved in the 1996-97 budget year, however, based on the cost of paving, it appears there is a shortfall of some \$15,000 to \$20,000 in the budget to pave these projects. Mr. Williams made a motion, seconded by Ms. Burrell, approved 5 - 0 that the Purchasing Department secure bids for paving these parking lots.

Upon recommendation of Ms. Dillard, Mr. Strickland made a motion, seconded by Ms. Burrell, approved 5 - 0 that the bid process be waived and Smith Data update the computer system in the Probate Judge's Office at a cost of \$11,955 as per Section B. Formal Bid Procedure, Subsection 4. When in the Purchasing Agent's judgement, and with concurrence of County Council, it is to the advantage of the County's interest to do so.

To Mr. Hamilton's inquiry, Mr. Crain assured Mr. Hamilton that repairs at the Seneca Clinic were at the top of Mr. Smith's agenda.

Mr. Orr, Chairman, Roads & Transportation Committee, reported that the committee had reviewed Connie Circle and had concluded that Mr. Hawk, Right-of-Way Technician, look at the right-of-ways on the roadway, that she could put up a fence as long as it was not in the right-of-way. Hospital (Con't)

Mr. Cain, County Attorney assured Council he would be happy to look at Santee Roadway regarding qualification for county maintenance.

Ms. Burrell made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hamilton, approved 5 - 0 that the county accept a SC Department of Commerce Coordinating Council for Economic Development grant for road work for Compact Air Products contingent upon approval of the County Attorney.

Council scheduled the public hearing on the OCONEE COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA 1996 LAND USE PLAN October 10, 1996 at 7:00 pm in the courtroom.

Mr. Crain informed Council there would be a Facilities Issues Negotiation (FIN) process meeting September 30, 1996 at 7:00 pm at the Southern Wesleyan University Auditorium, Central, SC, there is a tentative meeting scheduled October 14, 1996 and there will be a third meeting for which he had no tentative date or time.





Dear Mr. Crain and Members of the Council:

The officers and directors of Oconee Memorial Hospital are very concerned regarding the decision by the Council to submit to referendum a proposal which has been pending which involves the Hospital trading property it owns near the Oconee County Landfill for the real property which it leases from the County.

You should be aware that the Hospital does not want to be responsible for the time, expense and effort required to put this proposal to a referendum in light of the fact that this proposal was not instigated by the Hospital nor was it the Hospital's original idea. A review of the history of this arrangement will show that on April 21, 1995, Mr. Norman Crain, on behalf of Oconee County Council, wrote to me asking that the Hospital grant to the County a first right of refusal should the Hospital ever decide to sell its property adjacent to the Oconee County Landfill. That request was considered by the Hospital Board and July 12, 1995, the Hospital Board responded to Mr. Crain's request with a proposal that the entities simply exchange properties, which would be patently beneficial to both organizations.

It is the Hospital's view that the County's position should be to simply either accept or reject that proposal. We certainly do not wish nor do we seek a referendum on the matter inasmuch as the original proposal was merely a response to an inquiry by the County. If the County does not believe the proposal to be beneficial, we believe you should simply decline.

The Hospital Board's view is that this matter has been allowed to escalate to a point that the original intent and positions of the parties are being overlooked. For that reason, by action of the Board of Oconee Memorial Hospital, the proposal made to the County on July 12, 1995 for the exchange of these properties is hereby withdrawn.

Gentlemen:

It is my understanding that a meeting has been scheduled for the special committee of the County Council appointed to consider the above-referenced proposal for August 1, 1995. As I advised last week when the meeting was requested, I will be unable to attend at this date and time due to family medical circumstances.

I am not sure of the purpose of this meeting. However, since I was requested to review the legalities of the proposal of the Corporation which operates the Hospital, I have discussed the proposal with the Corporation's attorney several times and we have agreed to meet to review the same in detail, and to work together to obtain an historical perspective of how and why the property was titled in the County. Additionally, my office is in the process of conducting title examinations of the property owned by Oconee County to determine the status of the title and any restrictions of record.

Again, I am unsure of the purpose of the scheduled meeting. However, it may be that in the event it is determined that there are no legal impediments to such an exchange, the County may want to impose certain restrictions or "safeguards" on any public property conveyed to the Corporation to insure that the same is used for the provision of health care and related services to the populace of the County. There are other issues which the Council may desire to address, to include requiring adequate safeguards to assure that emergency medical services continue to be provided on a county - wide basis and that persons who need medical care will be treated at the hospital regardless of their ability to pay.

Finally, once the legal implications of such a transaction are determined, if Council desires to move forward with the conveyance, a determination will need to be made as to the respective values of the properties which are the subject of the proposal. This would require that independent appraisals of the properties and improvements thereon be obtained from appraisers qualified to render such opinions.

