MINUTES, OCONEE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING

The Oconee County Council met Tuesday, April 3, 2001 at 7:00 PM in Council Chambers, 415 South Pine Street, Walhalla, SC with all Council Members and the County Attorney present.

Press:

Members of the press notified (by mail): Keowee Courier, Westminster News, Anderson Independent, WGOG Radio, WPEK Radio & Daily Journal.

Members of the press present: Amanda Rylander – Daily Journal & Dave Williams – Anderson Independent.

Call to Order:

The meeting was called to order by Supervisor-Chair Hughes who welcomed those present.

Invocation:

Mr. Lyles gave the invocation.

Minutes:

Mr. Johns made a motion, seconded by Mr. Ables, approved 5 – 0 that the minutes of the March 20, 2001 meeting be adopted as printed.

Resolution 2001-17:

Mr. Johns made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hall, approved 5 – 0 that Resolution 2001-17, "A RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE WALHALLA WRESTLING TEAM" be adopted on first and final reading. Mr. Johns presented the resolution to Coach Trey Gardner.

Forms & Supplies:

Upon recommendation of Kenneth F. Williams, County Auditor, Mr. Ables made a motion, seconded by Mr. Johns, approved 5 - 0 that the attached agreement between Oconee County and Smith Data Processing for forms and supplies for fiscal year 2001-2002 be adopted with the terms of the agreements being changed to:

6. Terms

Invoices will be billed at the end of the month. Invoices will be due and payable thirty (30) days after receipt by the county.

Keowee Key Lot (Budget & Finance Recommendation):

Mr. Kenneth F. Williams, Auditor explained to Council that a lot had been sold by the Delinquent Tax Collector and also by the Forfeit Land Commission. The gentleman who purchased from the Forfeit Land Commission began preparing the lot for construction when the error was discovered.

Some years ago a lot a Keowee Key was deeded to Oconee County, since that time the county has tried to sell the lot several days, but has been unable to do so. The county has to pay dues, etc. on this lot, therefore upon recommendation of the Budget & Finance Committee, Council voted unanimously to deed the Keowee Key lot to the gentleman which will put the lot back on the tax roll, eliminate the county having to pay dues, etc. and settle potential liability.

Aeronautics:

Upon request of Mr. Robert Banks, Airport Manager, Mr. Lyles made a motion, seconded by Mr. Ables, approved 5 - 0 that the attached budget transfer in the amount of \$29,000 be adopted.

Rural Fire:

Upon recommendation of Mr. Dewitt Mize, Rural Fire Marshal, Mr. Hall made a motion, seconded by Mr. Ables, approved 5 - 0 that the county enter into an agreement with the SC Forestry Commission for a 1984 Chevrolet diesel truck to be used as a brush truck at the South Union Fire Department.

Rural Fire Continued:

Upon recommendation of Mr. Mize & Ms. Marianne Dillard, Procurement Director, Mr. Hall made a motion, seconded by Mr. Lyles, approved 5 – 0 that the bid for fire fighting equipment be awarded on a low bid per item basis as delineated on the attached bid sheet:

Anderson Fire & Safety, Inc.	\$4,246.20
NATECO, Inc.	\$3,798.90
Slagles Fire Equipment	\$7,815.15

Scrap Metal:

Upon recommendation of Ms. Dillard, Mr. Lyles made a motion, seconded by Mr. Ables, approved 5 – 0 that the bid for the county to dispose of scrap metal be awarded to Cobb Salvage who was the high bidder at \$275. (See attached bid sheet)

Third Party Administrator for Health Insurance:

Mr. Hamilton made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hall, approved 5 – 0 that the contract with Consolidated Benefits, Inc. as third party administrator for the county's self-funded insurance plan be renewed for fiscal year 2001-02 and it not be placed out for bids. However, representatives from Consolidated have been informed that if problems arise with late payment of claims, lack of documentation in a timely manner, etc. occur before the during the year, the county will not hesitate to exercise its option to place the service out for bid.

