

MINUTES, OCONEE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING

The regular meeting of the Oconee County Council was held Tuesday, January 21, 1986 at 3:00 PM in Council Chambers with all members present.

The meeting was called to order by Supervisor-Chairman Crain who welcomed the guests and media.

The invocation was given by Mr. Williams.

Mr. Williams made a motion, seconded by Mr. Butts, approved 5 - 0 that the minutes of the January 7, 1986 meeting be adopted as printed.

Mr. Williams made a motion, seconded by Dr. Earle, approved 5 - 0 that the attached contract with the Corps of Engineers, number DACW21-83-C-0038 for Law Enforcement Services be approved.

Dr. Larry Hudson addressed Council concerning a State Proposed Multi-purpose Arena for livestock shows, it is estimated that such an arena could bring as much as \$4,680,000 back into an area. After much discussion, Mr. Williams made a motion, seconded by Dr. Earle, approved 5 - 0 that Resolution 86-1, "A Resolution Supporting a Multi-purpose Arena" be adopted on first and final reading.

Ms. Dorothy Mimms & Ms. Delilah Stutz of SHARE addressed Council concerning a heating problem in the SHARE Office. After discussion, Mr. Butts made a motion, seconded by Mr. Dyar, approved 5 - 0 that Oconee County replace the heating unit in the SHARE Office as the present one cannot be repaired and SHARE is to begin paying rent to the county at a monthly rate that will be fair and equitable for both parties until the cost of the heating unit (approximately \$5,000 is recovered by the county.

Mr. Williams made a motion, seconded by Dr. Earle, approved 5 - 0 that Edwards Auto Sales be awarded the bid for a 1986 Ton 4X4 pickup truck with utility bed for Emergency Preparedness. They were low bid at \$13,600.

Mr. Williams made a motion, seconded by Dr. Earle, approved 5 - 0 that Total Communications be awarded the bid for radio equipment, they were low bid at \$4947.60.

Dr. Earle made a motion, seconded by Mr Harper, approved 5 - 0 that the attached adoption procedure for the Animal Shelter be adopted except for items 2, 3, 5 & 11.

Humane

Dr. Earle, Chairman of the Intergovernmental Committee, also recommended that the request of the Humane Society to raise the adoption fee for the animals at the Animal Shelter be considered at budget time as the \$25 fee recommended by the Humane Society includes that the fee be used for spaying and neutering the animal and there will most likely be a \$2,000 loss of revenue to the county to initiate the program. The Humane Society is also to work with the County Purchasing Department to determine which veterinarians would be interested in participating in the program and what their fee would be.

Dr. Earle also recommended that sodium phenobarbital be used to put the animals to sleep instead of the carbon monoxide chamber if this was agreeable with the present personnel and it could be worked within the present budget. However, if there is going to be any additional cost, this should also be considered at budget time.

Mr. Crain said he was opposed to that idea because of the stress on the employees.

Mr. Harper made a motion, seconded by Mr. Butts, approved 5 - 0 that the attached transfer(s) be approved.

Transfers

Dr. Earle brought it to the attention of Council that the Board of Registration has requested \$7,500 for additional temporary help in that office.

Bd. of REg.

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Mr. Harper made a motion, seconded by Mr. Dyar, approved 4 - 1 (Mr. Dyar voting against) that the Board of Registration's request for \$7,500 for additional temporary help be sent to the Delegation. (See attached letter)

Mr. Butts made a motion, seconded by Dr. Earle, approved 4 - 0 (Mr. Williams abstaining) that the attached letter to Mr. Archie I. Barron concerning the selection of Board Members for Oconee Memorial Hospital and Lila Doyle Annex be adopted.
