

MINUTES, OCONEE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING

The regular meeting of the Oconee County Council was held Tuesday, October 21, 1986 at 3:00 PM in Council Chambers with all Council Members present.

The meeting was called to order by Supervisor-Chairman Crain who welcomed the guests and media.

Mr. Dyar made a motion, seconded by Mr. Butts, approved 5 - 0 that the minutes of the October 7, 1986 meeting be adopted as printed.

Mr. Steve Leslie, Chairman of the Alliance For Improved Education In Oconee County presented Council with the attached goals of this organization. Council Members assured Mr. Leslie they too, are very much interested in the education of the children of Oconee County.

Dr. Earle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Butts, approved 5 - 0 that Ordinance 86-5, "An Ordinance Granting A Non Exclusive Franchise To Foothills Cable TV Co." be adopted on third and final reading.

Mr. Ted Lybrand of COG addressed Council on updating the classification and compensation plan for employees of Oconee County. Mr. Lybrand described the method COG plans to use in updating the plan as a Quantitative Approach using a point system to evaluate each position as to the responsibility, effort, and working conditions of each job position. COG hopes to have the study completed shortly after January 1, 1987.

Mr. Williams made a motion, seconded by Mr. Dyar, approved 5 - 0 that Wright Timber Co. be awarded the bid for the timber close to Oconee Memorial Hospital @ \$2,452.



Dr. Earle brought out the possibility of using some of the funds from the fees and fines collected by the state from the oil companies for an incinerator. However, Mr. Crain pointed out that even if we could use some of these funds for that purpose it would not relieve the problem.

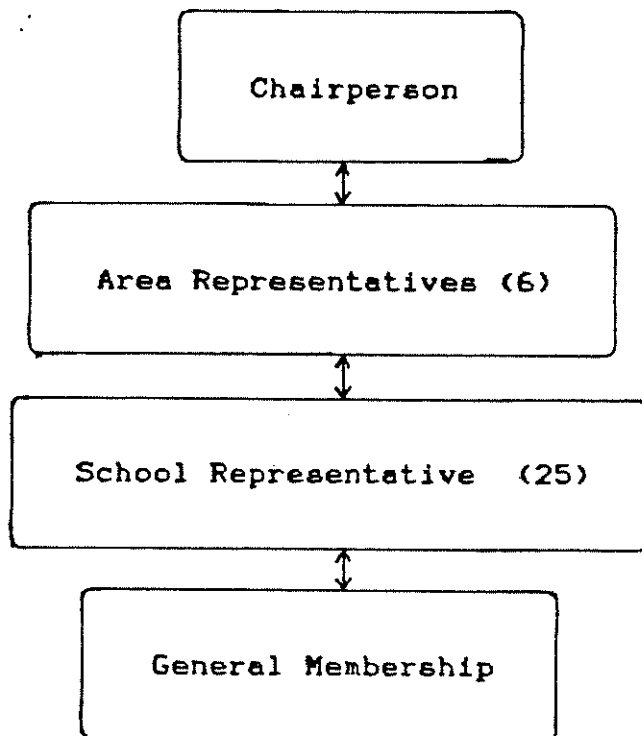
Alliance for Improved Education in Oconee County

IN- SCHOOL/COMMUNITY OUTREACH PERFORMANCE CONTRACT

AGREEMENT made this 9th day of September, 1986, by and between THE TARRADIDDLE PLAYERS (a non-profit corporation organized and operating under the laws of the State of North Carolina), and Oconee Arts & Historical Commission, (hereinafter referred to as Sponsor). Sponsor agrees to pay THE TARRADIDDLE PLAYERS (hereinafter referred to as The Company for two (2) performances of "A Christmas Memory" according to the following fee schedule:

The Company agrees to provide the following:

- (1) The complete production with sets, costumes and fully-staged performance(s) at the agreed-upon times;
- (2) Printed preparatory materials for use by teachers no later than two weeks in advance of a scheduled performance.

The Sponsor agrees to provide the following:

- (1) Directions to each performance location, including a map, and the names and phone numbers of contact people at each location.

CONTRACT

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- (2) A \$150.00 deposit is due to the Tarradiddle Players upon the signing of this contract. In the event Sponsor cancels the booking two weeks(14days) prior to the scheduled performance, the \$150. deposit will be returned to the Sponsor.(deposit is portion of fee)
- (3) The company will be allowed entrance into the performing area at least one hour prior to performance time.
- (4) The performance area must be cleared of any and all physical obstructions including chairs, desks, other set pieces, or gymnastic equipment prior to the arrival of the Company.
- (5) Individual to assist with unloading and loading equipment when necessary.
- (6) A person familiar with lighting equipment and electrical connections in the performance area.
- (7) Lights (where available) prefocused in a general wash over the performance area.
- (8) Dressing areas adjacent to the performing area with proper lighting, heat, and ventilation for the sole use of the six performers. Facilities with hot & cold running water will be easily accessible.
- (9) The Sponsor will comply promptly with the directions of the Tarradiddle Stage Manager regarding stage settings and audience seating plan for the performance thereunder.
- (10) The Players will have sole and exclusive control of the production, presentation and performance.
- (11) The Sponsor will not permit any performance or rehearsal to be recorded, videotaped, televised or otherwise extended beyond the place of engagement without the prior written consent of the Tarradiddle Players.
- (12) The Sponsor will prepare a letter of response no later than two (2) weeks after performance stating response of audience. (Typed on Sponsor's letterhead- these letters are of extreme importance. They are submitted with grants and proposals asking for support for our in-school productions. With this support, we could subsidize our costs and keep our fees as low as possible.
- (13) The following information should be supplied when this signed contract is returned to the Tarradiddle office: a) description of performance space; b) stage dimensions(width, depth, height); c) sound and stage lighting facilities (if any); d) approximate audience size.

Payment

Payment for performances shall be made by check payable to:

and delivered to the Company Stage Manager immediately following the first performance. THIS CONTRACT CONSTITUTES AN INVOICE.

Payment may also be made in advance by mailing a check to the Players at: 121 West 7th Street, Charlotte, NC 28202

Cancellation by Sponsor

In the event Sponsor cancels a performance less than two weeks of its scheduled date, Sponsor shall pay to the Company a cancellation fee of \$100.00. It shall be the right of the Company management to waive this fee if the cancelled performance(s) is (are) rescheduled at a time mutually agreeable to Sponsor and the Company.

Impossibility of Performance

In the event of illness, accident or any other act of God which forces cancellation of performance, the cancelling party shall notify the other party immediately. Sponsor shall then be relieved of this obligation to pay for cancelled performance(s). The Company and Sponsor shall then attempt to reschedule the cancelled performances(s) at the earliest convenient time.

Entire Agreement

This agreement represents the entire understanding between the parties and cannot be changed orally but only by written agreement.