Purchasing, Contracting, Real Estate, Building & Grounds Recommendation:

Council unanimously adopted the proposed RFP for an FBO at the Oconee County Airport with the following changes:

Oconee County will implement the following schedule for payment of lease and gross receipts:

Startup – 6 months	No Monthly Lease / 0% Gross Receipts
7 Months – 12 months	½ Monthly Lease / 2% Gross Receipts
1 Year – 2 nd year	Monthly Lease / 2% Gross Receipts
After 2 nd year	Monthly Lease & Minimum 3% Gross Receipts

Commissions:

Mr. Hamilton advised Council he had received some questions regarding the motion to have seven members on the commissions and he wanted it made a part of the record that the reason for this motion is to include minorities and women as commission members.

Proclamation 2001-02:

Mr. Hall made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hamilton, approved 5 – 0 that Proclamation 2001-02, "A PROCLAMATION DECLARING MAY 12, 2001 AS *THE SPRING CLEAN-UP OF OCONEE COUNTY*" be adopted on first and final reading.

SIARE Appointee:

Upon recommendation of Supervisor Hughes, Mr. Hamilton made a motion, seconded by Mr. Johns, approved 5 – 0 that Mr. Steve Blackwell be appointed to represent Oconee County on the SIARE Board.

Budget & Finance Recommendation:

Council unanimously adopted the recommendation of the Budget & Finance Committee to seek funding in the amount of \$15,000 for each Council District for recreation with \$10,000 going to the cities and the remaining \$5,000 in each district being allocated upon recommendation of the Parks & Recreation Department. Further that any entity or organization receiving the funds be a non-profit organization and none of the funds be used for re-occurring expenses.

Parks & Recreation Commission:

Mrs. Hughes informed those present that the Parks & Recreation Commission had a very informal meeting Monday, April 2, 2001 to get to know each other; Mr. Tim Mays was elected as Chair and Mr. Mike Lemon was elected as Vice Chair. The next meeting will be a regular meeting and will be advertised to the public.

Zoning Board of Appeals Appointee:

Mr. Lyles made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hall, approved 5 – 0 that Mr. Clark Wilmont be appointed to represent District IV on the Zoning Board of Appeals.

Purchasing, Contracting, Real Estate, Building & Grounds Recommendation:

Council unanimously adopted the recommendation of the Purchasing, Contracting, Real Estate, Building & Grounds Committee to adopt the attached transfer for Oconee County Airport in the amount of \$2,000.

Seneca Bobcats Baseball:

Mrs. Hughes informed those present that Mr. Bob Peeler, Lieutenant Governor will be pitching the first ball for the Seneca Bobcats Friday, April 6, 2001.

Public Comment Session:

Mr. B. J. Littleton made Council aware that it was difficult for the audience to hear from the table mikes.

Mr. Steve Sokol expressed appreciation to Council for the adoption of Proclamation 2001-02.

Mr. Brian Seals addressed Council regarding the sexually oriented ordinance and presented them with the attached information comparing Anderson County's ordinance with Oconee County's ordinance.

Mr. Hall made a motion, seconded by Mr. Ables, approved 5 - 0 that this matter be referred to the Law Enforcement, Safety, Health, Welfare & Services Committee.

Executive Session:

Mr. Hall made a motion, seconded by Mr. Ables, approved 5 - 0 that Council go into executive session for the receipt of legal advice subject to attorney/client privilege.

Open Session:

When open session resumed Mr. Lyles made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hall, approved 5 - 0 that the fee for disposal of garbage for the City of Westminster be waived and they be allowed to dispose of garbage without charge at the landfill as Waste Management has agreed that the vehicles used in Westminster will be used for Westminster only and the vehicles will be marked "City of Westminster".

Laws regarding property taxes may be changed for 2001 taxes. Forms required in the printing of property taxes may be changed due to state regulation. However, your inventory of the forms currently being used for property taxes should be ordered before the legislation adjourns for 2001. The order process includes bidding, design, or request changes, proofs, production and delivery. From start to finish, the order process takes several months.

