Dear Mrs. McSwain:

Please find enclosed a grant application from the Walhalla Auditorium Restoration Committee, Inc., requesting funding support of \$20,000 to be used toward providing seats for the auditorium. We will have just over 400 seats at an estimated cost of \$80,000.

We did not get three bids for this project. We did, however, talk to personnel at Walhalla High School and at West Oak High School about their purchase of auditorium seats. They had investigated extensively and found that Educational Products Co., Inc. Columbia, SC provided the best quality seats at the most reasonable prices. We decided, then, to purchase seats from this company.

The restoration of the Walhalla Graded School Auditorium continues to be a true community effort. Local professionals have volunteered their contracting, architectural and environmental services and local businesses have donated goods and services for fundraising efforts. To date the committee has one hundred and fifty-seven (157) members dedicated to the auditorium's re-opening, hopefully in November, 2002.

At this point we have raised just over \$285,000. For an estimated cost of \$340,000 this is getting close, but we still have a way to go! We sincerely appreciate what the ATAX Committee has done for us in the past, and hope you will continue to support this worthy endeavor.

Along with the necessary documents and application forms I am enclosing a copy of our overall restoration plan, and a list of suggested uses of the auditorium that we believe will promote tourism in the area.

Please find enclosed a grant application from the Walhalla Auditorium Restoration Committee, Inc., requesting funding support of \$20,000 to be used toward providing seats for the auditorium. We will have just over 400 seats at an estimated cost of \$80,000.

We did not get three bids for this project. We did, however, talk to personnel at Walhalla High School and at West Oak High School about their purchase of their auditorium seats. They had investigated extensively and found that Educational Products Co., Inc. Columbia, SC provided the best quality seats at the most reasonable prices. We decided, then, to purchase seats from this company.

The restoration of the Walhalla Graded School Auditorium continues to be a true community effort. Local professionals have volunteered their contracting, architectural and environmental services and local businesses have donated goods and services for fundraising efforts. To date the committee has one hundred and fifty seven (157) members dedicated to the auditorium's re-opening, **hop-fully in November, 2002.**

At this point we have raised just over \$285,000. For an estimated cost of \$340,000 this is getting close, but we still have a way to go! We sincerely appreciate what the ATAX Committee has done for us in the past, and hope you will continue to support this worthy endeavor.

- Floor entire stage area with new hardwood flooring
- Repair and restore all 10 windows—all panes replaced with new glass
- Completely replace electrical wiring/light fixtures
- Complete drywall interior-plaster and masonry work
- Replace rusted and damaged ceiling tiles with new tiles
- Install heating and air conditioning system
- Complete necessary carpentry work on steps, stoops, and on interior trim

Steps are not necessarily in order of procedure.

The Walhalla Auditorium when restored will provide a first class center for visitors and for the community. It will promote tourism in many and various ways. We suggest a few:

The auditorium will be marketed across the state and in neighboring states as a meeting and convention site. Country music groups from Georgia and from North Carolina have contacted WARC about the use of the facility for shows.

Widespread advertising including The Greenville News, Georgia and North Carolina papers and radio stations is planned.

A president and CEO of an event and entertainment organization has volunteered to assist WARC in providing top quality shows including comedians and musicians. This person has nation-wide contacts in the entertainment world. The entertainers and show people will eat several meals in Walhalla and likely spend at least one night in the area.

The Southeastern Federation of Gems and Mineral Societies often put on gem shows in the area. We have a large number of members in the region who would be glad to host a show in our 400 seat auditorium.

Specialized antique shows and auctions can be held in the auditorium and will draw crowds from 100's of miles around. This idea is very much a reality since we have 12 or 13 antique shops here in Walhalla. These people have ties with dealers in Highlands and many other areas in the southeast.

The Wagner Society of Walhalla supports classical musical events of all kinds and has ties to many classical groups, especially in the southeast, who would welcome a small auditorium for their performances. As a part of this, chamber musicians from Atlanta, Highlands, Greenville, Spartanburg, Charlotte, Brevard and Columbia can be invited to perform. These groups have quite a large following.

Visiting artists such as Piccolo Spoleto from Charleston will be most interested in a facility such as ours. Charleston and Walhalla have 150 years of close connection which we hope to revive.

Political rallies and small conventions with delegates will find this a perfect place.

The Home Builders Association will be able to host vendors and builders from the tri-state and upstate areas. Further, Bankers, Credit Unions, Bar, Medical and Teacher groups will want to use this facility.

The Realtors Association can invite developers, legislators and Chamber of Commerce people from throughout the state and neighboring states to convene here.

Touring play-groups, Blue Grass Bands, Gospel Singers, will find the auditorium a perfect venue.

