Call to Order

Mr. McCall called the meeting to order at 5:09 p.m.

Approval of Minutes

Mr. Davis made a motion, seconded by Mr. Elliott, approved 3 - 0 to approve the July 16, 2019 minutes as presented.

Discussion Items

Update Regarding Alternative Waste Processing Methods

Mr. McCall began the discussion and asked Mr. Matthew Durham to give a brief presentation about burning C&D waste from the landfill.

Per Mr. McCall, Mr. Durham addressed the Committee and noted the following:

- Recycling issues and solid waste problem
- Possible solution for C&D landfill
- In Franklin County, GA, they have two newly constructed 60 megawatt turbines that burn C&D fuel; this is wood, construction, demolition, debris, etc. that is ground up and burns off steam and turns a turbine
- Plants run 24/7 and rated to burn 60 tons per hour, which is equivalent to 500,000 tons of waste per year, per unit
- Considered renewable energy

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- Have not acquired all the fuel they need to be a base load plant; contracts available
- Propose to contact the plant in Franklin County, GA about the C&D landfill

Mr. Elliott made a motion, seconded by Mr. Davis, approved 3 - 0, to direct the County Administrator to contact a representative at Veolia Energy.

Mr. McCall thanked Mr. Durham for taking the time to come and speak with them.

Mr. McCall handed out several documents regarding different alternative waste processing methods that are going around the country [copy filed with backup materials].

Mr. Davis made a motion, seconded by Mr. Elliott, approved 3 - 0, to direct the County Administrator to investigate the feasibility for a waste to energy and a recycling plant and proposed location with impacts to the surrounding area and community and develop an education plan for that program.

Discussion regarding Expansion of General Healthcare in Oconee County

Mr. McCall began the discussion regarding the left over balance of a bill after insurance has paid their portion. He noted this is turned over to a collection agency and they put a lien on your property. Discussion continued to include health department building, grants, Rosa Clark, expansion of Joseph F. Sullivan nursing program, financial aid and payment plans through Prisma Health, and assisted living facilities.

It was the consensus of the Committee for Mr. Davis to meet with representatives from Prisma Health and the free clinics in Oconee County and bring information back to the next Law Enforcement, Public Safety, Health & Welfare Committee meeting, which will meet on September 17, 2019.