On April 10, 2001 the forms order will be submitted to the forms companies. Shortly thereafter, SDP will bring proofs to your county departments for signature approval. Alterations to the proofs may be made by the customer. Charges for the proof alteration will be billed to the county. Proof alteration charges depend on the amount of change made. The minimum charge is \$50.00.

These prices are based on placing your forms order by April 10, 2001 in combination with 25 other counties. These forms will be released for manufacture when the 2001 session of the General Assembly adjourns. Approximate delivery dates are June 30, 2001 through July 31, 2001. These forms will be invoiced to you and payable when they arrive.

In the event that the General Assembly mandates changes that affect the tax forms - the quantities, prices, forms and delivery dates in this contract may be invalid. In such an event, SDP will prepare for the County's consideration new proofs and a new, revised contract that will replace this contract.

- (a) Limited Express Warranty. SDP warrants that it will supply the forms and/or supplies described in this Agreement in accordance with the understandings of the parties as expressed in this Agreement.
- (b) **THE ABOVE WARRANTY IS IN LIEU OF ALL OTHER WARRANTIES, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO ALL WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY AND FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE.**
- (c) Right to Damages Limited. Under no circumstances will SDP be liable for incidental, special, punitive or consequential damages whether under warranty, tort, contract, strict liability or otherwise.

5. Complete Agreement

This Agreement cancels and supersedes all prior written and unwritten agreements, attachments, schedules, appendices and understandings between the parties pertaining to the matters covered in this Agreement, and contains the entire agreement between the parties. No obligations, agreements or understandings shall be implied from any of the terms and provisions of this Agreement, all obligations, agreements and understandings with respect to the subject matter hereof being expressly set forth herein. No representations or statements, other than those expressly set forth in this Agreement were relied upon by the parties in entering into this Agreement. No amendment, modification or waiver of, addition to, or deletion from the terms of this Agreement will be effective unless reduced to writing and signed by representatives of both parties with actual authority to bind the parties.

6. Terms

Invoices will be billed at the end of the month. Your account must be paid by the 15th of the following month. Amounts not paid when due will be subject to a finance charge of 2% per month (24% per year).

EQUIPMENT LEASE AGREEMENT

between

SALEM Fire Department

and the

SOUTH CAROLINA FORESTRY COMMISSION



This agreement is made between the South Carolina Forestry Commission, agency of the State of South Carolina, hereinafter referred to as the COMMISSION and the OCONEE hereinafter referred to as COOPERATOR.

W I T N E S S E T H

WHEREAS, the SALEM Fire Department did on _____ appear into an agreement with the SOUTH CAROLINA FORESTRY COMMISSION for the purpose of mutually providing a means of rural fire defense; and WHEREAS, the COOPERATOR can more adequately carry out this function if additional equipment is made available; and WHEREAS, it has been determined to be advantageous to the COMMISSION in the proper discharge of its responsibilities to make certain equipment available to the COOPERATOR;

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

THE COMMISSION agrees:

(1) To loan to the Cooperator the equipment described on the attached listing, hereinafter the "equipment", to be used in accordance with the terms set forth in this agreement.

(2) That the title on all accessories, tools, equipment, stores, etc., which are added to the equipment will remain with the Cooperator and the COOPERATOR may remove same, prior to returning the equipment to the COMMISSION.

THE COOPERATOR agrees:

(1) To respond with men and equipment to all fire calls when requested to do so by the COMMISSION, within the COOPERATOR'S area of responsibility.

(2) To equip, maintain in a high state of readiness, house in a suitable manner and operate and maintain said equipment at no cost to the COMMISSION. Vehicles being modified for fire use must give proper regard to safety, especially braking distance, carrying capacity, center of gravity and axle weight. Vehicles must not exceed gross weight and speeds beyond those originally licensed.

(3) To make said equipment available for inspection by a representative of the COMMISSION.

