

MINUTES, OCONEE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING

The regular meeting of the Oconee County Council was held Tuesday, November 5, 1985 at 7:00 PM in Council Chambers with all members present.

The meeting was called to order by Supervisor-Chairman Crain who welcomed the guests and media.

The invocation was given by Mr. Williams.

Mr. Butts made a motion, seconded by Mr. Dyar, approved 5 - 0 that the minutes of the October 15, 1985 meeting be adopted as printed.

Dr. Earle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Williams, approved 5 - 0 that the minutes of the special meeting held October 29, 1985 be adopted as printed.

Mr. Ned Hunnicutt, Comptroller, presented the attached proposals for replacement of computer equipment in the Family Court and Administrative Offices. Mr. Dyar made a motion, seconded by Dr. Earle, approved 5 - 0 that \$2,079 be taken from contingency for replacing the equipment in Family Court including memory and also the equipment in the Administrative Offices be replaced as outlined in the attached letter from Chris Foreman.

Dr. Earle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Dyar, approved 5 - 0 that Oconee County accept a grant from Duke Power Company in the amount of \$37,32.36 to be used for radio equipment for the Sheriff's Department.

Dr. Earle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Butts, approved 5 - 0 that Ordinance 85-11, "An Ordinance To Amend Ordinance 79-20 Creating Oconee County Arts And Historical Commission" be adopted on third and final reading as amended on second reading.

Dr. Earle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Williams, approved 5 - 0 that Ordinance 85-12, "Industrial Revenue Bond Ordinance for Englehard Corporation" in the amount of \$1,000,000 be adopted on first reading in title only.

Dr. Earle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Williams, approved 5 - 0 that Ordinance 85-14, "Pollution Control Bond Ordinance for Englehard Corporation" in the amount of \$8,000,000 be adopted on first reading in title only.

Mr. Williams made a motion, seconded by Mr. Dyar, approved 3 - 2 (Dr. Earle & Mr. Butts voting against) that Ordinance 85-13, "An Ordinance Authorizing the Sale of Hospital Revenue Bonds" in an amount not to exceed \$7,200,000 be adopted on first reading in title only.

Mr. Dyar, Road Committee Chairman, informed Council that the Road Committee, at the request of the property owners, had looked at County Roadway CE 44, and there will be a public hearing concerning closing approximately 500 feet of this roadway December 3, 1985 at 7:00 Pm in Council Chambers.

Mr. Butts made a motion, seconded by Dr. Earle, approved 5 - 0 that \$293 be taken from contingency to repair the storage building for the Sheriff's Department that had been damaged when broken into.

Mr. Dyar made a motion, seconded by Mr. Butts, approved 5 - 0 that Carolina Drilling & Blasting be awarded the contract for drilling and blasting at the rock crusher at the same cost per ton as last year, \$ .66 per ton.

Dr. Earle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Butts, approved 5 - 0 that Council accept Mr. Bobby Long's resignation as a member of the Emergency Preparedness Commission, effective December 31, 1985 and he be sent a letter of appreciation for his years of service as a member of the commission.

Mr. Harper made a motion, seconded by Mr. Butts, approved 5 - 0 that the attached transfer (no new monies) be approved.

Next on the agenda was an executive session for the purpose of reviewing from the record the decision of the September 26, 1985 hearing of the Oconee County Grievance Committee upholding the August 12, 1985 termination of James M. Hunnicutt.

After much discussion it was unanimously agreed to by consensus that if any council member wished to meet again to discuss the matter that the Supervisor's Office should be notified within seven (7) days (by November 12, 1985) by reason of time restraints imposed by Oconee County Policies & Procedures which state that "The written decision of the County Council shall be rendered to the parties concerned within ten (10) working days after receipt of the Committee's decision". If no meeting is requested, the decision of the Grievance Committee will stand as presented and Mr. Hunnicutt will be so notified.

Mr. Crain highlighted the "Local Government Finance Act Proposals" and suggested it be discussed at the next meeting.

Council also set a meeting for November 13, 1985 at 6:00 PM to discuss the "Medically Indigent Care Bill".

Mr. Butts made a motion, seconded by Dr. Earle, approved 5 - 0 that if the insurance does not provide defense for Jerry Moss, County Sheriff's Deputy, who was involved in an accident while performing his duty, that W. Jerry Fedder, County Attorney, offer to defend him.

Mr. Butts made a motion, seconded by Dr. Earle, approved 5 - 0 that when the municipalities use their own equipment to load and haul dirt from the landfill or rock crusher that they sign a document prepared by the County Attorney they will hold Oconee County harmless for any dirt that might fall on passing vehicles or any accidents that might occur while loading and hauling this dirt. There will be no charge to the municipalities for this dirt when they use their own equipment.


Council requested that Judge Derrick be invited to the next Council Meeting to discuss the hours of the Westminster Magistrate's Office.



M E M O R A N D U M

Subject: Upgrade of Seiko 8600 to IBM PC AT.

One year ago when we were completing your agreement with Smith Data Processing regarding the installation of administrative and family court data processing systems, you requested that SDP replace three of your Seiko 8620 terminals (one in family court and two in the administrative area) with IBM PC microcomputers at a cost not to exceed \$889.50 per unit. The microcomputers would act as terminals to the Seiko, and they would also be used independently with whatever microcomputer software you chose to install on them.

I believe that I speak correctly for SDP when I say that they will still meet this obligation if you so desire; however, they are offering an alternative that might be preferable.

SDP is willing to replace the Seiko 8600 microcomputer and the three Seiko 8620 terminals in the administrative area with one IBM PC AT microcomputer and two attached IBM PC microcomputers. The IBM PC AT disk drive will have a 40 meg capacity (your Seiko disk drive has a 40 meg capacity), but because of the manner in which the AT drive is formatted, you will actually gain a small amount of disk space from the change. The diskette drive on the AT has about twice the capacity of the diskette drive on the Seiko. There will still be three workstations on the new system, and the software will work identically to that which you now have. You will be able to procure diskettes independently for the AT and for the PCs, and you can format them yourself. You will be able to use independently procured MS-DOS software on the AT or on either of the PCs; in addition, you will be able to use independently procured CP/M-86 software on either of the PCs. (This means that the software that you have already purchased will run on either of the PCs.)

The total cost for this change is \$2,668.50. This is \$889.50 more than the originally planned change, but your maintenance costs will be reduced from \$281.00 per month to \$222.00 per month. Therefore, the additional expenditure will be recovered in reduced maintenance costs within sixteen months of the change.

SDP is willing to replace the Seiko 8600 microcomputer and the two Seiko 8620 terminals in the family court area with one IBM PC AT and one IBM PC. All of the advantages and limitations listed above for the administrative area apply to the family court option as well.

The cost for this change is \$1,779.00. This is also \$889.50 more than the originally planned change, but the maintenance costs will be reduced from \$222.00 per month to \$144.00 per month, thus recovering the additional investment within one year of the change.

If Oconee County chooses to proceed with these changes, SDP will install the new hardware in early 1986. They will provide immediate delivery of one of the PCs to be used in the administrative area, and they will not request payment for it until all of the new hardware is delivered and in operation.

I have sent SDP a copy of this memo and asked them to review the advantages that I have listed. If they concur with all of them, I recommend that Oconee County proceed with the above changes.

SDP also offers the following additional options with these changes: Increase the disk capacity in family court to 30 meg for \$300.00 plus an additional monthly maintenance of \$15.00. Increase the disk capacity in the administrative area to 60 meg for \$500.00 plus an additional \$15.00 in monthly maintenance.
