**ORDINANCE 2009-04**

AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF AN EQUIPMENT LEASE-PURCHASE AGREEMENT IN THE AMOUNT OF NOT EXCEEDING \$800,000 TO DEFRAY THE COST OF ACQUIRING THREE FIRE TRUCKS; AND OTHER MATTERS RELATING THERETO.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF OCONEE COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Findings and Determinations. The County Council (the "Council") of Oconee County, South Carolina (the "County"), hereby finds and determines:

(a) Pursuant to Section 4-9-10, Code of Laws of South Carolina 1976, as amended (the "Code"), the County operates under the Council-Administrator form of government and the Council constitutes the governing body of the County.

(b) Section 4-9-30 of the Code empowers all counties to lease personal property and to make and execute contracts.

(c) The County desires to enter into a lease-purchase agreement (the "Lease Agreement") with a bank or other financial institution selected by the Chairman of County Council and the County Administrator for the purpose of financing the acquisition of three fire trucks (the "Equipment").

(d) The Lease Agreement will not constitute a "financing agreement" and the Equipment will not constitute an "asset" as such terms are defined in Section 11-27-110 of the S.C. Code. Thus, the amount of the Lease Agreement will not be included when calculating the County's constitutional debt limit under Article X, Section 14 of the Constitution of the State of South Carolina.

(e) The Lease Agreement will be subject to annual appropriation by the County Council.

(f) It is in the best interest of the County to acquire the Equipment by entering in to the Lease Agreement. The Lease Agreement will enable the County to purchase the Equipment which will provide service necessary or useful to the operations of the County government.

Section 2. Approval of Lease/Purchase Financing/ Delegation of Authority to Determine Certain Matters Relating to the Lease/Purchase Financing. The Equipment shall be acquired pursuant to a lease purchase financing which is hereby approved in a principal amount of not exceeding \$800,000. A Request for Proposals in substantially the form set forth as Exhibit A hereto shall be distributed to various banks and other financial institutions in the County and other areas as the County Administrator determines. Without further authorization, the County Council hereby delegates to the Chairman of County Council and the County Administrator the authority to (a) determine the payment schedule under the Lease Agreement; (b) determine the date and time for receipt of bids under the Request for Proposals; and (c) award the sale of the lease-purchase financing to the lowest responsible bidder (the "Bidder") therefor in accordance with the terms of the Request for Proposals, provided the net interest cost does not exceed 8% per annum.

Section 3. Approval of Lease Agreement. Without further authorization, the Chairman of County Council and County Administrator are authorized to approve the form, terms and provisions of the Lease Agreement proposed by the Bidder. The County Administrator is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to execute, acknowledge and deliver the Lease Agreement in the name and on behalf of the County. The Lease Agreement is to be in the form as shall be approved by the Chairman of County Council and County Administrator, the County Administrator's execution thereof to constitute conclusive evidence of such approval.

Section 4. Execution of Documents. The Chairman of County Council, County Administrator, and Clerk to County Council are fully empowered and authorized to take such further action and to execute and deliver such additional documents as may be reasonably requested by the Bidder to effect the delivery of the Lease Agreement in accordance with the terms and conditions therein set forth, and the transactions contemplated hereby and thereby, and the action of such officers in executing and delivering any of such documents, in such form as the County Administrator shall approve, is hereby fully authorized.

Section 5. Federal Tax Covenant. The County, as lessee, agrees and covenants that it will not take any action which will, or fail to take any action which failure will, cause interest components of the lease payments under the Lease Agreement to become includable in the gross income for federal income tax purposes pursuant to the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "IRC") and regulations promulgated thereunder in effect on the date of original issuance of the Lease Agreement and that it will comply with all applicable provisions of Section 103 and Sections 141 through 150 of the IRC, and any regulations promulgated thereunder, to maintain the exclusion from gross income for federal income tax purposes of the interest portion of the lease payments under the Lease Agreement, and to that end the County shall:

- (a) comply with the applicable provisions of Section 103 and Sections 141 through 150 of the IRC and any regulations promulgated thereunder so long as the Lease Agreement is outstanding;
- (b) establish such funds, make such calculations and pay such amounts in the manner and at the times required in order to comply with the requirements of the IRC relating to required rebates of certain amounts to the United States; and

- (e) make such reports of such information at the times and places required by the IRC.

