#### **Discussion Regarding Action Items**

### Council consideration of funding in an amount not to exceed \$2,000,000 in for the anticipated increase of construction costs related to the completion of Sewer South

Mr. Elliott noted that the original estimate of the Sewer South Project has increased due to the increase in construction costs.

Mr. Elliott made a motion, seconded by Mr. Davis, to direct County Attorney to draft an ordinance appropriating ARPA funds in an amount not to exceed \$2,000,000 for the anticipated increase of construction costs related to the completion of Sewer South.

Mr. Davis offered comments in support of the Sewer South Project.

Mr. Cain noted that he is in favor of this project but it is frustrating that this project has taken so long and now is incurring a cost increase.

Mr. Hart commented he was at the pre-construction conference for Sewer South and there were 5 contractors in attendance that were gathering information to submit bids.

## Council consideration and approval to authorize the Administrator to waive Oconee County Encroachment Permit fees in the amount of \$1,426.50 for the City of Westminster to assist the City in its municipal water system upgrades

The USDA-RD approved \$8,705,000 to the City of Westminster for the upgrades to existing lines to include 33,200 linear feet (LF), 10", 42,200 LF 8", and 10,800 LF 6", throughout the City's water distribution system. A 40,000-gallon ground storage tank will be replaced with a 250,000-gallon ground tank. These improvements will increase access to City water, improve water flow to areas with low water flow, loop water lines which will increase water delivery reliability, replace lines that have maintenance issues, add a new water tank to provide better water pressure, along with other benefits to the customers.

The City is currently performing due diligence as to begin the project as soon as possible. The city's consulting engineer, the Rosier Group, worked with Oconee County Roads and Bridges department to ensure correctness. The fees for the three permits are \$665.00, \$557.50, and \$207.00 totaling **\$1,426.50**. The waiver of these fees serves and benefits the impacted residents of Oconee County.

It is staff's recommendation that Council authorize the County Administrator to waive Oconee County Encroachment Permit fees in the amount of \$1,426.50 for the City of Westminster to assist the City in its municipal water system upgrades.

Mr. Davis made a motion, seconded by Mr. Cain, to authorize the County Administrator to waive Oconee County Encroachment Permit fees in the amount of \$1,426.50 for the City of Westminster to assist the City in its municipal water system upgrades.

Mr. Davis noted he is in favor of authorizing the Administrator to waive encroachment fees for all municipalities up to \$5000 going forward.

Mr. Hart questioned the request for a right-of-way on Dinky Line Road, noting that Council just voted in favor of the abandonment of this road.

Ms. Brock stated that she had made note of the right-of-way request on Dinky Line Road and informed Council that Kevin Bronson, City of Westminster Administrator, was unable to attend tonight but this topic was previously brought to his attention.

Mr. Davis noted to Mr. Hart that the roads in question are Dinky Line Road and Thornburg Road.

Motion approved 4 - 0.

Short discussion followed regarding the best way to include giving the County Administrator the authority to waive encroachment fees for all municipalities up to \$5000 going forward.

This Asphalt and Striping contract consists of furnishing all labor, materials and equipment needed to pave and stripe two projects for Parks, Recreation, and Tourism (PRT).

- 1. **High Falls:** Near the swim beach is a new shelter with concession booth. The new asphalt will be attaching the new building to the existing asphalt access road. The existing paving was demolished to build the new building and the gravel is not ADA accessible. The paved area will consist of two handicap spaces and two unloading vehicle spaces.
- 2. **Mullins Ford:** At the boat landing of Mullins Ford is an existing paved area for boat trailers to back down the ramp. The pavement has deteriorated past safe usage. The design of the new paving in front of the ramp has been changed to make for easier backing. The existing asphalt in front of the landing will be removed and graded for new asphalt.
  - The existing ditch around the new paved area will need to be regraded and riprapped. This has been approved by Corps of Engineers.

On September 6, 2022, formal sealed bids were opened for this project. This bid was originally sent to thirty-six (36) bidders. One bid was received from Hubbard Paving & Grading of Walhalla, SC in the amount of \$87,790.00. A 10% contingency, in the amount of \$8,779.00, is requested to account for unforeseen items that may arise.

On August 19, 2021, the Oconee County PRT Commission approved \$47,700.00 to be used from local ATAX funds for the paving projects referenced above. County Council approved on September 7, 2021. Due to the volatile market of asphalt mix materials, the price has increased since the original amount was approved. PRT Staff is requesting approval of an additional \$48,869.00 to be used from local ATAX funds for the paving projects mentioned above.

#### It is the staff's recommendation that Council:

- 1. Approve the award of ITB 22-05 Rebid to Hubbard Paving & Grading, Inc. of Walhalla, SC in the amount of \$87,790.00, plus a 10% contingency in the amount of \$8,779.00, for a total award of \$96,569.00.
- 2. Approve an additional \$48,869.00 from local ATAX funds to be used for this project.
- 3. Authorize the County Administrator to approve any change orders within the contingency amount.

Title: 2022 Hyundai Wheel Loader Department: Rock Quarry

Procurement was approved by Council in Fiscal Year 2022-2023 budget process. Budget: \$359,963.00 Project Cost: \$359,963.00 Balance: \$0.00

This Wheel Loader is a 2022 Hyundai HL980A. Its main use will be used in the yard to load customer's trucks. This loader will enable the Rock Quarry staff to load customer dump trucks in a timely fashion. This machine will have a scale on the bucket, which will provide more accuracy in amount of product loaded.

National Equipment Dealers allowed Rock Quarry Staff to demo this piece of equipment for 3 days to ensure it will meet the needs and requirements of the Rock Quarry. After demo and researching the necessary horse power and operating weights of a two pass Wheel Yard Loader that can safely handle a 7.3 cubic yard bucket, it was determined that the 2022 Hyundai HL980A, will best meet the needs of the Oconee Quarry.

The County is utilizing the North Carolina Sheriffs' Association contract through a cooperative purchasing agreement. The contract discount is 6% off the list price of the equipment and 10% off the list price of attachments. National Equipment Dealers (dba: May/RHI) is also offering an additional dealer discount of \$7,714.78 off of the contract price for this wheel loader.

National Equipment Dealers (dba: May/RHI) holds the North Carolina Sheriffs' Association contract for the Hyundai HL980A Wheel Loader. The North Carolina Sheriff's Association contract allows all County and City Government Agencies to purchase, from this contract, directly from the awarded vendors.

It is the staff's recommendation that Council approve the purchase of the Hyundai HL980A Wheel Loader from National Equipment Dealers (dba: May/RHI) of Columbia, SC in the amount of \$359,963.00.

Procurement was approved by Council in Fiscal Year 2022-2023 budget process. Budget: \$214,373.50 Project Cost: \$214,373.50 Balance: \$0.00

This purchase is for a Steel Conveyor system that will integrate with Solid Waste's new Harris baler. The existing conveyor system was prefabricated in 1996 by Process Solutions of North Charleston, who is no longer in business. Therefore, staff cannot get parts to repair and this conveyor has exceeded its useful life. County Staff has maintained and repaired the best they could, but it is now past being repaired. The rubber belts can no longer be adjusted to keep them in the correct position for the conveyor to operate properly. Due to the age and condition of the current conveyor, the rubber belts are replaced, on average, every 3 years at a cost of nearly \$9,000. This conveyor is stationed in huge pit, which is considered a confined space. This conveyor requires cleaning and maintenance every 1-2 months. In order to clean and conduct maintenance, it requires one or two Solid Waste operators working in the pit and additional staff standing watch above the pit. Per OSHA, staff working in the pit are required to have confined space training. By purchasing this new

conveyor, this requirement will no longer be necessary.

The Steel Conveyor metal belt system has a typical belt life of at least 15 years and can last as long as 20 year depending on types of materials that are loaded on them. The current 8 ft. pit would be reduced to 3-4 ft. and would no longer be considered a confined space. This would reduce the training and number of employees required to clean and conduct maintenance. Also, the incline and height of the conveyor is designed to be a perfect match with the new baler.

