MINUTES, OCONEE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING

The Oconee County Council met Tuesday, May 16, 2000 at 3:00 PM in Council Chambers, 415 South Pine Street, Walhalla, SC with all Council Members except Mr. Hamilton present. The County Attorney was also present.

Press:

Members of the press notified (by mail): Keowee Courier, Westminster News, Anderson Independent, WGOG Radio, & WPEK Radio, Journal/Tribune.

Members of the press present: Dick Mangrum – WGOG Radio, Dave Williams – Anderson Independent, & Katherine Hunter –Journal/Tribune.

Call to Order:

The meeting was called to order by Supervisor-Chairman Orr who welcomed the guests and media.

Invocation:

The invocation was given by Mr. Thomas.

Minutes:

Mrs. Hughes made a motion, seconded by Mr. Thomas, approved 4 – 0 that the minutes of the May 2, 2000 meeting be adopted as printed.

Public Comment Session:

Mr. Sam Konduros, Director of Operations, Pine River Plastics addressed Council informing them they hoped to be in operation by October 2000. Mr. Konduros further informed Council they would employ approximately thirty (30) people initially. When the plant begins full-scale operations, they hope to employ approximately one hundred (100) people. Mr. Konduros also showed Council a drawing of the plant and some of the products they manufacture.

Mr. L. C. Alexander and son, Patrick addressed Council requesting he be paid back time and vacation time from the time he was suspended as a deputy with the Sheriff's Department until the time the charges against him were dropped.

Open Session Continued:

Mr. B. J. Littleton addressed Council requesting they adopt a resolution urging the legislature to pass a law requiring that surveyors notify the adjoining land owners when surveying a tract of land.

Resolution 2000-07:

Mr. Jim Carr, Northland Cable Television, addressed Council requesting adoption of Resolution 2000-07, "A RESOLUTION WAIVING THE SURETY BOND REQUIREMENT AS PER SECTION 6(D) OF NORTHLAND CABLE TELEVISION ORDINANCE 97-3".

After a brief discussion regarding the proof that performance has been completed as stated in the ordinance, Mr. Orr appointed a committee comprised of Carl Hayden, IT Director; Tom Hendricks, Planning Director & John Murray, Communications Equipment Manager to examine their complaint logs and contact the FCC regarding any complaints made against Northland Cable and make a recommendation to Council regarding the adoption of the resolution.

Waterfest 2000:

Mr. Bill Ebling addressed Council regarding the upcoming Waterfest 2000 which is being sponsored by the Seneca Chamber of Commerce. Mr. Ebling cited several problems with the waterfest including traffic, crowd control, litter and the fact that the boat racing is a dangerous sport. He further asked Council to revisit the issue with the Oconee County ATAX Committee. (See attached)

Mr. John Saunderson also addressed concerns regarding the Waterfest. (See attached copy)

Mr. Orr assigned full Council to a special committee to address these concerns. The committee will meet Wednesday, May 24, 2000 at 2:00 PM in Council Chambers to address this matter, the Department of Natural Resources, the ATAX Committee and the Seneca Chamber will be invited to attend the meeting.

Tax Refund (Contingency):

Mr. Roger Williams, Assessor, addressed Council regarding the request of a tax payer for a refund due to his using a Greenville business address as a mailing address and not receiving the residential ratio. After discussion, Mr. Thomas made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hall, approved 4 – 0 that a refund for two (2) years as allowed by law be given the taxpayer not to exceed \$350.

Emergency Preparedness:

Upon recommendation of Mr. Henry Gordon, Emergency Preparedness Director & Ms. Marianne Dillard, Purchasing Agent, Mr. Timms made a motion, seconded by Mr. Thomas, approved 4 – 0 that the bid for radio equipment for Emergency Preparedness be awarded to Morris Communications who was low bid at \$12,795.30. (Sec attached bid sheet)

Group Health Insurance:

Upon recommendation of the Purchasing, Contracting, Real Estate, Building & Grounds Committee, Council voted unanimously to adopt Option 2 renewing the contract with Consolidated Benefits, Inc. as the third party administrator for employee health insurance. The estimated cost, based on the current number of employees, is \$2,752,522.18 and the PPO will be Blue Cross/Blue Shield. This also increased the vision benefit from \$100 per year to \$250 per year, laser surgery will be covered at 50% up to \$1,800 per employee and the dental coverage will increase from \$1,000 to \$2,500.

Also, upon recommendation of the committee, the employee portion for dependent coverage will be increased by ten percent (10%).