The County covenants that, in accordance with Section 265(b)(3) of the IRC, it is hereby designating the Lease Agreement as a "qualified tax-exempt obligation" and that it does not reasonably anticipate that it will issue more than \$30,000,000 in tax-exempt obligations which are not "private activity bonds" during calendar year 2009, all within the meaning of Section 265(b) of the IRC.

The County will timely file Form 8038-G in accordance with the applicable regulations of the Internal Revenue Service.

Section 6. Filings with Central Repository. In compliance with Section 11-1-85 of the Code, the County covenants that it will file or cause to be filed with a central repository for further availability in the secondary bond market when requested: (a) a copy of the annual audit of the County within thirty (30) days of the County's receipt thereof, and (b) within thirty (30) days of the occurrence thereof, relevant information of an event which, in the opinion of the County, adversely affects more than five percent (5%) of the County's revenue or its tax base.

Section 7. Scrutability. All orders, resolutions and parts thereof, procedural or otherwise, in conflict herewith or the proceedings authorizing the execution of the Lease Agreement are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

Section 8. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be effective upon its enactment by the County Council for Oconee County, South Carolina.

**Bank Qualified**

Oconee County, South Carolina (the "County"), is requesting proposals from various banks and financial institutions for not exceeding \$800,000 tax-exempt lease-purchase financing to defray the costs of certain equipment as described herein.

PROPOSALS MAY BE DELIVERED BY HAND, BY MAIL, BY FACSIMILE TRANSMISSION OR BY E-MAIL, BUT NO PROPOSAL SHALL BE CONSIDERED WHICH IS NOT ACTUALLY RECEIVED BY THE COUNTY AT THE PLACE, DATE AND TIME APPOINTED, AND THE COUNTY SHALL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY FAILURE, MISDIRECTION, DELAY OR ERROR RESULTING FROM THE SELECTION BY ANY BIDDER OF ANY PARTICULAR MEANS OF DELIVERY OF BIDS.

Facsimile Bids: The County will accept the facsimile transmission of a proposal at the risk of the bidder. The County shall not be responsible for the confidentiality of bids submitted by facsimile transmission. Any delay in receipt of a facsimile bid, and any incompleteness or illegible portions of such bid are the responsibility of the bidder. Bids by facsimile transmission should be transmitted to the attention of Dale Surrett, County Administrator, Fax No. 864.638.4246.

Please note that this solicitation is also being sent to a number of other institutions as well and that the County reserves the right to select the proposal determined to be the most

advantageous to the County. The selection process will be heavily weighted toward lowest financing costs. The County reserves the right to reject any or all bid proposals as well as negotiate with the lowest responsible bidder.

I. Terms and Conditions:

- (a) Amount to be Financed: Not exceeding \$800,000.
- (b) Payments: Five (5) approximately equal annual principal and interest payments under the Lease Agreement will be due and payable March 1, 2010 to and including March 1, 2014. Unless otherwise designated by a bidder, interest on the lease will be calculated based on a 360-day year comprising twelve 30-day months.
- (c) Guarantee of Interest Rate: The interest rate, costs and other terms of the bid submitted must be guaranteed from the date of your proposal to the closing date (expected to be approximately \_\_\_\_\_, 2009).
- (d) Equipment: Three (3) fire trucks.
- (e) Form of Equipment Lease-Purchase Agreement: A bidder's proposed form of lease agreement ("Lease Agreement") should be provided within three (3) business days of the award of the successful proposal.
- (f) Non-appropriation: A non-appropriation provision acceptable to the County must be included in the Lease Agreement.
- (g) Non-substitution: A non-substitution provision is not permitted to be included in the Lease Agreement.
- (h) Deficiency Judgment: No deficiency judgment can be assessed or imposed against the County nor will the full faith, credit and taxing power of the County be pledged to the payment of the Lease Agreement.
- (i) Title: Title to the equipment will be in the name of the County subject to the lessor's rights under the Lease Agreement. The Lease Agreement must allow the County to dispose of various items of equipment in its discretion provided the value of the remaining items of equipment is not less than the outstanding balance of the lease at the time of such disposition.