(4) To have upon receipt and to maintain current bodily injury liability, property damage liability, and medical payment insurance for each piece of equipment listed; with minimums of \$15,000 bodily injury each person, \$30,000 each occurrence, \$5,000 property damage each occurrence \$1,000 basic economic loss each person, and \$500 medical payment each person.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
between the
SALEM Fire Department
and the
SOUTH CAROLINA FORESTRY COMMISSION

This memorandum made by and between the South Carolina Forestry Commission, and agency of the State of South Carolina, hereinafter referred to as the COMMISSION and the COONCE COUNTY hereinafter referred to as COOPERATOR.

INTRODUCTION

Because of the intermingling of structures and natural cover fuels in unincorporated areas of COONCE County, the objectives of the two above-named organizations are inseparable; i.e., to minimize the loss of life and property as a result of uncontrolled fire. Recognizing this, we, the undersigned, have arrived at the MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING for these primary purposes:

1. Provide for closest possible cooperation on mutual objectives.
2. Prevent misunderstanding as to purpose and responsibilities of our respective organizations.
3. Make possible effective support between organizations.

To implement this program, the following information as to organizational makeup is exchanged:

FIRE DEPARTMENT

1. AREA COVERED (narrative description or attach map)
2. SOURCE OF FUNDS
3. FACILITIES
 - (a) Equipment
 - (b) Manpower
4. TYPE ORGANIZATION (Volunteer, Subscription, Tax District, Municipal)

SOUTH CAROLINA FORESTRY COMMISSION

1. AREA COVERED: The county of COONCE, except for incorporated areas and Federal lands not under specific agreement.
NOTE: Equipment may be sent into unincorporated areas upon request of the municipal fire department.
2. SOURCE OF FUNDS: State appropriations, supplemented by Federal matching funds.
3. FACILITIES
 - (a) Equipment
 - (b) Manpower
4. RESPONSIBILITIES: To provide a statewide system of fire protection on all lands outside of corporate limits which support enough growth or have sufficient inflammable debris or grass to constitute, in the judgement of the COMMISSION, a fire menace to itself or adjoining lands.

- (3) The equipment may not be sold, junked, traded, or leased, but must be returned to the COMMISSION at the COMMISSION'S Central Shop in Columbia for final disposition, and to notify the COMMISSION immediately if said equipment is lost, stolen, damaged, or involved in an accident.
- (4) The equipment will be painted a mutually agreeable color and be marked in a manner that will indicate the cooperation between the COOPERATOR and the COMMISSION, prior to placing the equipment in operation.
- (5) That any employee of the COOPERATOR or other person enlisted by the COOPERATOR to man said equipment shall not be considered an employee of the COMMISSION for any purpose. The COOPERATOR shall have the responsibility for any Workman's Compensation claim, or other claims, instituted by any person manning said equipment at the request of the COOPERATOR.
- (6) That said equipment shall be used only for the purpose of fire suppression and prevention.
- (7) To not place the equipment in operation until complying with the conditions set forth in (4) and (5) above, however, that the equipment shall be placed in operation within six (6) months, of the date of receipt of the equipment. Failure to so comply shall cause for forfeiture of possession of the equipment to the COMMISSION.
- (8) That failure to comply with this agreement can jeopardize the COOPERATOR'S present and/or future participation in the Equipment Lease program.

This agreement will be effective from the date of execution by the STATE FORESTER and will continue in force from year to year unless terminated by either party by thirty (30) days written notice to the other, provided, however that all of the provisions herein are complied with.

OPERATIONAL PROCEDURES

In areas of mutual interest, we agree to the following operational procedures:

1. DISPATCHING:

- (a) The COMMISSION will dispatch personnel and/or equipment to any known forest, brush, grass, etc., fire or to any fire of unknown character.
- (b) The COOPERATOR will dispatch personnel to any known structure, building, residence, etc., fire, or to any fire of unknown character.

