MINUTES, OCONEE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING

The Oconee County Council met Tuesday, June 6, 2000 at 7:00 PM in Council Chambers, 415 South Pine Street, Walhalla, SC with all Council Members and the County Attorney present.

Press:

Members of the press notified (by mail): Keowee Courier, Westminster News, Anderson Independent, WGOG Radio, & WPEK Radio, Journal/Tribune.

Members of the press present: Dick Mangrum – WGOG Radio, Dave Williams – Anderson Independent, & Katherine Hunter – Journal/Tribune.

Call to Order:

The meeting was called to order by Supervisor-Chairman Orr who welcomed the guests and media.

Invocation:

The invocation was given by Mrs. Hughes.

Minutes:

Mr. Hall made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Hughes, approved 4-0 (Mr. Hamilton abstaining due to his being absent from the May 16 meeting) that the minutes of the regular meeting held May 16, 2000 and special meeting held May 30, 2000 be adopted as printed.

Public Comment Session:

Ms. Mary Ashley addressed Council regarding the paving of the roadways in Timberlake Subdivision, she informed Council they had been trying to get the roadways paved for fifteen years and the residents want to know when the roads will be paved.

Mr. B. J. Littleton stated he would have to defend Council on the roads. Mr. Littleton again asked that Council adopt a resolution urging the state legislature to adopt a law requiring surveyors to notify adjoining property owners when surveying adjoining properties.

Public Comment Session Continued:

Mr. Littleton further commented on the invocation at the beginning of each Council Meeting and asked if anyone knew if Oconee Memorial Hospital is selling fetus.

Sewer Commission Budget:

Upon recommendation of Mr. Robert Winchester, Superintendent & Mr. Howard Adams, Chairman, Oconee County Sewer Commission, Mr. Hamilton made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Hughes, approved 5-0 that the attached Sewer Commission Budget for fiscal year 2000-01 be adopted.

Further, the county has no right to close the docks as they belong to Duke Power Company.

Please note that:

- A) The total budget is down \$1,546,361 overall, below the 1999-00 approved budget.

- C) The Contingency Fund will remain at \$95,000 for 2000-2001.
- D) The user fee to the cities is projected to decrease by \$9,241 for 2000-2001.

Re: Request For Opinion

Dear Bob:

This letter is in response to your request for a written opinion concerning whether or not the Sewer Commission is authorized to make reappropriations between line items in order to keep line items from exceeding their allocated amounts.

Your attention is invited to oconee County Ordinance No. 78-2, which provides for the creation of the Oconee County sewer Commission. Section 5(b) of this Ordinance states that "the Commission shall be charged with the responsibility of operating the facilities of the Oconee County Wastewater Treatment Program." This section goes on to state that "the Commission shall prepare or cause to be prepared, annually, a budget for the operation of the facilities and of the program, and shall provide Oconee County Council and each of the major users with a copy of such proposed budget in compliance with the contract entered into between the County and the three municipal major users. The Commission will hire the necessary personnel to operate the system, PROVIDED, HOWEVER, all acts of the Commission contractually binding on Oconee County and involving the expenditure of funds and the hiring of personnel shall be subject to review and approval by Oconee County Council.

Enclosed please find a copy of the relevant portions of the Minutes of the October 5, 1993 Meeting of the Oconee County Council which indicates that the Oconee County Council, by a vote of four to one approved the request of the Sewer Commission that the Commission be given authorization to transfer money from the contingency fund within the Sewer Commission Budget when needed and that the Commission be given the authorization to make reappropriations between line items in order to keep line items from exceeding their allocated amounts.

In this regard, inasmuch as the County Council has reviewed and approved the request, I have no objection to the Commission making reappropriations between line items in order to keep line items from exceeding their allocated amounts. However, any changes in the budget must be sent to the Oconee County Council and should also be sent to the Municipalities.

The approval by Council may only apply to the particular budget year in question, which I understand is fiscal year 1993-1994, therefore authorization for such transfer would only extend to that particular budget.

I trust this information sufficiently addresses your inquiry, however if additional information is needed, please do not hesitate to call upon me.

