MINUTES, OCONEE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING

The regular Oconee County Council Meeting was held Tuesday, April 17, 1984 at 3:00 PM in Council Chambers with all members present except Mr. Brandt who came in at 3:45 PM.

Members of the press: Mary McKenna - Greenille News, Dick Mangrum - WSNW Radio, George Allgood - WGOG Radio, David Cross -Seneca Journal.

The meeting was called to order by Supervisor-Chairman Crain who welcomed the guests and media.

The invocation was given by Mr. Harper.

Mr. Butts made a motion, seconded by Dr. Earle, approved 4-0 (Mr. Brandt absent) that the minutes of the April 3, 1984 meeting be adopted as printed.

Mr. Bob Busch, Law Enforcement Director and Mr. Wes Lothery, Mental Health Director presented the attached proposed agreement between LEC & Mental Health to Council.

At the request of Dr. Earle Mr. Busch returned to LEC to get the arrest record of the girl who attempted suicide the night before for discussion.

Dr. Earle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Butts, approved 4-0 (Mr. Brandt absent) that \$1,531.34 be taken from contingency to pay the Registration Board Members for additional work to be done up through the June primary.

Dr. Earle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Butts, approved 4-0 (Mr. Brandt absent) to take up to \$341.00 to cover salary and fringe to pay part time help for an additional two weeks in the Probate Judge's Office.

Sheriff Earl Holcombe presented the attached agreement between the Sheriff's Department & Corps of Engineers for a shore patrol up through October (weekends only). Mr. Butts made a motion, seconded by Dr. Earle, approved 4 - 0 (Mr. Brandt absent) to renew this contract.

Mr. Fant Honea, Rural Fire Director asked Council for their approval of establishing a training facility for fire fighters in Oconee County. Mr. Butts made a motion, seconded by Dr. Earle, approved 4 - 0 (Mr. Brandt absent) that Rural Fire proceed with these plans.

Due to the fact that Oconee County had advertised for a front end loader for CCS Department and had received four bids but only two of these bids met specifications Mr. Williams made a motion but it died for lack of a second to let the bids again.

After considerable discussion Mr. Butts made a motion, seconded by Dr. Earle, approved 4-1 (Mr. Williams voting against) to award the bid to Van Lott to include the attached letter with the purchase order.

At the request of Dr. Earle, Mr. Busch came before Council with the girl's record who attempted suicide the night before. There was considerable discussion concerning this girl's record and the fact that Mr. Busch did not notify anyone concerning this girl's attempted suicide.

The Health Department is presently using one half of the Dan Rankin Building as a Health Clinic. In view of the fact that Council has committed to lease all of the building beginning July 1, 1984 at a cost of \$500.00 per month Mr. Harper made a motion, seconded by Mr. Butts, approved 5 - 0 that the Health Department be allowed to go ahead and lease the other half of the building for the cost of utilities only for the remainder of this fiscal year and that \$4,030 be taken from contingency to furnish the clinic so that it can be utilized at full capacity.

Dr. Earle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Williams, approved 5 - O that no insurance carrier be allowed to present to the county employees as a group their proposal for insurance plans except that which is furnished by the county. Further that the county provide no additional payroll deduction for insurance other than that provided to all employees through the county insurance carrier.

Mr. Williams made a motion, seconded by Mr. Butts, approved 5 - 0 that the attached transfers (no new monies) be made.

Dr. Earle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Butts, approved 5-0 that Wachovia Bank & Trust of N. C. be allowed to re-issue Duke Pollution Control Bonds numbers 333 & 334 as they have been lost.

Mr. Harper made a motion, seconded by Mr. Brandt, approved 5 - O to lease to Eloise Lusk approximately thirty five acres of county farm property at \$.50 per acre through December 1984.



At the last regular meeting of the Oconee County Rural Fire Commission on April 12, 1984, it was discussed at length to establish a training facility for firefighters in Oconee County. After discussions with James Abrams, the principal of the Oconee Vocational Center, the Training Facility Committee informed the Commission that by establishing the training facility at the Oconee Vocational Center where classroom space is presently available, we would be eligible for state aid for instructors and possibly grants for other needed facilities. The Oconee County Rural Fire Commission voted unanimously to ask County Council for their approval to proceed with these plans.

After the necessary agreements have been completed between Oconee County and the Oconee County School Board, we are requesting permission to use the \$1,645 in our present training account to install a pumper test station at the facility. This pumper test station is needed to make the annual tests on our 21 fire pumpers as required by the Insurance Service Office.



- 1. The Oconee Mental Health Clinic will respond to an attempted suicide. A rapid response is preferred by the Law Enforcement Center and the Mental Health Clinic.
- The Oconee Mental Health Clinic agrees to see a mentally ill subject as soon as possible. Response time will depend on the severity of each case.
- 3. The Oconee Mental Health Clinic agrees to see an inmate who has threatened suicide, preferably during working hours.
- 4. Wes Lothery will request that the South Carolina State Hospital provide a summary to the Oconee Law Enforcement Center when an individual is returned from the South Carolina State Hospital.
- After seeing an inmate, the Oconee Mental Health Clinic will provide the Oconee Law Enforcement Center with a completed mental status form.
- 6. The Oconee Mental Health Clinic will provide Correctional Officers with additional training in the observation and reporting of the mentally disturbed.
- 7. The Oconee Mental Health Clinic will provide the Law Enforcement Center with an information check off list to be utilized when step 6 of the procedures is taking place.

PROCEDURES TO BE CARRIED OUT WHEN RESPONDING TO SUICIDE OR MENTAL EMERGENCIES AT THE OCONEE LAW ENFORCEMENT CENTER.

- The Law Enforcement staff suspects a prisoner is suicidal or mentally ill to the extent that he/she may be a danger to himself or others.
- 2. If considered necessary by the Law Enforcement Center staff, they will strip and place the subject in a stripped cell.
- 3. The Law Enforcement Center will notify the Crisis Center at 882-9912.
- 4. The Crisis Center will then notify:
 - a. Wes Lothery
 - b. Tom Alexander
 - c. Libby Woodell
 - d. Gayle Hanna
- 5. One of the above Mental Health Clinic therapist will respond by calling the Law Enforcement Center IMMEDIATELY.
- 6. The Law Enforcement Center will respond to the therapist by describing what type behavior the individual is exhibiting.
- 7. A recommendation will be made by the Mental Health Clinic as to (a) isolation, (b) placement in a stripped cell, (c) medication, (d) commitment to local or South Carolina State Hospital.
- 8. In all cases, the Mental Health Clinic staff will respond to the crisis as soon as possible by (a) recommendation of appropriate action or (b) counselling in person at the Law Enforcement Center.
- 9. A written report will be presented to the Law Enforcement Center in all cases that are seen by the Mental Health Clinic.
