The meeting was called to order by Supervisor - Chairman Orr who welcomed the guests and media.

The invocation was given by Mrs. Hughes.

Mrs. Hughes, Chairperson, Purchasing, Contracting, Real Estate, Building & Grounds Committee, informed Council it was the recommendation of the committee that due to possible legal problems the county not give a local vendor preference and that the county proceed with a Request for Information for a computer consultant to study the present computer systems in the county and give the county an estimate for a system that would give the county departments the ability to "e" mail each other as well as access the Division of General Services. This recommendation was adopted 4 - 1 (Mr. Hamilton voting against).

Mr. Thomas, Chairperson, Roads & Transportation Committee, informed Council the committee had had their second meeting, it was the goal of the committee to pave roadways to get citizens out of the mud and to develop a plan that give people who buy lots in subdivisions assurance that the developer would pave the roadways to county specifications and not leave them with the idea the roadway would be accepted by the county, when in fact they would not be county roadways. One of the ways this could be accomplished would be for the developer to put up a bond when the plat and covenants and restrictions are recorded at the courthouse.

Upon Mr. Timms inquiry, Mr. Orr assigned to the Personnel & Intergovernmental Committee the possibility of the county receiving proceeds from the video poker machines in the county.

The Personnel & Intergovernmental Committee scheduled a meeting Tuesday, February 11, 1997 at 6:00 pm in Council Chambers for the purpose of continuing the discussion regarding persons who request to be notified of all Council Meetings, to be placed on the agenda whether they choose to speak or not as well as proceeds from the poker machines.

DEMOGRAPHIC/ATTENDANCE INFORMATION

This event has been held previously and has attracted 500 participants each time. These participants come from as far away as Massachusetts and Florida (please see attached list furnished by Jerry Rhyne - the actual addresses are considered confidential so he only supplied us with the state that the participants are from). In addition to the actual participants, numerous individuals who follow professional fishing also attend the weighin of the tournament each day (these individuals come from the local area and do not require hotel accommodations). You'll also find attached a letter from the Days Inn of Seneca who informed us that all motels in the area are full with participants the week of the tournament. They have also included the states where their guests are from during the tournament week. 

The meeting was called to order at 5:04pm by Chairperson Hesterberg.

Minutes of the last meeting were distributed, motion by Cappiello to accept as written, seconded by Simpson, motion carried.

Hesterberg reported that the budget that was submitted to County Council was approved. The only change in the 1996-97 budget, as compared to the 1995-96 budget, was an increase for the Oconee Community Theatre's building fund from \$2,000 to \$5,000.

- Hesterberg presented the following three requests for funding:
 - (1) The Oconee Community Theatre requested assistance with their Youth Theatre Program. Theatre classes for Oconee County Students in grades 4-8 are now being held on Tuesdays for beginners and Thursdays for advanced students. The Theatre currently has 10 students that need financial assistance to attend these classes. Also, due to a decrease in funding from the SC Arts Commission, help is needed with the operating expenses. A letter was received from Sybil Miller, the Youth Theatre coordinator, requesting a \$1,000 grant from the OCA&HC.
 - (2) Chris McPhail with the Greater Seneca Chamber of Commerce requested help for Oconee Country Christmas on Saturday November 9, 1996. They have two bands performing at the festival, 4-Of-A-Kind and the Bad Creek Band. Ms. McPhail was requesting \$500.00 to cover the cost of the Bad Creek Band.
 - (3) Blue Ridge Art Council requested \$3,000 to assist with the Arts in Education (AIE) program that they administer in conjuntion with the Oconee County School System. This program funds arts workshops for all county schools.

Cappiello moved that all three of these requests be approved and funded out of the Performance Funds, McCord seconded, motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:24pm.