2. COMMUNICATIONS:

- (a) Having knowledge of same, the COMMISSION will immediately advise the COOPERATOR of any burning or threatened structure within the COOPERATOR's area of operation. (COOPERATOR's area of operation shown on attached map.)

3. MUTUAL ASSISTANCE:

- (a) Suppression. When both parties are represented at the same fire, the overall supervisory responsibility shall lie with the agency concerned most directly with the object than actually on fire. If both types of objects are on fire simultaneously, each agency shall attend its normal responsibility, and/or play a supporting role to the other based on a judgement decision as to the value involved or threatened. If immediate action is required, neither party shall be limited because of the type of object which is burning.
- (b) Training. Each party agrees to participate in those portions of the other parties' training program which have bearing on the individual parties' efficiency.
- (c) Each party agrees to lend its support to programs of the other agency which will increase the public awareness of the hazard and destruction of fire and/or make the objective of this Agreement possible.

This agreement will be effective from the date of execution by the STATE FORESTER and will continue in force from year to year, subject to any amendments which may be made hereof by mutual agreement of the parties, or unless terminated by either party by thirty (30) days written notice to the other, provided, however, that all of the provisions herein are complied with.

The following outline compares the Ordinance of Anderson County, SC 98-015 to the Ordinance of Oconee County, SC 99-14. Section references in parenthesis are to the preceding Oconee County Ordinances 98-5.

History of Events

Oconee County Council's Consideration of Strengthening the County's Ordinance Regulating Sexually Oriented Businesses

Date	Event
July 7, 2000	Spoke in detail to Sheriff Gene Taylor regarding the Anderson County Ordinances and their success in regulating sexually oriented businesses.
July 10, 2000	Received copies of the Anderson County Ordinance 98-015.
July 11, 2000	Received copies of the Oconee County Ordinance 99-14. Also received copies of the two outstanding permits in our county and found one to be in violation for not requesting a permit renewal 30 days prior to expiration. Permit should have been lost and re-issuance disallowed due to location violations.
July 15-30, 2000	Studied and compared the two ordinances. Prepared a short comparison for presentation to the Oconee County Council.
August 15, 2000	Spoke to the Oconee County Council. Presented the comparison and the recommendation that we draft and adopt a stronger ordinance.
August 21, 2000	Requested a copy of the minutes from the previous meeting. They stated: <i>"Mr. Brian Seal addressed Council regarding regulations for adult entertainment establishments in Oconee County. Mr. Seal discussed the differences in Oconee County and Anderson County's ordinance regulating adult entertainment industries and urged that Oconee's be made stricter. Mr. Timms made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hall, approved 5-0 that this matter be referred to the Planning Commission. (See Attachment)."</i>
August, 2000	Contacted Mr. Tom Hendrix to schedule a time to present findings to the Planning Commission. I was told they were too busy at the time and that I should wait until the October 9 th , 2000 meeting to present.
October 9, 2000	Spoke to the Oconee County Planning Commission. Presented findings and recommended that we draft and adopt a stronger ordinance. Was told that Mr. Hendrix and the county attorney Brad Norton would begin work. Mr. Hendrix estimated that a draft would be ready for review in 2 months and agreed to allow a period of public review prior to presentation to council. This request was made so that I could circulate the new ordinance through some agencies that specialize in such ordinances to catch unintentional non-constitutionalities.
December 11, 2000	Attended the planning commission meeting expecting a draft. No work had begun. Was told other work was taking longer than expected and that it was the next item on the agenda.
January, 2001	Contacted Tom Hendrix and was told that the constitutionality our current ordinance had been challenged and would be in Circuit court within two months of the agreement. The planning commission suggested waiting until that case was settled before proceeding.
February, 2001	Many phone calls. Found that the date for settling the charges against our current ordinance was not fixed. Although the business violated our ordinance and should be shut down, they are now open and operating indefinitely.
March, 2001	Contacted the County Supervisors Office and was told that the issue should be handled by the Law Enforcement Committee, not the Planning commission.
April 3, 2001	Re-appeared to County Council to ask for improved handling of the issue.