Craft shows from the entire southeast will be welcomed. These shows draw from miles around.

Visitors at Oconee State Park and at county parks will welcome evening entertainment in this facility.

This auditorium will be a positive force in the wise and careful development of tourism in this area.

C. Organization Overview:

Located along the southern shores of picturesque Lake Jocassee, Devil's Fork State Park offers a variety of recreational opportunities and overnight accommodations to people visiting Oconee County. Opened in 1991, the 644-acre park functions as a gateway to Lake Jocassee providing access for boating, swimming, and fishing in a relatively undeveloped and unspoiled natural setting. The park also provides a variety of overnight accommodations ranging from primitive boat-in campsites along the northern shore of the lake at the base of Musterground Mountain to modern, amenity packed villas. The park operates 20 mountain villas and two campgrounds: (1) the main campground and (2) the afore-mentioned 13 site primitive campground. The main campground consists of 59 paved sites with water and electric hook-ups and 25 sites designated for tents only with no utilities (Figures, Figure 1). The park also operates a picnic/day-use area and a store.

Devils Fork offers a limited number of outdoor educational programs. Day hikes on the Foothills Trail, fall color excursions, winter eagle watches, and Oconee Bell nature walks are a few of the more popular programs held on a yearly basis. A cooperative venture between Duke Energy and the South Carolina State Park Service, Devils Fork provides a quality, environmentally conscience recreation area that blends natural and recreational amenities while minimizing the disturbance of wildlife habitats. The park service manages Devils Fork as a traditional state park (Appendix A) in order to maintain the high quality of facilities and services that visitors to the Golden Corner have come to enjoy and expect.

Devils Park State Park respectfully resubmits this proposal to obtain the remaining funds necessary to finish complete both projects described below.

III. NARRATIVE PROJECT DESCRIPTION

A. Project Title: Trail, Walkway Construction and Slope Stabilization

B. Description of Project:

The above project involves two main areas in the park that receive heavy use by overnight guests. Tent sites 21-25 comprise the first area that needs attention. These sites are located along a gentle to moderate slope that descends down to the shores of Lake Jourassee (Appendix C, Pictures 1-3). As evidenced by the pictures in Appendix C, the sites and the trails leading to the sites are suffering from erosion after only five years of use. The park staff plans to build walkways and to install cedar fencing in order to direct foot traffic along designated paths and to stave off further erosion. Mulch will be used to cover the bare soil between the walkways and around the sites. This same erosion control measure was utilized with great success in the area around tent sites 1-20 (Appendix C, Pictures 4-6). Routed wooden signs will be used to mark the entrances/exits to the trails and to direct campers to the proper sites. An additional trail will also be constructed below the tent sites and will lead to the lakeshore. This lower trail will protect the sensitive shoreline and provide a safe route for campers trying to reach the shore of the lake. Currently campers have no designated path, forcing them to traverse rip-rap and accelerating the erosion process. Figures 2 and 3 detail the proposed layout of the trails, fencing and other improvements outlined above.

The Villa area also needs some attention, particularly the trail between Villas 7 and 8 that leads to the courtesy dock provided for Villa guests. Time, heavy use, inadequate marking and a steep slope have created a maze of rutted and awkward trails leading both to the courtesy dock and to the lakeshore. (Appendix C, Pictures 7-9). Phase 2 of the project will involve the construction of new trails leading to the courtesy dock and to the lakeshore (Figure 3). These trails will be constructed in the same manner as the walkways that lead to the walk-in tent sites. Fencing would be installed to prevent people from straying off the newly constructed walkways. Proper signage would also be erected. These new trails would be a great convenience to guests staying in the Villas and would prevent the further degradation of this lake access point.

C. Project Benefits:

This project directly benefits overnight guests to Oconee County. The Villas at Devils Fork state Park are rapidly becoming a year round attraction. The campground at the park receives heavy use on spring and fall weekends and throughout the duration of the summer season. Maintaining quality facilities and implementing sustainable management practices directly correspond to the South Carolina State Park Service's two guiding principles of stewardship and service. The proposed projects will improve the conditions of both the campground and the villa area, insuring that they are preserved for the use of future generations. These projects will meet the guiding principles of the State Park Service while enticing patrons to continue visiting the park.

Devils fork State Park will also benefit from the proposed projects. The projects will improve the overall infrastructure of the park and increase the sustainability of the park's resources. Furthermore with increasing budget constraints, a partnership with Oconee County on this type of project would aid Devils Fork in continuing to meet its mission - managing the park in a manner that is consistent with providing quality facilities and protection of its resources, and to serve as a gateway to the unique recreational opportunities of Lake Jocassee. Also, the proposed projects will allow the park staff to stave off erosion that if not halted immediately, may result in either the closing or relocation of several valuable park assets. Oconee County will also benefit. In helping to maintain the high standards and quality of facilities at a popular tourist destination, the county will insure continued overnight visits and subsequent tourist spending.