Economic Development Appointee:

Mr. Hall made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Hughes, approved 4 – 0 that Mr. Bob Newmark be appointed to represent District I on the Economic Development Board.

Ordinance 2000-08:

Mr. Hall made a motion, seconded by Mr. Thomas, approved 4 – 0 that Ordinance 2000-08, "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 85-2, OCONEE COUNTY MANUAL OF CENTRALIZED PURCHASING AS AMENDED" be adopted on second reading.

Guardian ad Litem:

Mr. Timms asked that the request of Guardian ad Litem for the county to supply them with office space be discussed at the next Purchasing, Contracting, Real Estate, Building & Grounds Committee Meeting.

Library (Contingency):

Mr. Thomas, Chairman, Purchasing, Contracting, Real Estate, Building & Grounds Committee, informed Council it was the recommendation of the committee to take \$25,000 from contingency and place it with the \$25,000 in the supplemental budget to replace the roof at the Seneca Library. This recommendation was adopted 4 – 0.

Sheriff Impound Lot (Contingency):

Mr. Thomas further informed Council it was the recommendation of the committee to take \$6,000 from contingency for the fence and \$1,000 from contingency for stone for the impound lot for the Sheriff's Department to be placed near the road camp. This recommendation was unanimously adopted.

Group Health Insurance (Retirees):

Mr. Thomas also informed Council it was the recommendation of the committee that effective July 1, 2000 the benefit of the county paying the insurance premium for employees who retire from the county with concurrent service with the SC Retirement System be made retroactive to employees who have previously retired with such service. This recommendation was unanimously adopted.

Law Enforcement, Safety, Health, Welfare & Services Committee Meet:

Mr. Hall, Chair, LEC Committee announced there would be a meeting of that committee June 6, 2000 at 5:00 PM in Council Chambers for the purpose of discussing animal control procedures.

Lease/Purchase Information:

To Mr. Hall's inquiry, the Finance Director assured Council she has been and will continue to seek information regarding whether the lease/purchase of fire equipment will go against the county's bonding capacity.

Plaque for Pine Street Administrative Offices:

Supervisor-Chairman Orr assigned the purchasing of a plaque for the Pine Street Administrative Offices to the Purchasing, Contracting, Real Estate, Building & Grounds Committee.

House at Airport:

Mr. Thomas informed Council that the Airport Manager had attended the Purchasing, Contracting, Real Estate, Building & Grounds Committee. He is going to meet with the Aeronautics Commission and bring their recommendation regarding the house on airport property to Council.

Clerk of Court:

Upon request of Sallie Smith, Clerk of Court, Mr. Timms made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hall, approved 4 – 0 that the attached transfers for the Clerk of Court's Office in the total amount of \$10,000 be adopted.

Law Enforcement Center:

Upon request of Captain Terry Wilson, Mr. Hall made a motion, seconded by Mr. Thomas, approved 4 – 0 that the attached transfers for the Law Enforcement Center in the total amount of \$9,200 be adopted.

Probate Judge:

Upon request of Sandra B. Orr, Probate Judge, Mr. Hall made a motion, seconded by Mr. Thomas, approved 4 – 0 that the attached transfers for the Probate Judge's Office in the total amount of \$9,320 be adopted.

Parks (Contingency):

Mr. Hall made a motion, seconded by Mr. Thomas, approved 4 – 0 that \$10,000 be taken from contingency to hire a consultant to work with the County Planner, County Engineer and Parks Personnel to formulate a plan for Fall Creek & Town Creek Landing Parks to be submitted to Duke Power Company.

Mr. Timms made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hall, approved 4 – 0 that the bid process be waived and a consultant be engaged to work with the county personnel as per Section B: *Formal Bid Procedure, Subsection 4: "When in the Purchasing Agent's judgement and with concurrence of County Council, it is to the advantage of the County's interest to do so"*.

Zoning Board of Appeals Member:

Mr. Hall made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Hughes, approved 4 – 0 that Mr. Sanford McCurry be appointed to represent District I on the Zoning Board of Appeals.

Seneca Health Clinic Move:

To Mr. Hall's inquiry, Supervisor-Chairman Orr assured Council he would have county maintenance personnel assist with the move of the Seneca Health Clinic.

Zoning Board of Appeals Members:

Upon recommendation of Supervisor-Chairman Orr, Council voted unanimously to appoint Mr. Duane Wilson as an at large member of the Zoning Board of Appeals.