- (j) Acquisition/Escrow Account: The County will require the successful bidder to transfer by Federal funds the full amount of this financing on the date of the closing. If a bidder requires that the Acquisition/Escrow Account be held by it or its designee, the bidder must so indicate in its proposal. Otherwise the County retains the right to designate a bank to act as custodian of the Acquisition/Escrow Account. The Acquisition/Escrow Account must be an interest bearing account. Interest earnings in the Acquisition/Escrow Account must accrue to the County. This Account will be structured to allow payments therefrom to be made (1) to the County to reimburse it for amounts previously expended on the equipment; and (2) to the equipment vendor for payment of the equipment as directed by the County.
- (k) Costs of Issuance: All such costs relating to the preparation of the Lease Agreement and fees of special counsel will be paid by the County. Any fees and costs of the bidder to be paid by the County must be stated in the response to the Request for Proposals. The Lease Agreement must allow the County to pay its legal fees and costs related to execution and delivery of the Lease Agreement out of the proceeds of the Lease Agreement.
- (l) Insurance: The County is insured through the South Carolina Insurance Reserve Fund. The Equipment will be insured in a similar manner at face value. The lessor may be listed as a loss-payee, but may not be listed as an additional insured under the County's insurance coverage.
- (m) Lease Agreement Designated As Qualified Tax-Exempt Obligations: The County will designate the Lease Agreement as a "qualified tax-exempt obligation" for purposes of Section 265 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 relating to the ability of financial institutions to deduct from income for federal income tax purposes interest expense that is allocable to carrying and acquiring tax-exempt obligations.
- (n) Closing: The County expects to accept the successful proposal on \_\_\_\_\_, 2009 and to close the transaction on or about \_\_\_\_\_, 2009.

## II. Proposal Requirements.

- (a) The proposal must be in writing.
- (b) No response may be modified by a bidder after it has been submitted.
- (c) Proposals should include: the name, address, and telephone number of your institution; the primary contact; and identity of legal counsel, if any.

- (d) Proposals must be accompanied with a list of all requirements and conditions associated with the bid.
- (e) Proposals must indicate a single interest rate for the lease term and include an amortization schedule showing annual payment amounts for the term of the financing.
- (f) Proposals must provide full disclosure of all financing costs, including any closing, legal, and tax opinion charges.
- (g) Any prepayment penalty or other fee requirements should be detailed in the proposal.

**III. Evaluation of Proposals and Award:**

After the proposals are received, they will be evaluated by the officials of the County based on various factors, including the interest rate, redemption terms, additional covenants and terms, if any, and other conditions set forth therein. The County reserves the right to reject any and all bids or to waive irregularities in any proposal. The County expects to accept the successful proposal by 12:00 p.m. on \_\_\_\_\_, 2009.

**IV. Legal Opinion.** The execution and delivery of the Lease Agreement is subject to the approving opinion of the McNair Law Firm, P.A., Special Counsel.

**V. Tax Exemption and Other Tax Matters.** The Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), and the Treasury Regulations promulgated thereunder, imposes various restrictions, conditions and requirements relating to the excludability from gross income for federal income tax purposes of interest paid on obligations such as the Lease Agreement. The County will covenant to comply with certain covenants, restrictions, conditions and requirements designed to ensure that interest paid under the Lease Agreement will not become includable in gross income of the recipients thereof for federal income tax purposes. Failure to comply with these covenants could cause interest paid under the Lease Agreement to be included in gross income for federal income tax purposes retroactive to the date of issuance of the Lease Agreement.

The Code imposes an alternative minimum tax on a taxpayer's "alternative minimum taxable income" if the amount of such alternative minimum tax is greater than the amount of such taxpayer's regular income tax. The interest component of the Lease Agreement is not an item of tax preference for purposes of the federal alternative minimum tax imposed on individuals and corporations nor is such interest taken into account in determining adjusted current earnings for the purpose of computing the alternative minimum tax imposed on certain corporations.

The accrual or receipt of interest on the Lease Agreement may affect the federal income tax liability of the lessor. The extent of these other tax consequences will depend upon the recipient's particular tax status or other items of income or deduction. Purchasers of the Lease Agreement are advised to consult their tax advisors as to the tax consequences of purchasing or holding the Lease Agreement.