WHEREAS, Section 6(D) of said Ordinance states: "The Grantee shall maintain, and by its acceptance of this Franchise specifically agrees to maintain throughout the term of this Franchise a surety bond from a reputable company to the County in the amount of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000) conditioned that the Grantee shall well and truly observe, fulfill and perform each term and condition of this Franchise and that in the case of any breach of condition, then there shall be recoverable, jointly and severally from the principal and surety, any damage or loss or costs suffered or incurred by the County as a result thereof, including lost revenues of the County approximately resulting from the failure to well and faithfully observe and perform any provision of this Franchise. The Grantee may be released from the within obligation to maintain a surety bond by approval of the County Council by resolution after a period of three (3) years upon reasonable proof to said Council that performance has been completed. Such termination shall not be unreasonably withheld."

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THIS DATE, that the Oconee County Council, with a quorum present and voting does hereby adopt this Resolution waiving the surety bond requirement as requested by Northland Cable Television.

Thoughts on the Water Festival Boat Races

In February, we unanimously approved an ATAX Commission request to approve funds for the boat races proposed by the Seneca Chamber of Commerce. We have approved ATAX recommendations routinely over the years, without controversy, as investments to promote local tourism.

Maybe we should have seen the potential for the current controversy, but we didn't. Opposition from lake-shore residents and others has raised concerns that the races may cause such things as shoreline damage, adding to the litter problem and ruining the peace and quiet of residents.

On the other hand, with our February approval of ATAX funds, the Seneca Chamber of Commerce went ahead with their Water Festival plans, and proceeded to make boat race commitments that if broken will raise concerns about the financial viability of the entire event.

I understand and sympathize with the concerns on both sides, but I have not seen enough evidence from either side to make an obvious decision. This being the case, I think a reasonable course of action is:

- Our original approval of ATAX funds should be allowed to stand and the boat races should be allowed to proceed, on a one-time trial basis, and with the condition that the Chamber of Commerce agree to provide us with a full report on the results and impacts of the event, including independent input from neighboring residents.
- To ensure better decisions in the future, I am proposing that we develop and adopt a county ordinance that sets up a formal application and approval process for any public or private boating event to be based at a county park, and which includes provision for a formal public hearing before any application can be approved or denied by County Council.
- Before 1997, ATAX proposals involving county park uses were always reviewed by the PRT Commission. Its members all resigned when our Supervisor eliminated the Parks Director position. We need to refill the Parks Director position and reinstate the PRT Commission, which will also help avoid future surprises.

I am personally committed both to maintaining the quality of life on Lake Keowee and to allowing reasonable recreational use. It's not always easy to strike the proper balance, but I will always do my best.

Enclosed is your copy of the FY 2001 HMEP Grant Application Package. The federally sponsored HMEP grant program forms the funding basis for HazMat training classes held in county locations, Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) Planning Grant awards, and Training Grants for county HazMat self-training.

As in past years, the process requires completing the enclosed application package and submitting it to SCEPD by the stated deadline if you desire to participate in the program. Those applications received by June 12, 2000, will receive consideration for full funding. Any applications received after this date will be considered only after all previous requests have been funded.

Changes for this year include:

- 1.) We expect a 48% increase in grant funding which will enable a greater number of Special Project and HazMat training request approvals.
- 2.) We are deleting the Program Implementation sub-program of the Planning Grant section. This \$300.00 stipend was originally intended as "seed money" to encourage dormant LEPCs to reactivate, or to provide funds for LEPC postage, supplies, etc. These funds will be available in the Special Projects portion of the grant.

- 3.) In the past there have been isolated cases where LEPCs had projects approved, but failed to obligate any funds during the grant cycle. This resulted in those funds being returned to US DOT, thereby rendering them unavailable to another deserving LEPC. Any LEPC failing to fully obligate funds for their approved projects will receive lowest funding priority for the next grant cycle.
- 4.) Please insure LEPC obligated funds are applied against approved projects / items. Such actions as purchasing HazMat Team supplies and operational equipment, cable television for the EOC, emergency lights for response vehicles, etc., violates the intent as well as the legal basis of the grant. Therefore, SCEPD will not honor such obligations with HMEP funds. These will be examined on a case by case basis.