Mr. Thomas made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hall, approved 4 – 0 that Mr. Dean Putnam be appointed to represent District II on the Zoning Board of Appeals.

Ethics Vote:

Mrs. Hughes read the following statement: "Mr. Orr, I have heard you state that your ownership of a beach house with individuals who do millions of dollars in business with the county, a county employee and others has been cleared by the state ethics commission.

However, Mr. Orr, I have in my hand a copy of the report from the state ethics commission which also contains the information you provided to the ethics commission. In your statement to the ethics commission you claim the county may from time to time do business with these individuals. I also did not see where you informed the state ethics commission that you have the authority to authorize change orders and contract extensions based on your signature alone without notifying County Council. Options which we have recently learned you have exercised to the tune of millions of dollars.

I also do not see where you have revealed to the ethics commission in your letter requesting an opinion on the beach house or in your statement of economic interest that you are in fact a partner in a company with parties involved in the beach house as I believe is required in the disclosure. The existence of a company in which yourself and the other owners of the beach house are the principals could be a strong factor in any ethics commission opinion if it were known to them."

Mrs. Hughes then made a motion, seconded by Mr. Timms, approved 4 – 0 that Council direct the County Attorney to resubmit the request to the state ethics commission for a finding using the information noted above and also ask the commission about the need for Mr. Orr to file an amended ethics disclosure.

Zoning Board of Appeals Board Member:

Mr. Timms made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Hughes, approved 4 – 0 that Mr. Eric Molin be appointed to represent District V on the Zoning Board of Appeals.

Oconee School “2000 Crew”:

Mr. Timms informed Council that the Oconee County students who make up the “2000 Crew” excelled in national competition and received the *Rookie All-Star Award* in which one hundred, forty (140) rookie teams competed.

Mr. Timms made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hall, approved 4 – 0 that they be honored with a resolution.

Wrestling Championship:

Mr. Timms made a motion, seconded by Mr. Thomas, approved 4 – 0 that Matthew Freeman, the National Wrestling Champion be honored with a resolution.

Gravel for School:

Mr. Thomas made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Hughes, approved 4 – 0 that \$1,392 be taken from contingency for two hundred, thirty-two (232) tons of crusher run gravel for Ravenel Elementary School. (See attached request)


Orthophotographic Project:

Upon recommendation of Carl Hayden, County IT Director, Mr. Thomas made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hall, approved 4 – 0 that \$62,000 in this fiscal year Information Technology budget be rolled over into the 2000-01 fiscal budget for partial funding of phase two of the orthophotographic project.

For the sole consideration of dismissal of all charges pending against the undersigned made by the Oconee County Sheriff's Office on or about May 12, 1999, sufficiency whereof is hereby acknowledged, the undersigned hereby releases and forever discharges the Oconee County Sheriff's Office, S.L.E.D, and the Tenth Circuit Solicitor's Office, their heirs, executors, administrators, agents and assigns, and all other persons, firms or corporations liable for who might be claimed to be liable, none of whom admit any liability to the undersigned, but all expressly deny any liability, from any and all claims, demand, damages, actions, causes of action or suits of any kind or nature whatsoever, and particularly on account of all injuries and/or damages, known and unknown, both to person and property which have resulted or may in the future develop from an incident occurring on or about the 12th day of May, 1999, at which time the undersigned was charged with certain crime(s) by the Oconee County Sheriff's Office and the undersigned was suspended without pay from his employment.

This release expressly reserves all rights of the parties released to pursue their legal remedies, if any, against the undersigned, their heirs, executors, agents and assigns.

This release is not intended to and does not release any claim that the undersigned may have for reimbursement of salary, wages, vacation pay or compensation of any kind which may be due to the undersigned from the date of his suspension from his employment to the date of service retirement which is September 13, 1999. It is the intent to release the Oconee County Sheriff's Department, S.L.E.D., and the Tenth Circuit Solicitor's Office from any further liability, judgment or claim of any kind arising out of the subject matter of this release. the undersigned expressly reserves the right to prosecute a legal action in tort against the releasee solely for the purpose of establishing a claim for payment of back wages, salaries, unused vacation pay, or any other compensation due him from the date of his suspension to the date of his retirement. For the consideration recited above, the undersigned specifically agrees and covenants never to seek to execute any judgment obtained against the releasees and will not seek to collect any such judgment out of the assets of the releasees. If any judgment is obtained against the releasees, undersigned agrees to seek to collect such judgment only as it applies to his wages, salaries, unused vacation pay, or other compensation due him as specified above. The undersigned further agrees and covenants that if a verdict is returned against the releasees, the undersigned will move the court to order that the judgment be entered only for wages as specified above in the appropriate amount and not against the releasees. If a judgment is entered against the releasees, it is specifically agreed and covenanted that the undersigned and our attorney will mark the judgment paid and satisfied as soon as is legally practicable without making any effort to collect any amount from the releasees, except as specified concerning wages, salaries and unused vacation pay.

