MINUTES, OCONEE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING

The regular meeting of the Oconee County Council was held September 17, 1985 at 3:00 PM in Council Chambers with all members present.

Members of the press notified (by mail): Seneca Journal, Keowee Courier, Greenville News, Anderson Independent, WGOG Radio & WSNW Radio.

Members of the press present: Randall Holcombe - Seneca Journal, Dave Partenheimer - WSNW Radio, Dale Perry - Greenville News, & Dick Mangrum - WGOG Radio.

The invocation was given by Mr. Butts.

Dr. Earle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Butts, approved 5 - 0 that the minutes of the September 3, 1985 meeting be adopted as printed.

First on the agenda was a discussion concerning the proposed Farmer's Market/Pavilion in the City of Seneca. Mr. Michael Young represented the City of Seneca, he asked Council to consider budgeting \$30,000 per year for the next three years beginning with the 1986-87 budget for this project as well as \$56,000 for site preparation. At this time Seneca City Council has not committed any funds to this project.

Mr. Dean Boggs spoke on behalf of the farmers in Oconee County, Mr. Boggs feels the structure needs to be redesigned to house more than the twenty (20) stalls for produce as there are now 326 permits that have been issued to the farmers for the selling of produce.

After considerable discussion in which some of the Council Members expressed feelings that the City of Seneca could use part of the \$100,000 tax rebate given to the city by the county for this project Mr. Crain referred this to committee.

Next Mr. Charles Murdock gave an update on the Oconee County Health Department, Seneca Clinic. The clinic now has eleven (11) staff members. The clinic now has 1500 patient records plus shot records, they also have 50-60 patients receiving home health care.

Mrs. Fay Guy, an employee of the Seneca Clinic informed Council that on a monthly basis they have 75-100 receiving family planning counseling, 350 WIC patients, 20-25 maternities per week and 170-190 patients in general clinic.

Mr. Murdock feels they will outgrow the building within three to four years, it also has a leaky roof, poor lighting, problems with heating and cooling and the floor plan is not good for a health clinic.

Mr. Butts made a motion, seconded by Mr. Dyar, approved 5-0 that Ordinance 85-7, "Industrial Revenue Bond Ordinance for Piedmont Quilting Corporation" in the amount of \$1,100,000 be adopted on third and final reading.

Dr. Earle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Butts, approved Ord. 85-8 5 - 0 that Ordinance 85-8, "An Ordinance to Adopt the Uniform Method of Collection of Delinquent Taxes" be adopted on third and final reading.

Dr. Earle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Butts, approved 5 - 0 that Ordinance 85-9, "An Ordinance Repealing Ordinance 79-22 and Abolishing the Oconee County Human Resources Commission" be adopted on second reading.

Mr. Williams made a motion, seconded by Dr. Earle, approved 5 - 0 that Mr. Williams present the following proposal to the hospital board: 1) That the ambulance owned by Oconee County and used for convalescent runs pursuant to Ordinance 80-5 be based at the hospital and the hospital use a portion of the \$125,000 given them by the county to provide Charity EMS runs for indigents 2) That Ordinance 8-05, "An Ordinance Defining Use of Non-Conforming Ambulances for Convalescent Transport" be repealed.

At the request of Mr. Bob Winchester of the Sewer Commission and Mr. Calvin Blackwell, CCS Director, Dr. Earle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Dyar, approved 5 - 0 that the fees for sludge for the Sewer Commission be the same commercial rates beginning October 1, 1985 and these fees be reviewed in six (6) months.

Mr. Butts made a motion, seconded by Mr. Dyar, approved 5 - 0 that Charles Bradley Collins be appointed to the Emergency Preparedness Commission with his term commencing immediately and expiring January 1, 1986. This is to fill the unexpired term of Mrs. Zora Barnett.

Mr. Dyar made a motion, seconded by Mr. Butts, approved 5 - 0 that Mr. Alvin Rochester be appointed to the Aeronautics Commission with his term commencing immediately and expiring January 1, 1986. This is to fill the unexpired term of Dr. Don Wiggins.

Mr. Williams made a motion, seconded by Mr. Dyar, approved 5 - 0 that the attached arts contracts be approved.

Dr. Earle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Butts, approved 5 - 0 that Mr. Thomas Alexander Campbell III be appointed to the SC Appalachian Health Council with the term commencing immediately and expiring December 1987.

Mr. Harper made a motion, seconded by Mr. Dyar, approved 5-0 that the attached transfer (no new monies) be approved.

At a previous Council Meeting, Ms. Bonnie Moses of the Election Commission had indicated that perhaps some state funds had veen mishandled that should have gone to the Registration Board. However, Mr. Crain read the attached letter from Mr. Ellisor, Executive Director, State Election Commission, stating it is obvious Oconee County spent more than the amount of funds the state has sent for voter registration and election related expenses since 1980.

Mr. Williams made a motion, seconded by Mr. Butts, approved 5-0 that the county have test(s) made to determine where the courthouse roof is leaking and what needs to be done to stop the leaking. The estimate for this is \$1,450 which would be shared 50/50 with Gulf Construction.

Mr. Williams made a motion, seconded by Dr. Earle, approved 5 - 0 that \$275 be taken from contingency to purchase two (2) calculators for the Assessor's Office. These calculators were damaged due to the leaking roof and the roofing company will reimburse the county these funds when this matter is settled.



- 5. Purchaser is required to apply $\frac{280.00}{570.00}$ as a deposit at the signing of the contract. The remainder $\frac{570.00}{5}$ is due during performance.
- 6. No performance during this engagement shall be recorded, reproduced or transmitted from the place of performance in any manner of by any means whatsoever, in the absence of a specific written agreement with COMMERCIAL MUSIC PRODUCTIONS, INC. relating to and permitting such recording, reproduction or transmission.
- 7. Cancellation by Purchaser: If for any reason not stated in paragraph 8(B) this agreement is cancelled by the Purchaser, or change of date is required, and it occurs 5 to 4 weeks prior to the performance, the purchaser agrees to pay \$\frac{285.00}{285.00}\$. If change of date of cancellation occurs 4 to 2 weeks prior to the performance date, Purchaser agrees to pay in addition to the deposit \$\frac{285.00}{285.00}\$. Cancellation within a period of 2 weeks or less prior to the performance date requires an amount to equal full payment of the contract amount.

However, if the performance is cancelled by the Purchaser within 5 weeks before the performance date and COMMERCIAL MUSIC PRODUCTIONS, INC. is able to secure a replacement booking for the above date, the Purchaser will be relieved of financial responsibility provided the booking is equal to or exceeds this contract amount. In the event that the replacement booking is less than this contract amount, the Purchaser will pay the difference upon proof of booking amount by COMMERCIAL MUSIC PRODUCTIONS, INC. The deposit will be refunded in full if cancellation occurs anytime up to 5 weeks prior to performance date. Collection expenses incurred by CMP, INC. to enforce any of the provisions of this contract will be reimbursed by Purchaser, including but not limited to attorney's fees.
