MINUTES, OCONEE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING

The regular meeting of the Oconee County Council was held Tuesday, August 21, 1984 at 3:00 PM in Council Chambers with all members present.

The meeting was called to order by Supervisor-Chairman Crain who welcomed the guests and media.

The invocation was offered by Mr. Butts.

Dr. Earle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Butts, approved 5 - 0 that the minutes of the August 7, 1984 meeting be adopted as printed.

Mr. Butts made a motion, seconded by Dr. Earle, approved 5 - 0 that Ordinance 84-5, "Industrial Revenue Bonds for Steele Heddle Mfg. Co." in the amount of \$1,350,000 be adopted on third and final reading.

Mr. Harper made a motion, seconded by Mr. Butts, approved 5 - 0 that the attached bids for two boat docks be adopted.

Mr. Harper made a motion, seconded by Mr. Williams, approved 5 - 0 that the attached bid for installing tile in three bathhouses be adopted with the approval of Marine & Wildlife.

Mr. Harper made a motion, seconded by Mr. Butts, approved 5-0 to accept the bid of Amick Co. in the amount of \$75,817.06 including tax and delivery to Oconee County for a packer truck and chassis for the CCS Department.

Mr. Brandt requested a public hearing September 18, 1984 at 2:30 PM in Council Chambers on the disposition of the old Oconee County jail.

Dr. Earle requested that the Law Enforcement Director be ready to make a recommendation at the next Council Meeting concerning the uniforms for the inmates to wear.

Mr. Williams made a motion, seconded by Mr. Butts, approved 5 - 0 that \$56.00 be taken from contingency to pay for repairing the roof on the small house at the airport.

Dr. Earle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Butts, approved 5 - 0 that a full time temporary person be hired in the Clerk of Court's Office, one month in advance, to fill in for an employee who is taking a leave of absence and that if necessary, funds be taken from contingency to make up the difference in the budgeted amount for that slot.

Dr. Earle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Butts, approved 5 - 0 that Oconee County furnish 5,306 tons of gravel valued at \$16,554 for the parking lot at Tri County Tec and this value be applied toward the \$125,000 budgeted to Tri County Tec.

Mr. Crain asked the Intergovernmental Committee to make a recommendation concerning the disposition of the Lunney Museum.

RE: Bid #84-03 - Tiling Bath Houses at South Cove Park

As I discussed with you several days ago, we received no bids on the above mentioned bid on July 23, 1984. I had advertised the bid according to correct procedures and even advertised in the S. C. Business Opportunities Bulletin that is sent out statewide. I had also contacted four vendors personally, who indicated they would be submitting a bid. A list of those vendors is attached.

We I received no bids on the bid date, I tried to contact these vendors to determine why they did not bid. None returned my calls, except for Moon Brothers Tile, and they indicated that at the time we took bids they were too far behind on several jobs, they did not feel they could meet our time frame required in the bid request.

In addition I contacted two other companies here in the county; namely, Creations, Inc. and Wilburn Garrison and told them of this project. Both said they would get back to me, but neither did.

I talked with Moon Brothers, Inc. again last week at which time Mr. Moon indicated he was getting caught up on his previous obligations and would like to submit a bid on the project. Tom Widlowski and I met with him yesterday at which time he submitted the attached bid of \$10,479.00.

Last year when Mr. Widlowski was submitting his request to the state, he estimated \$9,100, based on some estimates he got at that time. However, when we made the bid request, several changes were added (e.g., contractor would rework and slope tile to drains, reseat toilets, shower stalls would also be tiled, more basing would be added). In view of these additions, Mr. Widlowski and I feel that Moon Brothers bid in acceptable.

Mr. Widlowski also informs me that he has the additional money available to cover this work in his total grant, as some of the other projects are running less than originally anticipated. I, therefore, recommend that we accept Moon Brothers bid of \$10,479.00 for this project.
