

MINUTES, OCONEE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING, JANUARY 19, 1982

The regular Oconee County Council Meeting was held January 19, 1982 in Council Chambers with all members present.

Members of the press present: Dick Mangrum - WSNW Radio, Ashton Hester - Keowee Courier, Cobb Oxford - Seneca Journal & George Algood - WGOG Radio.

The meeting was called to order by Supervisor-Chairman Crain who welcomed the guests and media.

The invocation was given by Dr. Earle.

Mr. Butts made a motion, seconded by Dr. Earle, approved 4- 0 to adopt the minutes of the January 5, 1982 meeting.

Mrs. Roddey Stoudemire, Chairman of the Oconee County Library Board addressed Council on the possibility of the Salem Library expanding its hours from nine a month to eighteen hours a month due to the increase in the use of the library.

Dr. Earle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Harper, approved 4 - 0 to accept the Library's proposal at a cost of \$720.72 plus 20% for fringe. This money is to come from contingency.

Mr. John Little, Chairman of the PRT Commission addressed Council on transferring \$1379 from line item 18 11 00 1, PRT Drt. to line item 18 11 04 1, PRT Superintendent. After considerable discussion Mr. Crain asked the Personnel Committee to look into the matter and report back to Council at the next meeting.

Mr. Brandt made a motion, seconded by Mr. Butts, approved 5 - 0 that Oconee County enter into an agreement with the Town of West Union whereby Oconee County's District One Magistrate conduct Court cases for the Town of West Union. Under this agreement the fees and fines on non-jury cases shall be shared equally by the Town and the County. The Town of West Union also agrees to reimburse the County for the full cost of all jury trials. (Please see copy of agreement attached.)

Due to there being several roads in subdivisions located through-out Oconee County that were conditionally accepted under Ordinance 75-7 whereby the developer had the responsibility of paying for the materials to cause these roads to be graveled and surface treated with Oconee County furnishing the labor Council agreed by general consensus as recommended by Mr. Butts that letters be sent asking these subdividers to make arrangements to pay for the materials necessary to cause these roads to be surface treated during the spring-summer of 1982.
