## Oconce County Sheriff's Deputy Will Walk From the "Mountains to the Sea"

The mode of transportation will not be in a vehicle, on a train, or in an airplane, but will be accomplished via the oldest form of transportation known to man, walking.

During the 2013-14 school year in the next couple of months, Dukes will walk 10-12 miles per day on weekends, a trip that will start at the state line just above Bad Creek to the South Carolina Criminal Justice Academy on Broad River Road in Columbia, at walk of over 164 miles. Norm's wife will act as his pit crew, as she will drop him off in the morning and pick him up in the afternoon. Dukes plans to walk through the cities and towns of Clemson, Anderson, Honea Path, Ware Shoals, Laurens, Clinton, Joanna, Prosperity, Chapin, and Ballentine.

The goal of Deputy Dukes is to raise money to be split equally between the athletic programs and the special needs classes at Tamassee-Salem High School, which Dukes serves as School Resource Officer. Dukes says his goal this year is to raise \$4,000 in pledges and donations.

During the 2012-13 school year, Deputy Dukes walked along Scenic Highway 11 from exit 1, which is Highway 11 in Oconee County to Gaffney, a trip of 118 total miles that raised over \$2,200 in plodges. Anyone that is interested in making a donation or a pledge can do so by sending a check payable to Tamassee-Salem High School and make sure to include MTNS – TO –THE-Sea on the check. # Tamassee-Salem SRO to begin 'Mountains to the Sea' walk

TAMASSEE — Norman Dukes, Tamassez-Salem Middle and High School resource officer, said his 118-mile fundraiser walk last year was so successful, he is going to use his legs and feet again this year.

Next month, Dukes will start the first phase of a two-year effort he is calling "The Mountains to the Sea." Phase I, primarily in December and January, will begin at the North Carolina line above the Bad Creek pump storage unit on S.C. Highway 130 and the 164.2 mile effort will conclude at the Sonth Carolina Criminal Justice Academy in Columbia.

"My wife (Delane) will be my pit crew again this year, dropping me off each morning and picking me up in the afternoon." Dukes said. "I will walk through Clemson, Anderson, Honea Poth, Ware Shoals, Laurens, Clinton, Joanna, Prosperity, Chapin and Ballentine."

During last year's initial walk, which covered five councies starting at S.C. Highway 11 from Exit 1 to I-85 in Gaffney, Dukes raised more than \$2,200 in pledges. Dukes came up with the walk concept as a fundraising effort to assist transition teacher Stephanie Brewer, who was seeking transportation for her students to programs and activities throughout the area.

The walk took a little longer than expected as Dukes experienced knee problems as well as weather difficulties. But he was able to complete his trek four months later and the money raised exceeded his original goal of \$1,380. Dukes said support

was provided not only by the Tamassee-Salem faculty, but also outside sources including law enforcement agencies in Greenville and Spartanburg and the Greer Police Department where he once worked.

This year, Dukes is planning to increase his fundraising goal to \$4,000 in pledges and donations - splitting the proceeds between the special needs transition class and the stbletic department.

"Tamassee-Salem High School has no foot ball team or wrestling team, unlike West Oak, Walhalla and Seneca," Dukes explained, "The Tamassee-Salem varsi ty basebell and softball teams went to the state playoffs last year and travel costs were almost \$2,000."




# **Rear Elevation**






# Main Level Floor plan

# Oconee named top 10 county for job seekers

#### . THE JOURNAL STAFF

A recently released report from NerdWallet named Oconee County as one of the best places n South Carolina for job seekers.

Oconee County was anked ahead of No. 10 Anderson County and betind No. 8 Pickens Couny. Lexington County was anked first on the list, with Greenville County ranked No. 5.

NerdWallet, a personal finance and consumer advocacy website, asked three fundamental questions when evaluating the state to gauge the top locations for job seekers: 1. Is the county growing? 2. Can you afford to live in the county comfortably? 3. Are most people employed? Oconee was ranked ninth and saw a 4.9 percent increase in the working-age population from 2009 to 2011. Households earned a median income of \$42,641, with homeowner costs of \$1,086 a month and an unemployment rate of 7.5 percent as of October 2013.

Pickens County saw a 3 percent increase in the working-age population between 2009 and 2011, and its unemployment rate was 7.4 percent. Households in Pickens earned a median income of \$42,241, with homeowner costs of \$1,071 a month.

"Workers are attracted to Oconee County's growing economy," NerdWallet analyst Annie Wang said. "The county has seen a large working-age population increase over the last few years. The county has strong energy and manufacturing industries, with top employers such as Duke Energy and BorgWarner. Oconee County and the entire northwestern region of South Carolina is seeing rapid growth, and we think the 'Golden Corner' is where workers should be looking right now." Richard Blackwell,

executive director of the

Oconee County Economic Development Commission, said he was not surprised by the report results.