IV. APPROXIMATE DATES OF PROJECT

Beginning: This project has already begun. Mulch has already been placed around tent sites 21-25. Trail construction began on April 15, 2002 using materials purchased from the \$1,000.00 already allocated toward the project.

Ending: Depending on approval of the requested funds and when they are released, the project (including both phases) will be completed by September 30, 2002.

V. APPLICATION CATEGORY

Government Entity: Devils Fork State Park (South Carolina State Park Service)

VI. DEMOGRAPHIC DATA

The proposed project will serve to strengthen Devils Fork's influence on tourism in Oconee County. Prior to opening in 1991, no appreciable overnight accommodations providing lake access were available to people visiting Lake Jocassee. Very limited primitive camping facilities were located at Dismal Creek near the South Carolina/North Carolina border, but Oconee County received no money in the form of accommodations tax from this campground. Since opening in 1991, Devils Fork State Park has steadily become a popular destination for visitors to the Golden Corner. The park has generated over \$700,000 of annual revenue four out of the last five years (Table 1). The park has also collected in excess of \$100,000 in accommodations taxes since opening in 1991 (Table 2). Visitors to Devils Fork have also had a positive impact on the health of the local economy. The local bait and tackle shop has increased its hours of operation and staffing levels to accommodate the growing number of visitors to Lake Jocassee. Requests for boat rentals and guided trips on the lake are presently higher than ever as is the number of individuals who provide these services. The park staff routinely refers individuals to local restaurants, bed and breakfasts, private cabin rentals and private campgrounds when Devils Fork is full. The park has seen its revenue rise and its attendance increase by providing well-maintained quality facilities from which visitors can enjoy picturesque Lake Jocassee. The proposed project will improve both the sustainability of the resources and the quality of the infrastructure at Devils Fork, thus maintaining the high standards repeat guests and new guests have come to expect.

