

MINUTES, OCONEE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING

The regular meeting of the Oconee County Council was held Tuesday, April 16, 1985 at 3:00 PM in Council Chambers with all members present.

The invocation was given by Mr. Williams.

Mr. Butts made a motion, seconded by Dr. Earle, approved 5 - 0 that the minutes of the April 2, 1985 meeting be adopted as printed.

Minutes

First on the agenda was a public hearing concerning the 1984-85 Supplemental Appropriation Ordinance. There was no one present with written and/or oral comments concerning this ordinance.

Public Hearing concerning Supplemental

Next there was a public hearing concerning the "removal of the remains of Polly Rose and unidentified remains to Falls Creek Baptist Church Cemetery".

Public hearing concerning the moving of a grave

Mr. Bruce Jones, who lives in that area was present for the public hearing, he said he had lived in that area all his life and he did not know there was a grave there until he read it in the paper. He further stated that Falls Creek Baptist Church was established in 1850 and he did not understand why if it was a person's grave they were not buried in the church cemetery at that time. He also said he was a deacon of Falls Creek Baptist Church and they would assist in any way they could, he did not feel there would be any objections to the grave being placed in the church cemetery.

Mr. Jones was the only person present with written and/or oral comments for the public hearing.

Mr. Harper made a motion, seconded by Mr. Dyar, approved 5 - 0 that Ordinance 85-4, "1984-85 Supplemental Appropriation Ordinance" be adopted on third and final reading as amended.

Mr. Williams made a motion, seconded by Dr. Earle, approved 5 - 0 to accept the low bid of Van Lott at \$155,925 including tax for an FD 30 tract dozer. This is a demonstrator machine with approximately 600 hours on it.

Mr. Williams made a motion, seconded by Dr. Earle, approved 5 - 0 that some repair work on some pipes at the back of the courthouse be repaired and \$100 for the repairs come from contingency or if the cost exceeds \$100 then it be brought before Council again.

Dr. Earle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Butts, approved 5 - 0 that the attached proposal for engineering and planning services for the airport with Texidyne, Inc. be approved. The contract is for \$2,300 which is to come from contingency, Oconee County has received verbal committment from the State Aeronautics Commission for \$1,500 for this contract.

Mr. Butts made a motion, seconded by Dr. Earle, approved 5 - 0 that the attached mutual aid agreement between Oconee County and Pickens County be approved.

Mutual Aid Agreement

Mr. Dyar made a motion, seconded by Dr. Earle, approved 5 - 0 that Harold A. Pickens & Sons be awarded the bid for 1985 road paving at an approximate cost of \$525,000.

Dr. Earle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Butts, approved 5 - 0 that \$400 be taken from contingency for envelopes for the Board of Registration.

Mr. Harper made a motion, seconded by Mr. Dyar, approved 5 - 0 that the attached transfers (no new monies) be approved.

Dr. Earle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Dyar, approved 5 - 0 that Resolution 85-14, "Removal & Relocation of a Portion of an Abandoned Cemetery" be adopted on first and final reading.


The Budget & Finance Committee set a meeting Tuesday, April 23, 1985 at 1:00 PM in Council Chambers to discuss the 1985-86 budget.

MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT

BETWEEN

OCONEE COUNTY AND PICKENS COUNTY, S.C.

Whereas, standing operating procedures at present require the Emergency Preparedness Director of Oconee County and Pickens County to require aid; and

Whereas, the Counties concerned come within the scope of the Civil Defense mutual aid concept since they are adjacent; and

Whereas, if the Counties listed are requesting aid of an adjacent County, the local Emergency Preparedness Director will, upon notification of the chief administrative official of the County making the request, make his request direct to the local Emergency Preparedness Director providing such aid, and the local Directors involved in such a request will notify, as a matter of information, the Director, South Carolina Emergency Preparedness Division of their intent to request/provide "Mutual Aid" from/to an adjacent County.

Now therefore, we, the undersigned officials of Oconee County and Pickens County, respectively, hereby grant to the local Emergency Preparedness Directors of Oconee County and Pickens County, the authority to use their resources to assist one another in local, natural or man-made disaster situations where the need arises; however, with the express understanding that the local community extending such aid may withhold resources to the extent necessary to provide reasonable protection for the community, and that the Civil Defense forces will continue under the command and control of their regular leaders, but that the organizational units come under the operational control of the Civil Defense authorities of the communities receiving assistance, unless otherwise specified, and with the further express understanding the County extending such aid, will be provided the physical needs of their volunteers and operational costs to the extent necessary as mutually agreed upon.

Re: Proposal for Engineering and Consulting Services
at the Oconee County Airport

Dear Mr. Crain:

We are pleased to offer the following proposal for preliminary engineering and consulting services concerning the development of an operational plan for the runway extension, and to act on behalf of the Airport Commission in acquiring the necessary easements, permits and funding to implement the plan. The scope of work will include trips to the State Aeronautics Commission and negotiations with property owners whose properties adjoin or invade the airspace required to land and takeoff small jet powered aircraft.

The approach surface at each end of the runway and the transitional surface at right angles to the centerline of the runway shall be verified for the airfield by ground instrumentation. Upon completion of the preliminary engineering and planning of the operational runway extension we shall work with the appropriate officials in obtaining the necessary easements and developing any regional ordinances to protect the approach and transitional surfaces of the airfield.

The project will also include working on the behalf of the Airport Commission to gain approval from the State Aeronautics Commission for the operation of a 4000' runway eligible to take-off and land small jet powered aircraft. Also, the negotiations will address the release of approved matching funds for the Airport Commission. The cost of the above described services shall be:


