#### MINUTES, OCONEE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING

The regular meeting of the Oconee County Council was held Tuesday, March 4, 1997 at 7:00 pm in Council Chambers with all Council Members and the County Attorney present.

Members of the press notified (by mail): Journal/Tribune, Keowee Courier, Westminster News, Anderson Independent, Greenville News, WGOG Radio, WSNW Radio, WCCP Radio, WYFF TV, Northland Cablevision, WLOS TV. & SC Black Media Group.

Members of the press present: Terry Cregar - Greenville News & Bill Swain, Northland Cable.

The meeting was called to order by Supervisor - Chairman Orr who welcomed the guests and media.

The invocation was given by Ms. Burrell.

Ms. Burrell made a motion, seconded by Mr. Timms, approved 5 - 0 that the minutes of the February 18, 1997 meeting be adopted as printed.

After much disruption from an unruly crowd gathered in the Council Chambers, it was the consensus of Council to table the presentation of the Oconee County, South Carolina 1996 Land Use Plan, as amended February 1997 by the Planning Commission until a later date.

Ms. Burrell & Mr. Timms left the meeting at this time in protest of the unruly crowd.

Upon request of Mr. Frank Wise, Mr. Hamilton made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Hughes, approved 3 - 0 that Resolution 97-2, "A RESOLUTION DESIGNATING THE COUNCIL ON AGING AS AN ENTITY TO PROVIDE TRANSPORTATION TO THE ELDERLY AND/OR HANDICAPPED" be approved on first and final reading.

Mr. Thomas, Roads & Transportation Chair scheduled a meeting Monday, March 17, 1997 at 3:00 pm in Council for the purpose of discussing possible amendments to Ordinance 82-14, "AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE ACCEPTANCE FOR ROADS IN SUBDIVISIONS & REPEALING ORDINANCE 82-6".

Mr. Cain, County Attorney, informed Council that anyone could advise the "C" Fund Committee of roadways that need to be repaired using "C" funds.







# CLINIC AGREEMENT

## BETWEEN

# SC DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENTAL CONTROL SC MIGRANT HEALTH PROGRAM

### AND

### A A MARTIN DDS

The undersigned agrees to provide health services for the South Carolina Migrant Health Program of the SC Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC) as described below.

#### I. SCOPE OF SERVICES:

Provide to migrant and seasonal farmworkers and their families: dental services for the purpose of prevention, assessment or treatment of a dental problem, including restoration.

#### II. TIME OF PERFORMANCE:

This agreement shall be effective 04/01/97 or on the date signed by the Deputy Commissioner for Administrative Services or Contract Services Specialist, whichever is later, and will terminate on 03/31/98.

## III. COMPENSATION:

- A. The fee per patient for each encounter shall not exceed twenty six dollars (\$26.00). In no event will the maximum amount of this agreement exceed one hundred dollars (\$100.00) without authorization from the South Carolina Migrant Health Program.
- B. Payment for health services will be made pursuant to a monthly statement of services, and include a completed South Carolina Migrant Health Program encounter form for each patient seen. The amount billed shall coincide with the services provided and documented on the South Carolina Migrant Health Program encounter form (Attachment A).

## IV. TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

- A. All services shall be rendered within the scope and limitations of applicable DHEC regulations.
- B. Provider agrees to prescribe generic drugs whenever possible in order to maximize the use of limited migrant health funds.
- C. This agreement may be terminated by either party by giving written notice **30 days** prior to the effective date of such termination.
- D. Records with respect to all matters covered by this agreement shall be retained for 4 years after the end of the period of this agreement and shall be available for audit and inspection at any time such audit is deemed necessary by DHEC. If audit has begun but not completed at the end of the 4 year period, the records shall be retained until resolution of the audit findings.

E. DHEC is required to prepare a Report of Assistance to Minority Businesses. If any of the services rendered under this agreement are carried out by a minority individual, it is to be included in that report.