Undersigned hereby accepts the terms of this Covenant Release and Settlement Agreement as final payment of the considerations set forth above.

WHEREAS, Oconee County adopted Ordinance 97-3, "AN ORDINANCE GRANTING A CABLE TELEVISION FRANCHISE TO NORTHLAND CABLE TELEVISION, INC. ITS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS, TO OPERATE AND MAINTAIN A CABLE TELEVISION SYSTEM IN THE COUNTY; SETTING FORTH CONDITIONS ACCOMPANYING THE GRANT OF THE FRANCHISE; PROVIDING FOR THE COUNTY REGULATION AND USE OF THE CABLE SYSTEM; AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF THE FRANCHISE PROVISIONS" on third and final reading April 1, 1997; and

WHEREAS, Section 6(D) of said Ordinance states: "The Grantee shall maintain, and by its acceptance of this Franchise specifically agrees to maintain throughout the term of this Franchise a surety bond from a reputable company to the County in the amount of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000) conditioned that the Grantee shall well and truly observe, fulfill and perform each term and condition of this Franchise and that in the case of any breach of condition, then there shall be recoverable, jointly and severally from the principal and surety, any damage or loss or costs suffered or incurred by the County as a result thereof, including lost revenues of the County approximately resulting from the failure to well and faithfully observe and perform any provision of this Franchise. The Grantee may be released from the within obligation to maintain a surety bond by approval of the County Council by resolution after a period of three (3) years upon reasonable proof to said Council that performance has been completed. Such termination shall not be unreasonably withheld."

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THIS DATE, that the Oconee County Council, with a quorum present and voting does hereby adopt this Resolution waiving the surety bond requirement as requested by Northland Cable Television.

Presentation to Oconee County Council on POWER BOAT RACING, May 16, 2000

Thank you for the opportunity to be heard regarding the introduction of power boat racing to Lake Keowee at the *County's* South Cove Park, and the use of *County* ATAX funds for such purpose.

INTRODUCTION

I've been asked to speak on behalf of the following who are also here today:

Steve Sokol, and Adam Rumoshosky, Directors of KOBA;

Charlie Sercu, a Director of FOLKS, who is also an Environmental Engineer;

Mack Fleming, an attorney, and Bram Lusk, an Oconee native, both residents of South Cove;

Leaders from the near-by communities of White Oak Cliffs; Normandy Shores, and Port Santorini

...Bill Gurley, Leon Holz, and Vic Nielsen; and,

Jon Sanderson, relator, and *former* member of the Seneca Chamber of Commerce

...the group that is sponsoring the power boat races.

I wish to emphasize that I, and those mentioned, are here today as individuals; not as official representatives of organizations that have yet to announce positions on the issue.

For myself, I'm Bill Ebeling, a lifelong water enthusiast, who has devoted much of the past 7 years to helping keep Keowee clean, safe, and beautiful... twice serving as President of FOLKS. I am currently manager of the O-P Clean Water Action Project which has, (and very much appreciates), your endorsement and support.

I also happen to have lived near the Cyahoga River in Cleveland in the 1960's when the river became so polluted that it caught fire. Yes, actually caught fire.

Lake Keowee, next to Jocassee, is the most pristine large lake in all of SC. It is on the opposite end of the environmental scale from the Cyahoga. Keowee is an environmental treasure. It will not catch fire because of pollution caused by the introduction of power boat races. But, power boat races on Lake Keowee are the spark of a different kind of fire.

The fire is small, but it is growing. It has already caused alarm, and division, within our community. Of greater concern is that this fire has the potential to spread and engulf what you, we, and so many others have been striving to develop and protect...

Carolina's "Golden Corner", the beginning of the "Heritage Corridor", the "Land of the Tears of the Mountains", a place of wildlife habitats and great scenic beauty...with room, resources, and opportunity... for quality family life, AND *compatible* enterprise.

SO, WHAT'S HAPPENED IN THE GOLDEN CORNER?

