MINUTES, SPECIAL MEETING, OCONEE COUNTY COUNCIL

The Oconee County Council held a special meeting Tuesday, May 30, 2000 at 3:00 PM with all Council Members and the County Attorney present.

Call to Order:

The meeting was called to order by Supervisor-Chairman Orr who welcomed those present.

Public Hearing Ordinance 2000-07:

The first item on the agenda was a public hearing to receive written and/or oral comments regarding Ordinance 2000-07, "2000-01 OCONEE COUNTY BUDGET ORDINANCE".

Mr. Garry Freeman, Budget Analyst, informed those present that the total budget is \$74,763,170, which is a 3.77% change and reflects a total of 207.3 mills to fund.

He further informed those present that Mr. Kenneth Williams, County Auditor has estimated a 4.3 mill increase for school operational.

Mr. B. J. Littleton addressed Council expressing concerning regarding school expenses and county operational funds be reduced, he further stated that state mandate salary increases do not have to be complied with.

There were no written statements regarding the ordinance presented to Council

Road Department Storage Building:

Mr. Thomas made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hamilton, approved 4-1 (Mr. Timms voting against) that the bid for the design/build of the storage building for the Road Department be awarded to Brantley Construction Co., Inc. at a total cost of \$87,813 with \$9,813 coming from contingency as the low bid was over budget. Brantley Construction Company, Inc. is pleased to have the opportunity to offer the following bid for the Heavy Equipment Storage Building. We have included all Design/Build work as required by your bid package for this project. More specifically as detailed below:

- All concrete foundation work to include footings, piers to support pre-engineered metal building loads as required by the standard building code. 6" reinforced concrete 3000 PSI slab on grade for the shop area. Crushed stone for remainder of building area to be by Oconee County.
- Furnish and erection of steel building. Building will be 60' wide, 100' long, and 24'-8" eave height for a 24' eave clear height, 4 bays @ 25' Roof to be sheeted with 26 gauge 20 year zinc aluminum. Walls to be sheeted at shop area only full height, these panels to be painted 26 gauge steel.
- Shop area to be constructed with 8' masonry block, cells to be reinforced with #5 rebar 32" on center. Remaining cells to be filled with insulation, walls to be 10' high for 10' ceiling. Ceiling will be wood framed, covered with ¾" T & G plywood for storage above shop. Ceiling to be drywall. Ceiling will have 4 2 tube 4' fluorescent light fixtures, 4 each 115 volt duplex electrical receptacles and two 220 volt receptacles, one on inside wall of shop and one on outside wall of shop. one 7.5 KW electric wall mounted heater with thermostat. Ceiling above drywall will be insulated with 6" batt insulation. Shop will have a pair of 3-0/7-0 hollow metal doors for a 6-0/7-0 opening. Doors will have lockset, closure and weather stripping, one 3-0/3-0 window will be provided.
- Electrical in addition to shop will include 200 amp service, 1-2 tube 8' fluorescent light for each 400 square feet of roof area. 1-115 volt duplex receptacle on each building column.

- All design work for foundation, metal building, shop area and electrical will be designed by a registered South Carolina Professional Engineer.
- We have received Addendum Number 1.






OCQUEE COUNTY HEAVY EQUIP. STORAGE SHOP







ELEVATION #1


OF NEE COUNTY HEAVY EQUIP. STORAGE SHOP