SC Minority Firms as defined in Section 11-35-5010, of the SC Consolidated Procurement Code as a United States Citizen who is economically and socially disadvantaged. Socially disadvantaged individuals means those individuals who have been subject to racial or ethnic prejudice or cultural bias because of their identification as members of a certain group, without regard to their individual qualities. Such groups include, but are not limited to Black Americans, Hispanic Americans, Native Americans, (including American Indians, Eskimos, Aleuts and Native Hawaiians), Asian Pacific Americans and other minorities to be designated by SC Budget and Control Board or designated agency.

F. The provider agrees to abide by DHEC's policy of confidentiality which states that all information as to personal facts and circumstances given or made available to employees and/or contractors of DHEC in administration of programs shall be held confidential and shall not be divulged without consent of the individual(s) to which it pertains except as is needed in planning, provision and evaluation of health services.

General information such as the total expenditures made, the number of clients served and other statistical information does not fall within the class of information to be safeguarded, provided such general information cannot be identified with any particular individual. Should information be linked specifically to a client then information pertaining to individuals may only be released to physicians and attorneys when requests for such information are accompanied by a properly completed release signed by the individual or his/her guardian. Proper documentation would be reflected in the continuation sheet of that client's health record as the information is released. Also, a properly completed authorization should be kept in the client's health record to reflect any disclosure of confidential information. Audits of health records may routinely be performed to insure compliance with this procedure.

- G. No person shall be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination in relation to any activities carried out under this agreement on the grounds of race, color, sex, religion or national origin.
- H. The provider certifies that he/she will not engage in the unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensation, possession or use of a controlled substance in the performance of this contract. This certification also applies to any individual employed by the provider.

The fees presented are well within market value and are actually less than most of our competition. The only new fee is for parking. This would be collected during peak use hours on Friday, Saturday and Sunday only, between Memorial Weekend and Labor Day Weekend. We have requested funds for a gatehouse and attendant for South Cove. At High Falls we would use an envelope "honor box system" enforced by our normal regular patrols. Both parks would use hangtags. Chau Ram would not be involved in this program at present.

This system would not only tap into a new revenue source, it would also help control traffic and use patterns (i.e. cruising at South Cove, move more rentals into weekdays to ease crowded parking areas, etc.). Presently a major part of our maintenance and patrol activity involves day use areas which do not contribute to our revenue. This would more equally distribute the fee structure among all park visitors.

SUBJECT: Code Enforcement Officer Authority for Park Employees

I have researched the subject of law enforcement capabilities for park use for the past four years. As a result, and as it is a necessary function of our jobs, I am now respectfully making a request of the County Supervisor and County Council to designate the PRT Director, Park Superintendents, and Park Rangers as Code Enforcement Officers under the enabling legislation of State Code 4-9-145 "Enforcement officers; appointment; unlimited number; powers and duties." This would allow us to do our jobs in a much more professional and efficient manner without the "bluffing" and "threat" tactics we currently are forced to use to gain compliance. It is my opinion now, and always has been, that on-site law enforcement capability, in the form of the park employee, is the best deterrent to illicit or illegal activity or violations of rules and regulations.

Our designation as Code Enforcement Officers would not only greatly help our efficiency, but also that of the Sheriff's Department, which regularly has to make visits to the parks for very minor offenses that could have been handled just as effectively, if not more so, by the on-site Park Official. Training, while not mandatory, is available at no cost from the South Carolina Criminal Justice Academy. This two week course is the same one used by the S. C. State Parks personnel.

I have support for this project from both the County Attorney and Sheriff. I urgently request that this issue be given your utmost attention and consideration as it is of great importance to both park visitor and employee alike. If I can answer any questions, or be of any assistance, please do not hesitate to contact me.