**VI. Investment Letter.** The lessor will be requested to execute a letter to the County in substantially the form submitted with this Request for Proposals.

**RESOLUTION 2009-05**

Resolution of the Oconee County Council

**WHEREAS**, The Congress of the United States has appropriated \$1.3 Million for a study to determine the need and feasibility of constructing an interstate highway (hereinafter referred to as "I-3") from Savannah, Georgia, to Knoxville, Tennessee; and

**WHEREAS**, I-3, if constructed would possibly traverse through or near Oconee County, South Carolina; and

**WHEREAS**, neither the State of South Carolina nor Oconee County was consulted beforehand on legislation introduced in the United States Congress by the Georgia Congressional Delegation, regarding the placement of an interstate highway through the Southern Appalachian mountains; and

**WHEREAS**, the construction of a new federal interstate highway through or in close proximity to Oconee County, South Carolina, would have a devastating environmental, economic, cultural and aesthetic impact on Oconee County, including the Sumter National Forest and the Blue Ridge Escarpment area; and

**WHEREAS**, Oconee County, South Carolina, a body politic and corporate and a political subdivision of the State of South Carolina, acting by and through its governing body, the Oconee County Council, prefers such monies be allocated for the repair of existing highway infrastructure, including unsafe bridges; and

**WHEREAS**, Oconee County is in support and solidarity with our neighboring counties and towns in northeast Georgia and western North Carolina, who have expressed their clear opposition to this interstate highway;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that Oconee County and the County Council of Oconee County, South Carolina are respectfully opposed to a federally-funded interstate corridor called I-3 (or any other name for such a corridor), are respectfully opposed to this use of federal funds to even support a study for such a corridor, and are respectfully opposed to such a corridor going in, through, or near Oconee County, South Carolina.

**THIS RESOLUTION WILL TAKE EFFECT** immediately upon enactment.

**RESOLUTION 2009-06**

(Oconee County Equipment Lease Purchase)

RELATING TO THE DECLARATION OF INTENT BY OCONEE COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA, TO REIMBURSE CERTAIN EXPENDITURES PRIOR TO THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY BY THE COUNTY OF AN EQUIPMENT LEASE PURCHASE AGREEMENT.

WHEREAS, the Internal Revenue Service and U.S. Treasury Department have promulgated Section 1.150-2 of the Treasury Regulations (the "Regulations") that authorizes an issuer to reimburse itself for expenditures made with respect to projects prior to the issuance of tax-exempt bonds for such projects; and

WHEREAS, the Regulations require that the governing body of the political subdivision declare an official intent to reimburse an expenditure prior to the incurrence of the expenditure; and

WHEREAS, Oconee County, South Carolina (the "County") anticipates incurring certain expenditures in an approximate amount of not exceeding \$340,000 (the "Expenditures") with respect to the acquisition of a fire truck (the "Project"), prior to the execution and delivery by the County of a tax-exempt equipment lease purchase agreement for such purpose.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the County Council of Oconee County, South Carolina, as follows:

Section 1. The County Council hereby declares that this Resolution shall constitute its declaration of official intent pursuant to Regulation § 1.150-2 to reimburse the County from the proceeds of a tax-exempt equipment lease purchase agreement to be entered into pursuant to Title 4, Chapter 9, Article 1, of the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, as amended, for Expenditures with respect to the Project.

Section 2. The County understands that Expenditures which may be reimbursed are limited to Expenditures which are (a) properly chargeable to capital account (or would be so chargeable with a proper election or with the application of the definition of placed in service under Regulation §1.150-2) under general federal income tax principles; or (b) certain de minimis or preliminary expenditures satisfying the requirements of Regulation §1.150-2(b).

Section 3. To be eligible for reimbursement of the Expenditures, the reimbursement allocation must be made not later than 18 months after the later of (a) the date on which the Expenditures were paid, or (b) the date the Project was placed in service, but in no event more than three (3) years after the original Expenditures.

Section 4. The source of funds for the Expenditures with respect to the Project will be the County's general fund.

Section 5. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption as provided by law. This Resolution shall be made available for inspection during normal business hours by the general public at the office of the Clerk to County Council.