These are some of the issues which have been identified which must be addressed when considering the proposal of the Corporation which currently operates the hospital. Discussions incident to such a proposal, which involves millions of dollars should, of course, be approached cautiously and with due regard for the fiduciary responsibilities of the County Council to the people of the county.

I will keep you advised of our efforts. In the interim, should there be any questions, or if any member of Council desires to discuss this matter, please do not hesitate to call upon me.

Oconee Memorial Hospital, Inc. (hereinafter "Hospital") herewith tenders a proposal to trade certain real property owned by the Hospital to Oconee County (hereinafter "County"), together with other considerations, in exchange for receiving from the County the real property which the County owns currently leased by the County to the Hospital.

The Hospital believes that the consummation of the transaction proposed here is supported by certain facts which should be kept in mind by way of explanation of the basis of the Hospital's proposal, to wit:

- 1. On July 9, 1959, the Hospital conveyed to the County two (2) tracts of the Hospital's land, one containing thirty-three and eight-tenths (33.8) acres, more or less, and a second containing nineteen and ninety-two one-hundredths (19.92) acres, more or less, upon which is located the Hospital's physical plant and facility operating under the name and style of Oconee Memorial Hospital. In that transaction, the Board of Directors of the Hospital authorized the granting of a pledge to the County of so much of the Doyle Fund as would be required to match funds available to the County under the Hill-Burton Act, not to exceed a total of ninety thousand (\$90,000) dollars. All of this was done at no cost to the County and in support of Act #483 of the Legislature of the State of South Carolina declaring that "the General Assembly finds that there is a need for public hospital facilities in Oconee County which requires an expenditure by Oconee County of nine hundred thousand (\$900,000) dollars, and such funds, with federal aid made available through the so-called Hill-Burton Act, will be sufficient to enable such facility to be provided."
- 2. Pursuant to Legislative Act #483, the Hospital and the County, by their duly authorized officers, negotiated the terms and conditions and entered into an agreement dated June 29, 1959 entitled "Indenture of Lease", which was then executed on behalf of the County and the Hospital. The Lease was subsequently renewed on the 29th day of June, 1974 and again in 1989, and was ultimately replaced by a thirty (30)

year Lease for the same properties executed as part of the seventeen and one-half million (\$17,500,000) dollars Hospital Revenue Bond Series 1995, dated March 22, 1995, which Lease is presently in full force and effect.

- 3. It is the sole purpose and objective of the Hospital to further serve the health and retirement needs of the citizens of the County which would be aided and assisted by the Hospital's reacquiring the property which is the subject of the Lease, thereby enabling the Hospital to expeditiously and efficiently follow land use studies recommended to it and better serve the community by having control of its own resources.
- 4. The Hospital owns fifty-seven and seven-three one-hundredths (57.73) acres, more or less, of real property which lies adjacent to the County-owned landfill, and the County is in need of the Hospital's property to be used for the continued maintenance of the landfill so that the County's acquisition of the Hospital's lands would be of great benefit to the County.

PROPOSAL

For and in consideration of the foregoing and the mutual benefits flowing to each party, the Hospital proposes to trade its fifty-seven and seven-three one-hundredths (57.73) acres, more or less, which the Hospital owns adjacent to the County's landfill to the County, together with the following additional considerations:

- i. withdraw its annual request of one hundred twenty-five thousand (\$125,000) dollars to support its EMS system;
- ii. be solely responsible for and pay the final two (2) payments due from the County on June 30, 1996 and June 30, 1997 on the 1977 Hospital Bond, in the amount of two hundred thirty-six thousand five hundred seventy-nine (\$236,579) dollars each;

IN EXCHANGE FOR the conveyance by the County to the Hospital of the two (2) tracts of the land containing thirty-three and eight-tenths (33.8) acres, more or less, and containing nineteen and ninety-two one-hundredths (19.92) acres, more or less, conveyed to the County by the Hospital upon which is located the Hospital's physical plant and facility.

CONCLUSION

By trading properties as outlined herein, the County acquires property which it needs for the maintenance and continuation of the County landfill facility, as well as benefiting financially from the payments to be made by the Hospital as well as the

annual contributions to its EMS system which the Hospital is willing to forego over the thirty (30) year term of the Lease, amounting to in excess of four million three hundred thousand (\$4,300,000) dollars. On the other hand, the County is only giving up lands which it was paid to take to begin with, as part of a federal financing arrangement.

The Hospital views this as a very attractive proposal for the County while putting itself in a position to better follow a master plan well into the future of the County to insure quality health care and retirement facilities for the citizens of the County.