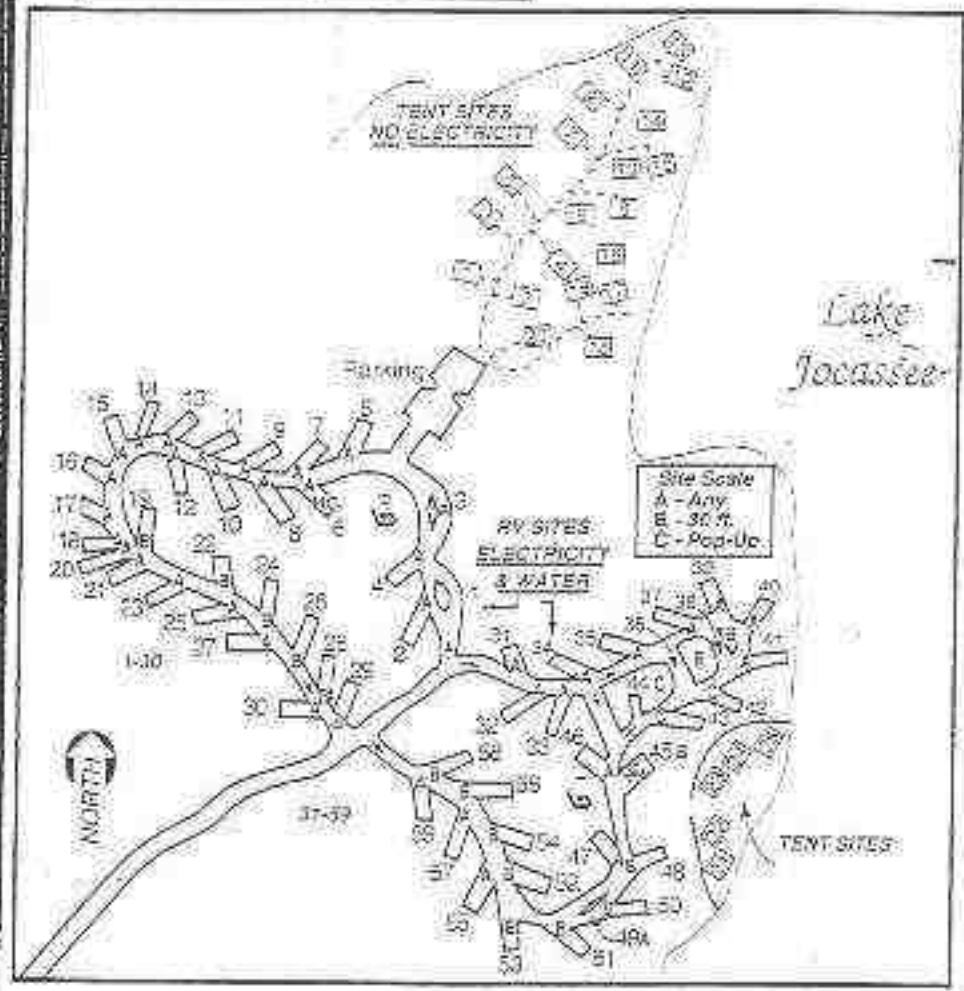

Gate Combination



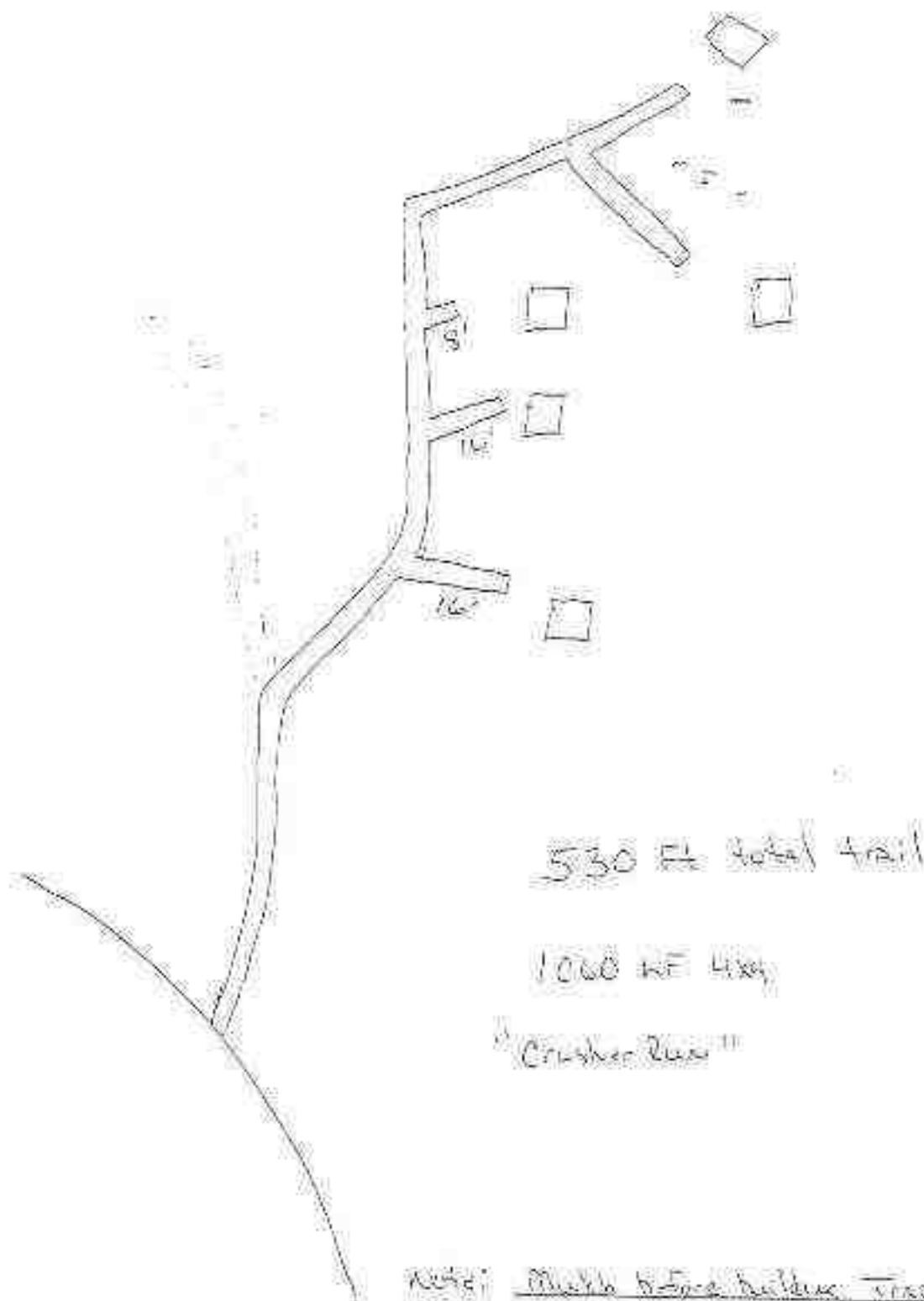
In an effort to minimize erosion, soil compaction and damage to site pads, all vehicles and trailers are required to park completely on the paved surface. Only two vehicles will be allowed per site. Any additional units should be parked in designated overflow area. For additional information, check with park ranger.