We understand that Council recently awarded ATAX funds to the Seneca Chamber in support of a Waterfest to promote tourism. The Fest is a fine idea, as is *relevant* tourism. We support that, and your decision to fund what the Chamber has promised will "*truly be a celebration of Oconee's beauty and natural resources*".

What, until very recently the Chamber has *not* shared with the community, (nor perhaps with Council), is their choice for the Fest's main attraction...a first ever, two days of power boat drag racing on Lake Keowee, to be staged at the County's South Cove Park.

Many citizens, previously uninformed, (and most still are), are mystified or outraged by this choice. As might be expected, concerns first erupted in neighborhoods around South Cove Park, but the implications of the event are far reaching and will be long lasting...perhaps permanent.

WHY ALL THE CONCERN?

The problem with powerboat racing on Lake Keowee is that it is totally inappropriate to the setting. If the Fest truly is to "celebrate Oconee's beauty and natural resources", it is foolhardy to feature an event that will concentrate large crowds on a fragile shoreline, in a park not designed nor equipped for spectator sport, to watch an event that obscures the very beauty and natural resources that the festival claims to celebrate.

South Cove and the other county parks around the lake are fine facilities for their original intent... readily accessible places for wholesome, inexpensive, family recreation and small group activities... not the 5 to 10,000 visitors that the Chamber hopes to attract.

There are, of course, issues relating to traffic and emergency vehicle access along the single road entry (which also serves neighboring communities), and issues of crowd control, personal sanitation, litter, alcohol, viewing areas (Are there any?), and the associated need to protect shoreline vegetation. All presumably have been, or will be, carefully considered, adequately funded, fully staffed, and well controlled. No meaningful plan or budget for this, however, has yet been seen.

Of far greater concern is what the crowds that come will experience, and how the lake and Oconee County will be remembered. What lasting, first impression will an inaugural Fest make? What reputation does the Chamber and the County seek that is in the best long term interest of its resources and its citizens?

When the crowd leaves Keowee and South Cove Park, will they remember it for what it now is: an exceptional haven for nature and family recreation..."pure gold in the Golden Corner"...a wonderful place to swim, paddle, sail, ski, row, fish, dive, boat (sanely), experience nature, hike, camp, or perhaps come to live? Come to live as have so many thousands...attracted by Oconee's beauty, resources, and family recreational opportunities...the attractions that have produced the area's unprecedented economic boom...all without any "help" from power boat races.

Or, will visitors see, and remember, Keowee as an aquatic raceway...a place for thrills, noise, speed, glitz, and high octane fuels? And, expensive, flashy boats named, "Liquid Thunder", "Dago Red", and "No Respect" [according to the drag boat web site]. Will they conclude that powerboat racing is welcome here? That it is something to be duplicated in this and other neighborhoods and wildlife habitats? Will prospective new residents be attracted or scared away? Will Keowee become another "exciting place to visit, *but I wouldn't want to live there?*"

And, what about safety? The race area must be patrolled, and no doubt it will... usurping traditional use of part of the lake, and preventing non-paying gate crashers. Contrary to the chamber's claim, the race promoter acknowledge that drag boat racing is a dangerous sport, involving numerous accidents. The promoter says they don't know how many. (Of course, they should know.) But, dive teams are to be at-the-ready to recover victims, and accidents do attract crowds.

Also, of lasting importance to Oconee families, is what happens after the "pros", who may have some understanding of the risks involved, leave the designated race arena, along with their support patrols and emergency dive teams. Will local, untrained, would-be racers respond with more dangerous, unorganized imitations? How many more rangers will DNR need to patrol a newly inspired "wild bunch" on Keowee? How many more unnecessary boating injuries will Lake Keowee experience?

None of all this is necessary. There is still opportunity for community to come together around a festival that will attract visitors, provide enjoyment, AND respect the lake. It's not too late to keep Keowee from becoming just one more place for machines and contrived thrills...Exciting to be sure, but already amply available in amusement parks and unimportant, environmentally barren, waterways throughout our nation. This lake and our community deserve better.

Wouldn't it be ironic, and embarrassing, if in the same month that our nation has moved to ban snow mobiles from our national parks (because of conflict with nature), that Oconee would welcome drag boat racing into its South Cove Park?

HERE'S WHAT WE'D LIKE COUNCIL TO DO

Armed with this new information and perspective, we ask you to revisit the issue with the Seneca Chamber. Challenge their use of ATAX funds to introduce power boat drag racing to Keowee. Ask them how drag races would fulfill their promise of a celebration of Oconee's beauty and natural resources. Insist that ATAX funds be used only in a manner consistent with that promise. Require a detailed plan and permit for any non-traditional use of county parks.. Ask for an accounting of projected income from two days of races, compared to the loss of even a few prospective home buyers, their ongoing purchases, and their ongoing taxes.