This is your county's opportunity to provide valuable Hazardous Materials training for your emergency responders and receive funding for hazardous materials related projects/programs which will enhance your county's HazMat capability. Please review, complete, and submit this package by June 12, 2000, to assure your county's participation. Fax copies are welcome. I. INTRODUCTION

Since 1987, emergency planning has been required under a Federal law entitled the "Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act," sometimes called EPCRA or Title III of the Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act (SARA).

Every South Carolina county established a "Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC)" to undertake the emergency planning process and all completed at least an initial emergency plan. Many LEPCs have not been able to maintain their planning process to the extent needed to be fully prepared for all types of hazardous materials emergencies. They have not had adequate financial and technical resources to undertake the detailed data gathering, analysis, and planning needed to ensure adequate preparedness for hazardous materials emergencies. EPCRA emphasizes planning for facilities using hazardous materials but few LEPCs have been able to completely plan for emergencies involving transportation of hazardous materials.

The Hazardous Materials Transportation Act (HMTA), as amended by the Hazardous Materials Transportation Uniform Safety Act of 1990 (HMTUSA), was enacted by the Federal government to improve the emergency planning and emergency response training that is to be done under EPCRA. Specifically, this legislation established a reimbursable grant program that would be funded by fees collected from shippers and carriers of certain hazardous materials. The annual grant program was authorized to run through fiscal year 1999, but U.S. Department of Transportation has received an extension to continue it beyond that initial authorization. During the first annual budget period, the program was known as the HMTUSA Grant Program. For the second budget period, it was renamed the HMTA Grant Program, and since the third budget period it has been named the Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness (HMEP) Grant Program. The upcoming budget period will run from October 1, 2000 through September 30, 2001. The grant program is divided into two sub-programs, planning and training. Through the program, LEPCs in South Carolina have an opportunity to obtain financial and technical resources to help renew or enhance their planning process and training activities. Funds are made available on an 80/20 match basis. (Matching funds can be either a hard or soft match.) This booklet explains how these planning and training grants can be used by LEPCs and provides the necessary forms to use when applying for grant funds.

In South Carolina, the HMEP Grant Program is managed by the Emergency Preparedness Division. To give all LEPCs an equal chance to have their projects funded, applications must be received by the Division no later than JUNE 12, 2000. Applications received after that date will be considered on a first come, first served basis only as long as funds are available.

II. PLANNING GRANTS

Planning grants can only be awarded to and be used effectively by LEPCs that are actively attempting to complete their responsibilities under EPCRA. Some LEPCs within the State are more active than others and in the past have received the bulk of the grant funding. Any LEPC that applies for a planning grant and is making a good faith effort to revive/expand its planning program will be considered for funding.

Beginning this grant cycle, the Program Implementation Grant will be discontinued. The intent of that sub-program was to provide "seed money" to any dormant LEPC to encourage re-activation, or to provide a stipend of no more than \$300.00 for active LEPCs to purchase postage, office supplies, etc. Low demand over the past several years has caused this program to lapse. Funds originally earmarked for this area are available in the Special Project portion of this grant program.

LEPCs may propose SPECIAL PROJECT GRANTS to complete or enhance their EPCRA planning. Examples of eligible activities include: 1) Development, improvement, and implementation of emergency plans required under EPCRA, as well as exercises which test the emergency plan; 2) An assessment to determine flow patterns of hazardous materials within a State or between a State and another State; 3) An assessment of the need for a regional hazmat emergency response team; 4) An assessment of local response capabilities: 5) Conduct of emergency response drills and exercises associated with emergency preparedness plans; 6) Provision of technical staff to support the planning effort; 7) Purchase and distribution of HazMat oriented public outreach materials; or 8) Additional activities deemed appropriate and approved by the Grant Administrator. SPECIAL PROJECT GRANTS will be provided for a one year period. NORMALLY, NO EQUIPMENT MAY BE PURCHASED UNDER THIS GRANT OTHER THAN HAZMAT EXERCISE SUPPORT ITEMS. Planning grant funds awarded to LEPCs must be obligated by July 31. 2001, be used for the applied project only, or funds will be returned to EPD to be used for a community awareness project. Also, any LEPC failing to fully obligate funds will receive low funding priority for the next grant cycle.

Attachment P-1 gives examples of projects that could be funded under HMEP Planning Grants. Attachment P-4 gives examples of costs that can be used as a soft match to satisfy the 20% local match requirement.