To ensure you enjoy your vacation experience, be aware of the natural environment. The more you know about it, the more you will appreciate it. Visitors should observe and respect the natural features, check with a park ranger.

Campground Rules and Regulations

1. Campers must check in at park office before occupying campsites.
2. Overnight camping is allowed only to registered guests.
3. To register for a campsite, a member of the registered party (18 years or older) must be present with the camping equipment and proper identification. Camping equipment must be set-up on the site immediately after registering for the site.
4. One family or a maximum of six people is allowed per site. Two camping units may be used on a site if it includes one small tent and one large tent; two small tents; a small tent and a trailer; or a small tent and a recreational vehicle. Two trailers, two recreational vehicles, or one trailer and one recreational vehicle are not permitted on one campsite.
5. S.C. senior citizen residents presenting proof of age may use campsites at one-half of the fee. A family of campers including a person who is a S.C. resident and disabled, blind, or over 65 years of age qualifies for the reduced rate if the qualifying individual also occupies the same camping unit. The qualifying individual must be camping with other family members for the duration of their stay and must be camping in one unit. The rate reduction applies only to the camping unit of the qualifying person.
6. All fires must be confined to designated grills or areas.
7. Checkout time is 3:30 PM. Campers staying beyond the checkout time may be charged the full camping rate for the next day.
8. Campers must retain a receipt. Refunds cannot be given without receipt and proper ID.
9. Maximum campsite occupancy is 14 days after which a camper must vacate the site or move to another site, provided there are no campers waiting for a site. From April 1 through November 1 after the 14-day limit, the camper must vacate the camping area for 48 hours before returning to another campsite.
10. Please use the dump stations. The dumping of gray water on the ground is a violation of state law.
11. All pets must be leashed or kept in a leash no longer than six feet or otherwise under physical restraint control at all times. Please respect the use of others by cleaning up behind pets.
12. Motorbikes, mopeds and motorcycles are to be ridden only when entering or leaving the camping area.
13. Reservations can be made for all campsites. The park will guarantee a campsite only. A waitlist preference will be honored subject to availability.