Let's help make the Festival a success. Let's come together around events that will showcase the true character, natural heritage, and unrivaled resources of our beautiful lake and county. Let's support relevant tourism, and continue attracting new residents to well planned communities around Keowee's 300 miles of shore. Let's continue to provide access to recreational opportunities for people of all means, and support recreation that respects Oconee's beautiful Lake Keowee.

Please help extinguish the drag race fire before it burns out of control.

Thank you for your interest. Jon Sanderson now has a short statement to add. Then, we would welcome your comments and questions. And, after due consideration, we respectfully request a recorded vote of the council to reject or support the use of county parks and county tax monies for power boat racing on Lake Keowee.



We are at the beginning of stage II of GIS development. Thanks to Jon Caime, Phase I was begun with most of the upfront costs deferred by ESRI software grants along with State grants for a 1:400 orthographic flyover photo series.

A key part of our second stage is the higher definition 1:100 flyover of the more populous areas of the county.

Council's support is requested for this second stage flyover.

\$90,000 will be required for the 1:100 digital photos and flyover (derived from average of lower exploratory estimates).

Partial funding could be accomplished by a rollover of this year's current IT/GIS budget surplus. This includes 6 months of the IT director's salary/fringe, as well as 1 full year of GIS manager salary/fringe. Estimate \$62,000.

We also have a possible re-imburement grant of \$20,000 from the state geodetic survey project available if we complete this phase.

Additional funding of approximately \$30,000 will be required.

GIS is being brought to the Council's attention as several departments have continuing interest in its development. With the formation of an information technology department, the infrastructure to utilize a GIS system is being put into place. Individual department memoranda are attached and brief synopses of benefits are outlined below.

The information Technology department will play an important part in starting the GIS program for Oconee County. Although Info Tech's involvement is one of implementation and support of the GIS program, I have seen it at work in other counties and have been impressed with how GIS can facilitate data integration. We are at a crucial point in nurturing the GIS program. There is much work to be done and from the info tech perspective we need to keep the momentum rolling if we are to have Oconee GIS in the future.

Two points of focus from Info-Tech department:

Data sharing: We are looking for more opportunities to share information between departments. GIS is the preferred vehicle to achieve this. Rather than looking at piecemeal upgrades or partial solutions in individual departments; we use GIS as the common integrated backbone. The data network infrastructure being put into place also lends itself to this collaboration.

Economic: We are at a point where software grants, and state funding makes this the time to move towards GIS. We've already been awarded a good deal of the startup necessities. To postpone this initiative would show a lack of determinedness on our part and when we do finally move toward GIS we may not receive the support we have enjoyed to date.

Approximately \$70,000 in additional money needs to be expended in the upcoming budget year. This expenditure will complete the 100 scale photos. In upcoming years the process of digitizing the parcels can occur and the county will have an accurate and usable map.

The Planning Commission will need the GIS to accomplish what is forecasted by the County Council. Without GIS the work will be inexact and best effort. Some of the uses envisioned for this department are:

GIS USES IN THE VOTER REGISTRATION AND ELECTIONS OFFICE

The GIS system has all the district boundaries, including the house, congressional, senate, county council districts and the precinct boundaries, in their mapping system. This will allow our office to generate any kind of a district map that a candidate running for office needs, and doesn't have time to draw the lines off of our office copy. The office copy that we do have is large and cumbersome and cannot be photocopied easily or plainly. Using the GIS mapping system will also allow us to generate precinct maps, which we should be sending with the poll managers to the polls on Election Day.

Re-apportionment is upon us. The Voter Registration and Elections, using the GIS System, will be able to coordinate with 911 and GIS in mapping the new district lines and automatically reassigning the voters based upon their address. This would prevent long hours and bringing in extra staff to study the different district and precinct maps to determine the new voter information for the approximately 37,000 Oconee County voters. This would also eliminate error in placing a voter in the wrong precinct and/or districts, and would ensure each elected candidate their correct voter population. We would also be working with the State Demographic Office to accomplish this work.

Since registration of voters is an ongoing thing, use of the GIS system in this department would be on a daily basis. To ensure the integrity of the Oconee County elections, I believe that this is imperative to the Voter Registration and Elections Office.