INFORMATION & DISCLOSURE REGARDING REAL ESTATE AGENCY RELATIONSHIPS

An agency relationship arises whenever two persons agree that one is to act on behalf of the other and in accordance with the other's directions. The creation of an agency relationship imposes certain legal duties on the agent. They are the fiduciary duties of loyalty, obedience, disclosure, confidentiality, reasonable care and diligence, and accounting in dealings with the client.

Before a seller or a buyer enters into a discussion with a real estate agent regarding a real property transaction, the seller and the buyer should each understand what type of agency relationship or representation the seller and/or the buyer may have with each agent in that transaction.

IF THE AGENT REPRESENTS THE SELLER: The agent becomes the seller's agent by entering into a listing agreement with the seller or by agreeing to act as a subagent through a listing agent. A subagent may work for a different real estate company. A listing agent or subagent can assist the buyer but does not represent the buyer. A listing agent or subagent must place the interests of the seller first. The buyer should not tell a listing agent or subagent anything the buyer would not want the seller to know, because a listing agent or subagent must disclose to the seller any information he or she knows. It is an agent's duty to disclose to all parties all facts known to the agent which materially affect the value or desirability of the property, and which are not known to or apparent with diligent attention and observation of the parties.

IF THE AGENT REPRESENTS THE BUYER: The agent typically becomes the buyer's agent by entering into an agreement to represent the buyer. A buyer's agent can assist the seller but does not represent the seller. A buyer's agent must place the interests of the buyer first. The seller should not tell a buyer's agent anything of a personal or confidential nature that the seller would not want the buyer to know, because a buyer's agent must disclose to the buyer any information he or she knows. It is an agent's duty to disclose to all parties all facts known to the agent which materially affect the value or desirability of the property, and which are not known to or apparent with diligent attention and observation of the parties.

IF THE AGENT REPRESENTS BOTH THE SELLER AND THE BUYER AT THE SAME TIME: An agent may not act as an agent for more than one party to a transaction without the disclosed and informed consent of both the seller and the buyer. The agent is required to treat both the seller and the buyer honestly and impartially so as not to favor one party or work to the disadvantage of any party. Unless written permission from the seller or the buyer, whichever is appropriate, is obtained, the agent is prohibited from disclosing: (a) that the seller will accept a price less than the asking price; (b) that the buyer will pay a price greater than the price submitted in a written offer; (c) any confidential information; or (d) any other information a party specifically instructs the agent in writing not to disclose, unless disclosure is required by law. Therefore, the agent's duties are more limited if he or she represents both parties. There are potential conflicts of interest when an agent represents more than one party. The agent is obligated to inform each party of all facts the agent knows which would affect the party's decision to permit the agent to represent both the seller and the buyer.

You have the right to choose the type of representation you wish to receive. Payment of a fee to an agent does not necessarily establish that the agent represents you. If you have any questions regarding the duties and responsibilities of the agent, you should resolve these questions before going further. This morning, Marion Lyles, Airport Manager, contacted me requesting that I prepare a letter for you outlining the steps that can be undertaken in the near future that will help short cut the terminal building design and construction process without wasting any effort.

I have reviewed the project status and believe that there are several tasks that can be undertaken now that will save approximately 30 days on scheduling without having any impact on our budget (i.e., wasted effort). An architect, satisfactory to all parties, can be selected now. Preliminary discussions concerning design parameters, schedule, and other important issues could begin. In addition, the architect could review the terminal building analysis prepared by Talbert & Bright, Inc., and resolve any questions, with input from the County, Dirk Ries, the State, and us. However, I would not encourage any final negotiations with the architect until a final project budget is established. This would provide all parties with a good understanding of the County's preliminary expectations.

Once a budget is established, more specific direction can be provided to the entire design team and final contracts negotiated. Again, I feel that this approach could save at least 30 days and would have no negative impacts on the overall project budget. Please consider the above and discuss with Marion Lyles and Mike Willimon. If we decide to proceed, I will be happy to coordinate any meetings. I look forward to hearing from you.



Thank you for your consideration regarding Oconee County accepting the Grant Award from the Coordinating Council for Economic Development for the road work for Compact Air Products, Inc. I am writing to address the concerns you have expressed.

Since the road involved is a Federal Highway (US Highway 123/76) and is maintained by the South Carolina Department of Transportation, Oconee County will not be responsible for its maintenance now nor after the turn lanes are constructed. Maintenance would continue to be the responsibility of the Department of Transportation.

The Coordinating Council for Economic Development has never and would never require nor request the closure of a road during or after construction using one of our grants. Specifically, we would not close Seed Farm Road, at any time.

As I understand, the other concern is cost overruns. Since quotes have been obtained in the amount of \$40,500.00, the grant will correspond with the cost. In the event, a new quote is needed and exceeds this, the amount of the grant will increase as long as the new price is for the exact same work. In this case, I see no circumstances where there would be any overruns.