"It is great to see that others notice the potential Oconee County has," Blackwell said. "Our economy is becoming more diverse, and we must do everything possible to keep our momentum building towards creating more jobs for the citizens of our community."

MEMORANDUM

December 9, 2013

TO: Mr. Robert C. Winchester, Executive Director, Oconee Joint Regional Sewer Authority

FROM: Lowell W. Ross, Attorney for the Authority

This is in response to your inquiry regarding the legal status of Oconee Joint Regional Sewer Authority ("Authority") and whether Oconee County has any regulatory power over the Authority or whether the County can designate a representative to serve on the Board of the Authority.

The Authority" . . [S]hall have all the rights and powers of a <u>public body politic and</u> <u>corporate</u> of this State, necessary or convenient to carry out the provisions of this chapter, including, without limitation, the power or right to: (1) have perpetual succession; (2) sue and be sued; (3) adopt, use, and alter a corporate seal; (4) maintain a principal office; (5) make bylaws for the management and regulation of its affairs; . . ." and the other powers outlined in Section 6-25-100, Title 6, Chapter 25, South Carolina Code of Laws ("The Act"). The Authority is an independent unit of government, not subject to regulation or control by the County.

The members of the Board of the Authority are appointed pursuant to the provisions of Section 6-25-60(A) of The Act. Each member (City) of the Authority shall appoint a commissioner pursuant to Section 6-25-50(A) to serve as a commissioner of the joint system. The Agreement of the member Cities designated the composition of the Board in Article V "COMMISSION" which specifies that Seneca shall appoint 4 Commissioners, Walhalla 2, Westminster 2 and 1 commissioner shall be jointly appointed by Walhalla and Westminster. Genesis Documents -filed with the records of Oconee County in Deed Book 1709, page 5 - (page 83 of 139).

There is no provision for the appointment of a Commissioner by Oconee County.

# STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA OCONEE COUNTY ORDINANCE 2013-36

AN ORDINANCE TO CONDITION FUTURE PAYMENTS TO THE OCONEE JOINT REGIONAL SEWER AUTHORITY ON THE RECEIPT AND SUFFICIENCY OF DETAILED INVOICES FROM THE OCONEE JOINT REGIONAL SEWER AUTHORITY; TO FORMALLY REQUEST THAT A MEMBER OF THE OCONEE COUNTY COUNCIL AND THE OCONEE COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR REPRESENT OCONEE COUNTY AT ANY AND ALL FUTURE MEETINGS OF THE OCONEE JOINT REGIONAL SEWER AUTHORITY; AND OTHER MATTERS RELATED THERETO.

WHEREAS, Oconee County, South Carolina (the "County"), a body politic and corporate and a political subdivision of the State of South Carolina (the "State"), acting by and through its governing body, the Oconee County Council (the "County Council"), has previously adopted multiple ordinances for the effective, efficient governance of the County, which, subsequent to adoption, are codified in the Oconee County Code of Ordinances (the "County Code"), as amended, from time to time; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the authority established in Article VIII, Section 13 of the State Constitution, and particularly the authority established in Section 6-1-20 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, as amended (the "Code"), local governments, including counties, municipalities, and governmental entities, may enter into intergovernmental agreements (the "Agreement") with each other to provide joint public facilities and services when considered mutually desirable; and,

WHEREAS, the Oconee Joint Regional Sewer Authority (The "OJRSA") is a governmental entity and body politic of the State created by an Agreement entered into between the Cities of Seneca, Walhalla, and Westminster (collectively the "Parties"), pursuant to Chapter 25 of Title 6 of the Code (the "Joint Authority Water and Sewer Systems Act"), and is authorized to engage in the collection for treatment of wastewater; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 6-25-100(11) of the Joint Authority Water and Sewer Systems Act, the OJRSA has the power to make contracts and execute instruments or documents necessary or convenient to carry on the business of the OJRSA; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 4-9-30(3) of the Code, and particularly Section 6-25-30(C) of the Joint Authority Water and Sewer Systems Act, the County, within the authority granted by the State Constitution and the Joint Authority Water and Sewer Systems Act, and subject to the general laws of this State, has the power to make and execute contracts and Agreements with the OJRSA; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the foregoing authorities, the OJRSA and the County, through authorization from their respective governing bodies, as required by the Code, previously authorized and executed several Agreements (the "Genesis Documents"), that among other things, set forth certain rights, privileges, duties, and obligations of the Parties with regard to each other; and, WHEREAS, since the execution and delivery of the Genesis Documents, time has passed and events have occurred that raised questions, on the County's part, regarding the governance of the OJRSA - these items of concern include, without limitation: voting rights issues, project approval, County funding, use of County funds in the manner and for the purposes listed in the Genesis Documents, County participation, management succession, legal representation, master planning, and accounting policies (the "Governance Concerns"); and,

