

MINUTES OCONEE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING APRIL 8, 1980

The regular meeting of County Council was opened by Chairman Phinney with the invocation by Mr. Crain. All Council Members were present.

Motion by Mr. Crain second by Mr. Frady and carried to approve minutes of the March 25th meeting as furnished.

Mr. Ables moved to adopt on Third and Final Reading Ordinance 80-6, "Supplemental Budget Ordinance", Mr. Crain seconded the motion and it was passed by a 4 Yes and 0 No. (Mrs. Jennings was not present at the time of the vote.)

It was announced by Dr. Earle that Ordinance 80-3, "Concerning the Consumption and Transportation of Alcoholic Beverage in Vehicles and Public Places in Oconee County", would be put off until a public hearing can be held. He further stated that the news media and citizens would be notified of the date of the hearing.

Dr. Earle moved to adopt Ordinance 80-4, "An Ordinance to Adopt the Procedure for the Collection of Delinquent Taxes", on First Reading - second by Mr. Frady - the vote was 5 For and 0 Against. Dr. Earle pointed out this was the same Ordinance as the one presented for First Reading at last meeting but amended to delete the portion calling for the Tax Collector to be appointed rather than elected. It was agreed that due to the stiff penalty called for in this Ordinance for delinquent taxes, a notice of the penalty should be included in the tax notices this fall. Mr. Crain stated he felt a meeting should be held with the Tax Collector regarding this before Third Reading; it was agreed.

Mrs. Jennings moved, Mr. Ables seconded, to adopt on Second Reading Ordinance 80-5, "Pertaining to Non-Conforming Ambulances" - The vote was 5 Yes and 0 No.

Resolution 80-2, "Workmen's Compensation for Prisoners", was unanimously adopted. Motion by Mrs. Jennings, second by Mr. Frady.

Dr. Earle moved to appoint Mr. Robert Gaillard as Oconee's citizen representative to COG to replace Richard Lay (who has asked to be replaced). Mr. Crain seconded and the vote was unanimous.