At the June 21, 2022 County Council meeting, the purchase of a Two-Ram Baler to Crigler Enterprises, Inc. of Mableton, GA was approved. This purchase is for a conveyor that will feed this Baler. Staff is requesting this Sole Source purchase from Crigler Enterprises of Mableton, GA, based on:

- 1. Crigler Enterprises, Inc. was awarded ITB 21-18 for the Two-Ram Baler Purchase.
- 2. Crigler Enterprises, Inc. is the authorized Dealer / Service Center for Harris Balers and Hustler Conveyors for Oconee County.
- 3. Crigler Enterprises, Inc. will install, provide warranty and maintain the baler along with this conveyor, if approved.
- 4. Solid Waste would have one company to contact for all issues (warranty, maintenance, etc.) for both pieces of equipment.
- 5. The Hustler Conveyor is fully compatible with the Harris Baler.
- 6. The starter and controls for the conveyor will be located the baler panel; therefore, it is important that the baler and conveyor be installed and maintained by the same company.

#### It is the staff's recommendation that Council approve:

- 1. Approve the purchase of the Hustler 60" Wide Conveyor from Crigler Enterprises, Inc. of Mableton, GA in the amount of \$194,885.00, plus a 10% contingency in the amount of \$19,488.50, for a total award of \$214,373.50.
- 2. Authorized the County Administrator to approve any change orders within the contingency amount.

Mr. Cain made a motion, seconded by Mr. Davis to approve the purchase of the Hustler 60" Wide Conveyor from Crigler Enterprises, Inc. of Mableton, GA in the amount of \$194,885.00, plus a 10% contingency in the amount of \$19,488.50, for a total award of \$214,373.50 and authorize the County Administrator to approve any change orders within the contingency amount.

Mr. Hart inquired as to why this request has a contingency amount while the previous equipment requests from tonight did not have a contingency amount.

Ms. Brock and Procurement Director, Tronda Popham, provided an explanation for Mr. Hart as to why the request for a Hustler 60" Wide Conveyor has a contingency amount.

Solid Waste has a 2016 Bomag Refuse Soil Compactor that is used in the landfill to move material and compact debris. This piece of equipment was damaged on September 6, 2022 and is in need of repair. Staff is requesting a contingency of \$20,000.00 to cover any unforeseen issues that arise during the repair. This repair has been filed with the Insurance Reserve Fund (County Insurance). Linder Industrial Machinery of Greer, SC is the Authorized dealer and repair center for Bomag Equipment.

It is the staff's recommendation that Council:

- 1. Approve the repair of the Bomag Refuse Compactor in the estimated amount of \$74,433.97 plus \$20,000.00 contingency for a total amount of \$94,433.97 to Linder Industrial Machinery of Greer, SC.
- 2. Authorize the County Administrator to approve and sign any change orders within the contingency amount.

Mr. Cain made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hart, to approve the repair of the Bomag Refuse Compactor in the estimated amount of \$74,433.97 plus \$20,000.00 contingency for a total amount of \$94,433.97 to Linder Industrial Machinery of Greer, SC and to authorize the County Administrator to approve and sign any change orders within the contingency amount.

Mr. Davis inquired if there was a potential for a refund after filing insurance related to the above request.

Ms. Brock responded that there is a potential for a refund after filing an insurance, but meanwhile the landfill desperately needs this piece of equipment to be in working order.

Ms. Brock also offered Mr. Hart and Council an explanation as to why the contingency amount for this request is so large.

Motion approved 4 - 0.

At the April 19, 2022 Council meeting, Council approved the award of RFP 21-14 to Smith Gardner, Inc., for Engineering Services for Solid Waste with the option to extend the contract for four (4) consecutive one (1) year terms. At the July 19, 2022 Council meeting, Council approved to contract with Smith Gardner to provide engineering services for groundwater and stream water sampling and monitoring at the Seneca and Five Forks landfills; and the required analysis and submission of annual reports to SCDHEC.

The additional wells are needed to better understand groundwater quality in nearby creeks and will aid in assessing the mitigating effects of ongoing remedial efforts of groundwater impacts.

It is the staff's recommendation that Council approve the installation of additional groundwater monitoring wells to Smith Gardner, Inc., of Raleigh, NC in the amount \$87,070.00.

Mr. Cain made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hart, to approve the installation of additional groundwater monitoring wells to Smith Gardner, Inc., of Raleigh, NC in the amount \$87,070.00.

Mr. Davis made note that all items requested at tonight's meeting were already included within the FY 2022-2023 budget.