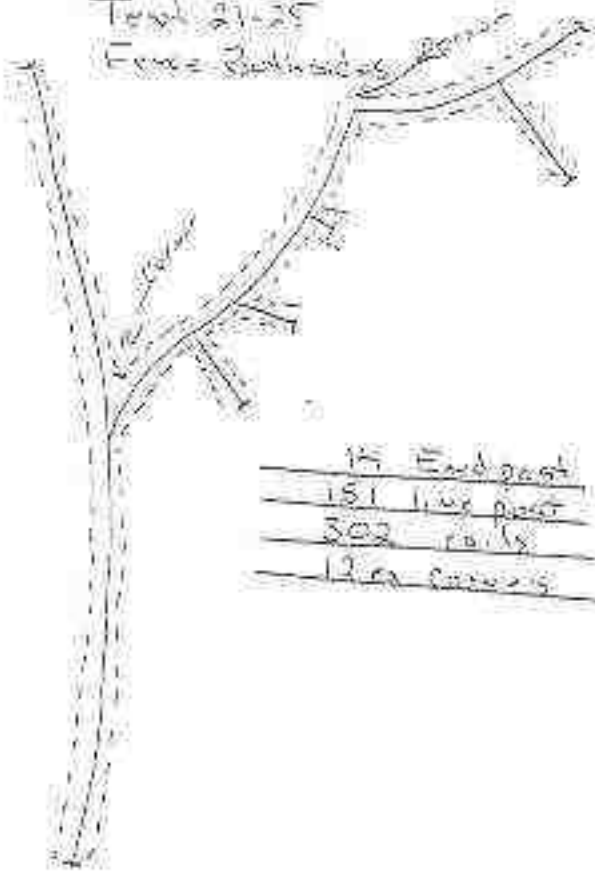

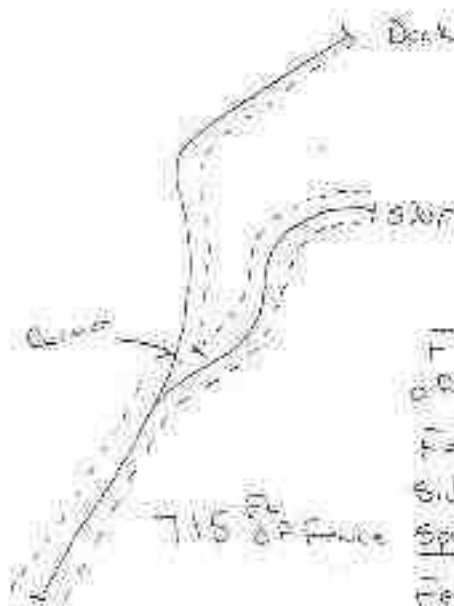

APPENDIX A

Traditional State Parks

Parks that offer a number of coordinated programs for the preservation and the conservation of defining natural and cultural resources, but also provide a variety of outdoor activities supported by the core resources. A characteristic of these properties is that the defining resources that shape the use and appreciation of these properties remain a focal point of the park, keeping in mind that these resources are not always contained within the bounds of the park - Lake Jocassee at Devils Fork is the focal point of the park, but located outside the park's jurisdiction. Traditional Parks may contain designated wilderness areas, natural areas, and cultural sites. They can also accept a moderate level of development.

APPENDIX B

ITEMIZED PROJECT BUDGET

Partial funding for this project was acquired through the 2001-2002 Annual Park Plan and Budget process (APP process). Additional funding has also been requested in the 2002-2003 APP process. This project needs to be completed immediately to insure the sustainability of these vital visitor service areas. Additional A-tax funds are required to adequately revitalize the two areas, tent sites 21-25 and the villa courtesy loop trail, and to insure that proper measures are taken to halt the present erosion and to prevent future erosion.

- 1) Mulch and surge stone for this project will come from supplies already on hand.
- 2) \$1000.00 was obtained through the 2001-2002 APP process to begin this project. \$802.66 of this money has been spent on 70 4x4x16's to construct the frames for the initial walkway design for sites 21-25 (Figure 2). The remaining \$197.34 will be spent on crusher run to line the newly constructed frames. An additional \$1650.00 for asphalt has been requested through the 2002-2003 APP process.
- 3) Budget for A-tax funds requested to complete the entire tent site revitalization project (This project is a top priority for Devils Fork State Park).

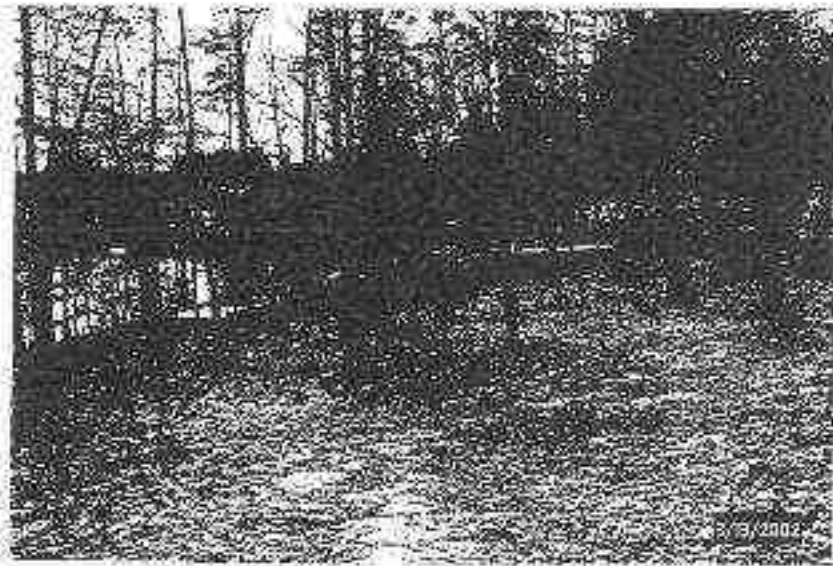
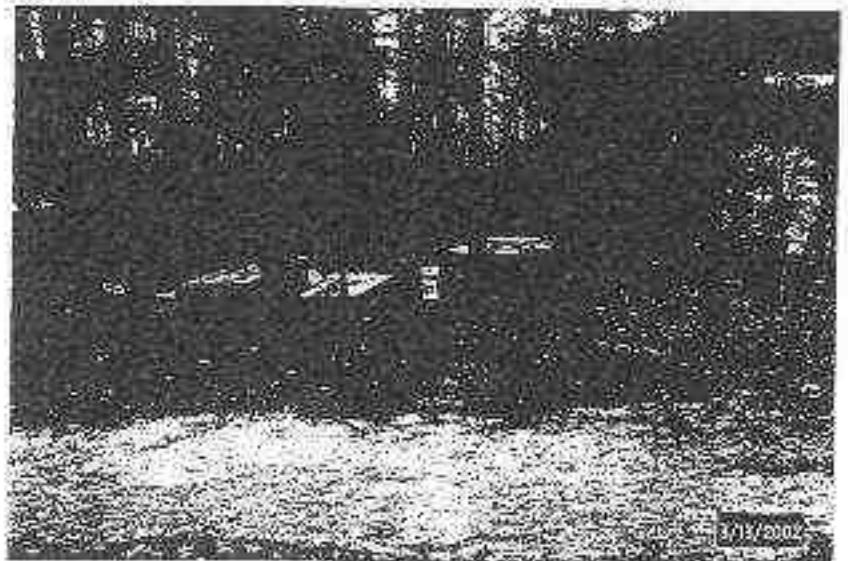