A business license tax ordinance was not invalid on the ground that S.C. #### ATTORNEY GENERAL'S OPINIONS

Taxes collected for specific public purposes cannot be diverted to fund unbudgeted expenses unless purpose for which tax was levied is first satisfied. 1991 Op Atty Gen, No. 91-21 p

All appropriations by a county must be reflected in its budget adopted pursuant to section 4-9-140. A county is without authority to create or designate an independent entity to be a millage agency, such term being construed to mean the authority to levy taxes. If funds are to be provided such an agency, the same must be for a public purpose and must be set forth in the county's budget. 1988 Op Atty Gen. No. 88-79,

#### ATTORNEY GENERAL'S OPINIONS

Appointment of special constable pursuant to § 4-9-145 to provide supplemental law enforcement for municipality could constitute conflict with § 4-9-30 inasmuch as it could be duplicative of duties and functions already performed by sheriff. Also, such might possibly be considered restructuring or reorganization of sheriff's department, therefore such appointment would not be authorized absent compliance with referendum requirements of § 4-9-30, 1991 Op Atty Gen, No 91-56, p 142.

Security officers appointed by authority of § 4-9-145 are eligible to exclude \$5.00 per duty day from their South Carolina personal income tax return for subsistence allowance pursuant to §§ 23-1-30 and 23-1-400. 1991 Op Atty Gen, No. 91-22 p 71.

County code enforcement officers commissioned pursuant to § 4-9-145 may use blue lights on their county vehicles when performing law enforcement duties. 1993 Op Atty Gen No. 93-58.

# § 4-9-150. Audits of county records; designation of auditors; public inspection of report.

The council shall provide for an independent annual audit of all financial records and transactions of the county and any agency funded in whole by county funds and may provide for more frequent audits as it considers necessary. Special audits may be provided for any agency receiving county funds as the county governing body considers necessary. The audits must be made by a certified public accountant or public accountant or firm of these accountants who have no personal interest, direct or indirect, in the fiscal affairs of the county government or any of its officers. The council may, without requiring competitive bids, designate the accountant or firm annually or for a period not exceeding one year. The designation for any particular fiscal year must be made no later than thirty days after the beginning of the fiscal year. The report of the audit must be made available for public inspection. A copy of the report of audit must be submitted to the Comptroller General no later than January first each year following the close of the books of the previous fiscal year.

#### Editor's Note-

1988 Act No. 365, Part II, § 1, provides as follows:

"The General Assembly finds that numerous changes have been made at the local levels of government in South Carolina since the early part of this century. New laws have been enacted, technological progress has been made, and the art of accounting has changed, all of which have impacted upon the reporting requirements of the local governments as well as the State. Many of the laws pertaining to property tax and local financial reporting procedures existing prior to Home Rule have become archaic, irrelevant, and cumbersome since their enactment early in this century. Many of these laws now foster inefficiency, duplication of effort, and a waste of resources. The purpose of this part is to amend and repeal those statutes as necessary in order to eliminate unnecessary procedures and reports, to eliminate waste associated with the duplication of effort, and to provide for more pertinent data from those reports found to be necessary."

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 4-9-145, AS AMENDED, CODE OF LAWS OF SOUTH CAROLINA, 1976, RELATING TO THE APPOINTMENT, POWERS, AND DUTIES OF COUNTY CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS, SO AS TO ALLOW THE GOVERNING BODY OF A COUNTY TO LIMIT THE SCOPE OF THEIR AUTHORITY.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of South Carolina:

#### County code enforcement officers

SECTION 1. Section 4-9-145 of the 1976 Code, as last amended by Act 411 of 1992, is further amended to read:

"Section 4-9-145. The governing body of a county may appoint and commission as many code enforcement officers as may be necessary for the proper security, general welfare, and convenience of the county. These officers are vested with all the powers and duties conferred by law upon constables in addition to duties imposed upon them by the governing body of the county. However, no code enforcement officer commissioned under this section may perform a custodial arrest. These code enforcement officers shall exercise their powers on all private and public property within the county. The governing body of the county may limit the scope of a code enforcement officer's authority or the geographic area for which he is authorized to exercise the authority granted."

#### Time effective

SECTION 2. This act takes effect upon approval by the Governor.