A SERC/EPD Grant Committee will select LEPCs for Special Projects Grants based on criteria designed to ensure that the projects most needed and beneficial to the state as a whole will be undertaken. Rating criteria include; Impact, Joint Benefit, Priority, Timing, and Cost Effectiveness.

III. PLANNING GRANT APPLICATION PROCEDURES

In South Carolina, an LEPC may not receive funds directly from the State; however, a county government can. Therefore, the Emergency Preparedness Division will accept applications for planning grants from the LEPC, but will award funds to the respective county government. If the grant application is approved, the county emergency preparedness coordinator/director will be both the grant representative of the LEPC, and the person directly accountable for the expenditure of the grant funds.

The LEPC and the county coordinator/director should work together to determine which projects qualify for grant funding. Only active LEPCs and LEPCs making a good faith effort to revive/expand their programs are eligible to receive grant funding. For Special Project Grants, complete and submit Attachments P-2 and P-3. LEPCs may request funding FOR ONE OR MORE Special Projects. Submit a separate Attachment P-3 for EACH Special Project.

More than one LEPC can cooperate to conduct a joint planning project. The emergency management coordinator/director from one of the counties involved must assume the complete responsibility for the application and the expenditure of the grant funds.

The application forms should be completed as fully as possible. Assistance with project selection, form completion, or additional reference material is available from your EPD Area Coordinator and/or the HazMat Program Manager. The list of example projects in Attachment P-1 may be helpful.

Applications received by JUNE 12, 2000 will be considered on an equal basis. Applications received after that date will be considered on a first come, first served basis, as long as funds are available.

IV. TRAINING GRANTS

HMEP HazMat training has been conducted successfully by the S.C. Fire Academy since January 1994 in an on-going program of courses. The list of available courses has been modified from time-to-time. The current list of courses is at Attachment T-2.

Training requested from the S.C. Fire Academy will be presented at the location designated by the LEPC. The only requirements of the LEPC are to provide the facility for the training and a guarantee of at least 15 students per class. Courses will not be HELD IF THERE ARE LESS THAN 15 STUDENTS

THE HMEP GRANT APPLICATION PACKAGE

PRESENT FOR THE TRAINING. If you can not get sufficient students from your own county, you may be able to find additional students in neighboring counties.

In addition, counties may conduct their own training with qualified instructors. Again, <u>COURSES</u> WILL NOT BE APPROVED FOR FUNDING IF THERE ARE LESS THAN 15 STUDENTS PRESENT FOR THE TRAINING.

Both methods are encouraged and will be continued. In either case, an 80/20 match is required. Salaries of non-State employee students will usually satisfy the matching requirement. All courses approved for funding are subject to monitoring by SCEPD to ensure quality control of training. LEPCs that request courses that end up being canceled due to insufficient numbers of students risk having lower priority for future funding.

V. TRAINING GRANT APPLICATION PROCEDURES

Complete and submit Attachment T-1 for training requested from the S.C. Fire Academy. Please list at least two preferred dates for each course requested.

LEPCs may request self-training if they have the facility, instructor, and course materials necessary to conduct the course, or are willing to make all necessary arrangements. Reimbursement will normally be limited to the amount normally charged by the Fire Academy for the same course. Any requests for the International Society of Fire Service Instructors (ISFSI) courses must be handled as self-training. Complete and submit Attachment T-3 for any self-training being requested.

Although most of the training courses are geared toward the fire service, we urge all LEPCs to include law enforcement and medical responders, as well as emergency management staff and public officials in their hazmat awareness and operations level training program. EPD will give priority to requests which include a more varied student audience.



- B) After a bid award, the Purchasing Department shall have no authority to issue change orders to the purchase order/contract in an amount to exceed \$20,000 or twenty percent (20%) of the original award amount, whichever is the lesser amount, without the approval of County Council

SECTION II:

All other terms and provisions of Ordinance 85-2, as amended by Ordinance 98-7 not modified directly or by implication shall likewise remain in full force and effect.

SECTION III:

If any portion of this ordinance shall be held to be invalid by a Court of Competent Jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed severable and such finding shall not affect the remaining portions of this ordinance.





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