Award the purchase of one used 2002 Terex 40 ton rigid frame back-dump haul truck model TR-40 for the Rock Quarry to Interstate Equipment Company, Columbia, SC, as the authorized dealer for Terex in the total amount of \$116,923 which includes a trade in amount of \$67,000.

Approval is also requested for the Rock Quarry Manager and Foreman to travel to Irvin, Texas to inspect the used Terex truck.

**BACKGROUND OR HISTORY:**

Currently the Rock Quarry utilizes two 40 ton Terex back-dump trucks on a daily basis. The Quarry also owns a 1989 Fuehd 25 ton back-dump truck and a 1994 Terex 35 ton back-dump truck. Both of these older trucks have been scheduled for replacement in the Rock Quarry's future capital improvement plan. If Oconee County purchased a new Terex 40 ton back-dump truck the estimated cost would be at least \$500,000. These two older back-dump trucks, a 1986 Caterpillar 980C loader and a 1982 Fiat FD30 crawler comprise the trade in of \$67,000. (See details in attachment) With the addition of the 2002 Terex 40 ton back-dump truck, all of the Rock Quarry's back-dump trucks would then be the same make and size. The two smaller trucks to be replaced are smaller in hauling capacity and utilizing three 40 ton Terex trucks would result in quicker turnaround to and from the crushing plant as well as savings in costs for fuel, tires, miscellaneous parts, one software program for trouble-shooting and better utilization of personnel.

**SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS OR CONCERNS:**

The quoted price for the used 2002 Terex 40 ton back-dump truck is good through March 31, 2009. This truck will then be scheduled for an overseas heavy equipment auction. Interstate Equipment Company has offered to pay the travel expenses of up to \$3,000 for personnel from the County to go to Irvin, Texas to inspect the truck which will be discounted from the cost of \$116,923. After inspection, if the County decides not to buy this truck then those travel expenses will be paid from the Rock Quarry Capital Equipment Replacement fund.

Does this request follow Procurement Ordinance #2001-15 guidelines? There is no ordinance that deals specifically with the purchase of used equipment. Interstate Equipment Company is the only authorized dealer in South Carolina for Terex and this purchase will therefore qualify as a sole source procurement under Procurement Ordinance 2001-15 guidelines.

**STAFF RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff recommends award of the purchase of one used 2002 Terex, TR-40 back-dump truck to Interstate Equipment Company, Columbia, SC as the authorized dealer for the discounted amount of \$116,923, less a trade in amount of \$67,000 for a total cost of \$116,923, providing the on-site inspection of the truck in Irvin, Texas is favorable.

**FINANCIAL IMPACT:**

The funding for this purchase will come from the budget line item: Capital Equipment Replacement (017-719-50841). Funds will be transferred from the Rock Quarry Investment Account to cover this purchase. The price of \$116,923 includes delivery from Irvin, Texas to the Rock Quarry, two-day set up by authorized Terex dealer, removal of all trade-in equipment and additional reimbursement of travel expenses up to \$3,000 for inspection, if truck is purchased.



Proposed Utica Mill Village Sewer CDBG Funded Project

**BACKGROUND OR HISTORY:**

The City of Seneca provides electricity and public water and sewer service to residents of Seneca and to the unincorporated population in close proximity to the City. In 2007, the City of Seneca worked to secure an \$870,000 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) from the SC Department of Commerce to upgrade the sewer service in the Utica Mill Village and to alleviate a documented health threat. SC Commerce administers the rural portion of the federal CDBG program in South Carolina. CDBG funded projects are designed to assist citizens who are considered to be "Low-to-Moderate income" (citizens who make 80% or less than the county median household income). CDBG funds are used in a variety of ways, including upgrading or expanding public water and sewer systems. The 2007 Utica Mill Sewer Project included the upgrade of the sewer system on four streets and due to the bids received on this project, several other streets have been added. The City of Seneca is committed to improving the quality of life of the residents of the Utica Mill Village by upgrading and modernizing the sewer system in the neighborhood.

Project Description

This proposed Utica project entails upgrading existing deteriorating sewer lines on three streets, by increasing the line size from 6 inch to 8 inch lines and moving the service connections to the front of the houses. There will be approximately 90 service line connections (the reconnection of the existing homes). There will be no cost to the residents for this improvement. All Low-to-Moderate Income (LMI) service connections will be covered by the grant funds and the City of Seneca will cover the non-LMI service connections. All construction will be done on public right-of-way. The total estimated cost for this project is \$500,000 and a 10% required match (\$50,000) will be paid for by the City.

