## MINUTES, OCONEE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING

The regular meeting of the Oconee County Council was held Tuesday, August 15, 1995, at 3:00 pm in Council Chambers with all Council Members (Mr. Strickland at 3:05 pm) and Mr. Jerry Fedder, Acting Attorney, present.

The meeting was called to order by Supervisor Call to -Chairman Crain who welcomed the guests and media.

Upon request of Mrs. Martha Baily, Library Director, Mr. Hamilton made a motion, seconded by Mr. Orr, approved 4 - 0 (Mr. Strickland not present) that the Library apply for the attached Title I, Project III-C; Information Resources Grant in the amount of \$5,749.40 with the local match portion of \$3,832.93.

I. RELATIONSHIP TO THE GOALS AND OBJECTIVES OF SOUTH CAROLINA'S LONG RANGE PROGRAM:

The project will support Goal V, Objective 3:

"To extend public library service to special constituencies, including the disadvantaged, the elderly, the illiterate, the unserved, and persons of limited English-speaking ability."

## II. LOCAL PROJECT SERVICE GOAL: ;

To provide library service in the form of large-print books and audiovisual materials for use by care providers in facilities for the elderly and any other areas where the elderly, people with limited English-speaking ability and the disadvantaged would benefit from these materials. They would also be available to other patrons if needed.

#### III. LOCAL PROJECT OBJECTIVES:

- To have available resources such as large-print books, books on tape, videos and language materials for use by facilities and other patrons.
- 2. To meet the needs of patrons who will not otherwise be able to take advantage of the resources by taking the resources to them.
- 3. To assist directors and managers of care-providing facilities and project areas in selecting and providing materials that will benefit their residents.
- 4. To promote reading and other skills by people who need special materials in order to be able to function as a contributing person in our society.

## IV. NEEDS ASSESSMENT:

According to the 1990 census, Oconee County's population is 57,494, of which there are 17,428 people between the ages of 55 and 85 years of age. As stated in the South Carolina Program for Library Development, 1994-1997:

"Although older citizens do not fit any stereotypical image, many do have special problems caused by physical conditions, generally lower educational attainment, decreased mobility, or economic restraints. Yet the older person's need for information and recreation remains. Libraries in South Carolina have experimented with new methods to reach this group. Using innovative techniques and programs along with traditional library materials and services should enable libraries to meet the varied informational needs of this growing population. Libraries need to work with area agencies on aging to coordinate programs to provide maximum benefit for available dollars."

These figures and statements are obvious in the care-giving facilities and retirement communities in Oconee County as well as in projects and other housing areas. These types of materials and services are becoming more and more in demand, not only in the out-reach areas of the Oconee County Library System, but also throughout the library system.

At present, we have only 2 standing orders for large print Both are for 24 books per year making a total of 48 books per year. With 14% of the Bookmobile circulation being large print books, this figure is extremely low. Large print books were 2% of our total circulation system Other large print materials are seldom ordered, wide. due to shortage of funds in our budget. All of the large print collection that is presently owned by the Oconee County Library System are books that were once part of the Bookmobile collection and have trickled back into the other Most of these books are old since branches over the years. they were purchased during the late eighties and early We have had to come back into the Central Library nineties. and take large print books from the old collection and hope that some of the patrons had not read them. This is not good policy as the bookmobile guidelines recommend that no materials of this sort be kept on the bookmobile for more than 2 years.

The large print collection is a very high circulating collection on the bookmobile and is becoming more and more necessary system wide. Currently, the library can only purchase a limited number of these book leaving the collection with a serous shortage.

As a result, patrons often read the same books again and again. If this trend continues, the patrons in the service areas will continue to suffer from an extreme lack of resources in large print resulting in low circulation and poor selection of this type materials.

### V. WHO IS TO BE SERVED:

The elderly citizens of Oconee County are our main target along with any patron who has a special need for this type material.

#### VI. ACTIVITIES TO BE USED:

Materials will be selected by the Bookmobile Manager and will be housed on the Bookmobile and distributed by the Bookmobile Manager and her staff during regular visits to facilities and communities being served by the Bookmobile.

The Bookmobile Manager will assist directors, managers and other patrons in the selection and distribution of materials as needed.

The Bookmobile Manager will inform persons concerned in this project in person, as well as through the news media, if and when the grant is approved.

## VII. WHEN AND WHERE THE PROJECT WILL BE IMPLEMENTED:

Selection will begin upon notification of grant approval. Ordering will begin in January and will be completed by the end of May. All materials will be received and invoiced by June 1, 1996.

## X. METHOD OF ADMINISTERING THE PROJECT:

The Bookmobile Manager will be responsible for planning and organizing the project. Technical Services will be involved in processing and cataloging. The Director will have supervisory responsibility for all phases of the project.

## XI. MARKETING PLAN:

The Bookmobile Manager will meet with each director/manager of the facilities to be served by the Bookmobile. Each person will be made aware of the materials that are available to them for use in their facility.

Materials will be given special places on the Bookmobile with appropriate signs designating the areas.

The local media will be contacted by the Bookmobile Manager, as well as out-of-county media sources. Interviews with newspaper columnists and editors will also be done to make the general public aware of the funding, should it be approved, and what will be done with it.

Plans are being made for publicity throughout the entire project, as different phases are finished.

## XI. EVENTUAL FINANCING:

Hopefully some of the funds can be used to meet long range goals and needs. Local funds will be available, but no further LSCA funding will be used.

### XII. METHOD OF EVALUATION:

The project will be evaluated by the Bookmobile Manager and the Library Director using the number of facilities and communities served and by circulation figures. Also, input of directors and managers of served facilities will be solicited.

Dear Mr. Crain:

As a result of the passage of the Family Independence Act for Welfare Reform, the Oconee County Department of Social Services is in need of approximately 750 square feet of office space. It is very important this space be adjacent to our current buillding as it will be used to train welfare recipients so they can obtain gainful employment and get off welfare.

I will request 100% state and federal funding to remodel one of the bay areas adjacent to our building for this purpose. At the least, it should be cost expended with federal reimbursement coming to the county at a rate of up to 25/75.

Also, once the Oconee County Department of Social Services occupies the needed extra space, the amount of federal funds returned to the county will increase for all space occupied related to the Family Independence Act.

We need to be in this space by January 1, 1996.