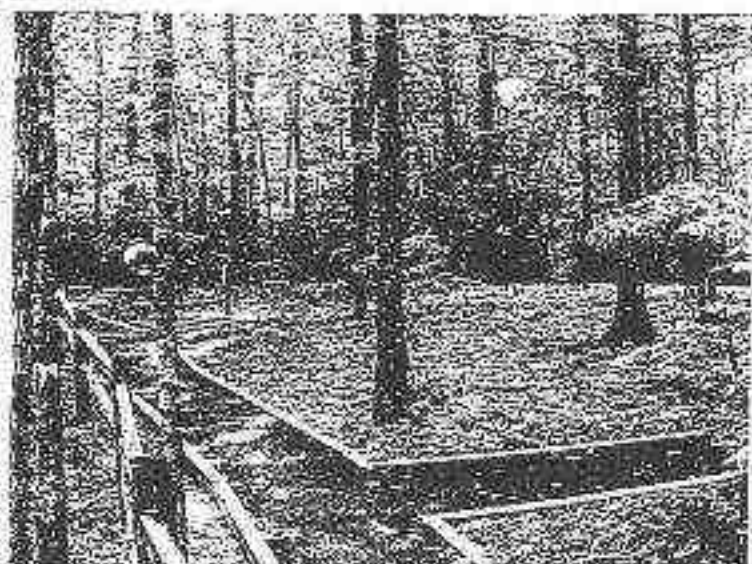
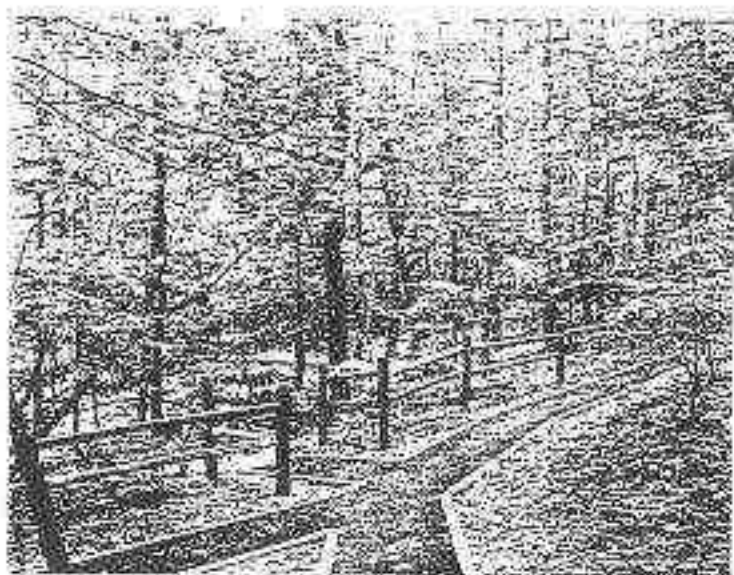
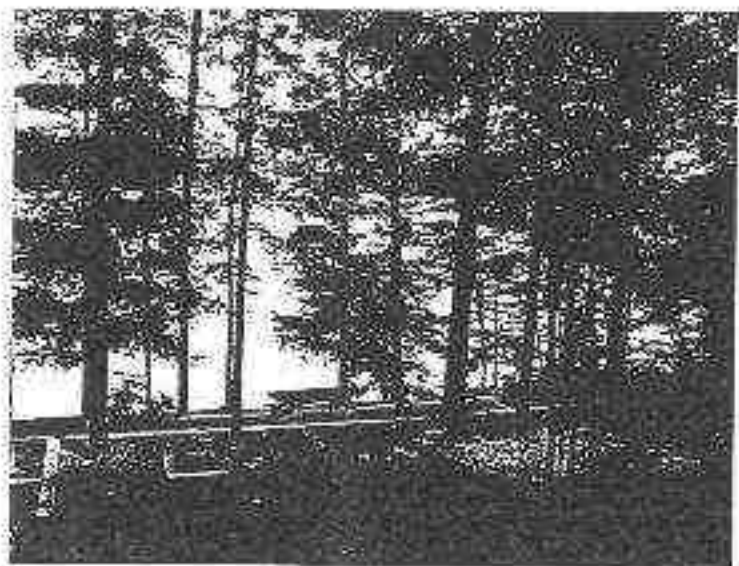

Excavator and Hydraulic Hammer for Rock Quarry Bid #01-42 Review and Evaluations of Bids Received

On May 14, 2002 bids were received for an excavator and hydraulic hammer for the Rock Quarry. Ten (10) bids were received.