Recent Rule Change by US HUD

The US Housing and Urban Development (HUD) administers the overall CDBG program. At the beginning of 2009, HUD mandated that all new H.U.D. funded projects are to be located inside the jurisdiction that has requested H.U.D. funds. The current Utica project is "grandfathered", but any new project would have to meet this new HUD requirement.

**SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS OR CONCERNs:**

Due to the HUD rule change, the City of Seneca cannot apply for CDBG funds to continue its sewer improvements in the Utica Mill Village. However, the City is committed to improving the sewer system in Utica. Therefore, the City of Seneca is requesting that Oconee County be the applicant for this proposed CDBG project and that the City and County enter into a sub-recipient agreement (should the project be funded) for administration of this project.



The Oconee County Sheriff's Office requests approval to apply for the FY 2009 Justice Assistance Grant Program (JAG).

**BACKGROUND OR HISTORY:**

The purpose of the JAG Program is to assist units of local government in carrying out specific programs which offer a high probability of improving the functioning of the criminal justice system. In accordance with the JAG, grant funds may be awarded for the purposes of: enforcing state and local laws that establish offenses similar to the offenses established in the Controlled Substances Act (21 USC § 801 et seq.); improving the functioning of the criminal justice system; and emphasizing prevention and control of violent crime and serious offenders. Grants may provide for personnel, equipment, training, technical assistance, and criminal justice information systems for the more widespread apprehension, prosecution, adjudication, detention and rehabilitation of persons who violate criminal laws.

This JAG has been supplemented through funding from H.R. 1 American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 ("The Stimulus Bill").

**SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS OR CONCERNS:**

This grant will be used to fund two new positions (Crime Scene/Forensic Investigator & Methamphetamine Enforcement Officer) at the Sheriff's Department. The matching requirement for this special JAG solicitation has been suspended and the grants will be awarded with 100% federal funds. Position expenses (salary, fringe, and benefits) as well as needed equipment are acceptable requests.

Projects may be funded on a yearly basis for a period not to exceed three years. *While there is never a guarantee of continuation of funding for any program or project, it has been our experience that funding continues for three years given proper grant administration.* For example, we held both a Criminal Domestic Violence Investigator Grant and Child Abuse Investigator Grant for a three year period.

Base annual salary = \$35,847

PORS retirement = \$3,961 ( $\text{formula} = .1105 \times \text{salary}$ )



I wanted to make you and your county officials aware of the Department of Justice grants being offered as a result of the passage of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act. The Oconee County Sheriff's Department has been allocated \$107,155 by the Department of Justice through the JAG Program. The county must apply for this money by May 18th, 2009. This grant can be used for anything related to law enforcement, including court security except the purchase of real estate, construction (except for improvements to existing prison buildings), armored vehicles, "bog money", fully automatic weapons.

To apply you must have a DUNS number and a Central Contractor Registration (CCR) number. If you do not have a DUNS number, you can apply by going to [www.duns.com](http://www.duns.com). At this late date you will need to take the option that allows you to get your number in less than 5 days. For a CCR number, you can apply at [www.ccr.gov](http://www.ccr.gov). To apply for the grant itself, you can go to <https://grants.ojp.usdoj.gov>.

The South Carolina Department of Public Safety has been awarded additional money for the state administered Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance (JAG) Program. These grants are competitive and applications can be submitted through April 1, 2009 by 3:00 p.m. Grant applications can be made electronically by going to [www.scdps.org/gpp](http://www.scdps.org/gpp), looking under Quick Links and clicking on the GMIS Login. There you can sign in and begin your grant applications.

Other competitive grant opportunities available are:

- COPS program - Can be used for hiring new police officers. Funding is in place for up to 3 years. The grant process will begin after March 31<sup>st</sup>. This is 100% funding - no matches required.
- VOCA grants - Victim Advocates Victim of Crime Act. This is a matching grant.
- VAWA grants - Violence Against Women Act. This is a 75%- 25% matching grant.