Since this is a very large piece of equipment that is expected to last 15+ years, and the investment is significant, the Quarry Director and several of his staff went to view and operate machines at other locations that were the approximate size and configuration of the one the County is considering. They also asked questions of other owners with regard to serviceability, dealer support, how the machine handles, how well the machine holds up, etc. After extensive review of all the bids, the recommendation of the Quarry Director is to recommend accepting the bid from Blanchard Machinery for the Caterpillar 345 B, II, with the Caterpillar H180 Hammer for \$407,456.

Below are some of the comments from the Quarry staff regarding issues with the other machines, as well as comments from the Procurement Director with regard to meeting the bid solicitation:

Greenville Tractor Co. – Bid non-responsive. Bid bond turned in late. Bid did not include track guards, add \$10,000. Counterweight removal system is not hydraulic. Vendor is not normally authorized to sell this size machine – service/support a concern.

A.E. Finley & Assoc., Inc. – Allied Hammer did not meet specifications (impact energy and operating weight). Limited support and parts for excavator.

Midland Machinery Inc. – Bid non-responsive. Did not have hydraulic counterweight removal system. Midlands only took over Hyundai dealership in January 2002. Hyundai has very few machines this size and weight in the U. S.

Interstate Equipment Company – Bid non-responsive. No hydraulic counterweight removal system. Only 2 machines this size in the U. S. Only one mechanic on staff at Interstate to work on machine.

L. B. Smith, Inc. – Volvo just changed this line from Samsung to Volvo this year. This would be Volvo's first production year.

Liebherr Construction Equip. Co. – Bid non-responsive. Did not include bid bond.

Mitchell Distributing Co. – Tramac does not have shock absorber system that the Rammer Hammer system has. This results in more stress and fatigue to the machine.

J.W. Burris, Inc. – Tramac hammer issues same as above. Pumping system is stacked – More costly to maintain and repair.

Blanchard Machinery Inc. – Dozens of machines this size (75+) in marketplace for sale currently. Parts availability would be good. Parts made in Illinois. Blanchard has 7-10 mechanics in Greenville. Caterpillar has their hammer made specifically for them – others put different hammers on their machines.



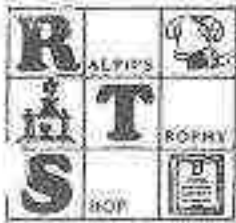

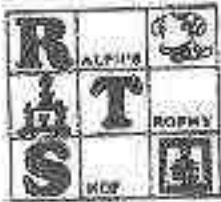

ORDINANCE 2002-**

**AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE REGULATION OF SEXUALLY
ORIENTED BUSINESSES AND EMPLOYEES.**

WHEREAS, sexually oriented businesses require special supervision from the public safety agencies of the County in order to protect and preserve the health, safety, ~~morale~~ and welfare of the patrons of such businesses as well as the citizens of the County; and

WHEREAS, the County Council finds that sexually oriented businesses are frequently used for unlawful sexual activities, including prostitution and sexual liaisons of a casual nature; and

WHEREAS, the concern over sexually transmitted diseases is a legitimate health concern of the County which demands reasonable regulation of sexually oriented businesses in order to protect the health and well-being of the citizens; and

WHEREAS, conduct regulations are a legitimate and reasonable means of accountability to ensure that operators of sexually oriented businesses comply with reasonable regulations and to ensure that operators do not knowingly allow their establishments to be used as places of illegal sexual activity or solicitation; and

WHEREAS, there is convincing documented evidence that sexually oriented businesses, because of their very nature, have a deleterious effect on both the existing businesses around them and the surrounding residential areas adjacent to them, causing increased crime and other adverse effects; and

WHEREAS, it is recognized that sexually oriented businesses, due to their nature, have serious objectionable operational characteristics, particularly when they are located in close proximity to each other, thereby contributing to urban blight and downgrading the quality of life in the adjacent area; and

WHEREAS, underage performers have been used in depictions, both in films and in live performances characterized by an emphasis on specified anatomical areas; and

WHEREAS, the County Council desires to minimize and control these adverse effects and thereby protect the health, safety, and welfare of the citizenry; protect the citizens from increased crime, preserve the quality of life, preserve the property values and character of surrounding neighborhoods and deter the spread of urban blight; and

WHEREAS, the County Council has determined that locational criteria alone do not adequately protect the health, safety, and general welfare of the people of this County; and