WHEREAS, the voters of Oconee County, voting in a public referendum during the general election of 2012, overwhelmingly approved the use, by the County of <u>ad valorem</u> tax dollars to contract and operate a County sewer utility, thereby completely obviating the original need for the OJRSA, from the County's perspective; and,

WHEREAS, debt obligations originally belonging to the Oconee County Sewer Commission, which were one of the justifications for the payment of an annual amount of Six Hundred and Ten Thousand Dollars (\$610,000.00) (the "Annual Payment") from the County to the OJRSA, to be used by the OJRSA <u>exclusively</u> for sewer projects in the unincorporated portion of the County, have long since been retired; and,

WHEREAS, the Annual Payment has been made by the County faithfully since 2008, but the County has never received a complete and accurate accounting for the use of those funds, despite many oral and written requests therefore; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the foregoing authorities and because of Governance Concerns, and the other reasons noted, the County, through authorization from its governing body, as required by the Code, intends to condition any and all future payments of the Annual Payment and all other County payments to the OJRSA, pending the timely receipt and sufficiency, in the County's reasonable determination, of detailed invoice(s) from the OJRSA, listing the uses of such monies in the unincorporated areas of the County and giving a complete, detailed accounting of all such uses for all Annual Payments, from the outset to date, all subject to the sole reasonable approval of the County Council; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the foregoing authorities and because of Governance Concerns, the County, through authorization from its governing body, as required by the Code, further intends to direct the County Administrator to formally request of the governing body of the OJRSA that the County be represented by a member of the County Council and the County Administrator at any and all future OJRSA meetings to address the County's Governance Concerns, before all future Annual Payments are made:

**NOW, THEREFORE**, it is hereby ordained by the Oconee County Council, in meeting duly assembled that:

1. The statements of fact and policy from the preamble of this Ordinance are hereby adopted, as findings of fact, by the County Council, in their entirety, and are hereby adopted by reference, as part of the ordaining language of this Ordinance as fully as if set forth verbatim herein. It is the specific intent of the County Council to enact an ordinance that is fully authorized by the law and Constitution of the State, and is consistent with and does not violate State law.

- 2. The County, through the authorization of the County Council, hereby instructs the County Administrator to condition any and all future payments to the OJRSA, including, without limitation, payment of the Annual Payment, pending the timely receipt and sufficiency, in the County's reasonable determination, of detailed invoice(s) from the OJRSA, listing the uses of such monies in the unincorporated areas of the County and giving a complete, detailed accounting of all such uses for all Annual Payments, from the outset to date, all subject to the sole, reasonable approval of the County Council.
- 3. The County, through the authorization of the County Council, hereby directs the County Administrator to formally request of the governing body of the OJRSA that the County be represented by a member of the County Council and the County Administrator at any and all future OJRSA meetings to address the County's Governance Concerns, before all future Annual Payments are made.
- 4. The County Administrator is hereby authorized and directed to take any and all actions required of the County, or that he may deem desirable in his sole discretion, to give effect to the acts of the County Council as contemplated herein.
- 5. Should any part or provision of this Ordinance be deemed unconstitutional or unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such determination shall not affect the rest and remainder of this Ordinance, all of which is hereby deemed separable.
- 6. All ordinances, orders, resolutions, and actions of the County Council inconsistent herewith are, to the extent of such inconsistency only, hereby repealed, revoked, and rescinded.
- 7. All other terms, provisions, and parts of the County Code not amended hereby, directly or by implication, shall remain in full force and effect.
- 8. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after the third reading and the public hearing and enactment by the County Council in accordance with the County Code.

# STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA COUNTY OF OCONEE ORDINANCE 2013-32

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND OCONEE COUNTY ORDINANCE 2013-01 "AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH THE BUDGET FOR OCONEE COUNTY AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE LEVY OF TAXES FOR ORDINARY COUNTY PURPOSES, FOR THE TRI-COUNTY TECHNICAL COLLEGE SPECIAL REVENUE FUND, FOR THE EMERGENCY SERVICES PROTECTION SPECIAL REVENUE FUND, FOR THE ROAD MAINTENANCE SPECIAL REVENUE FUND, FOR THE VICTIM SERVICES SPECIAL REVENUE FUND, FOR THE BRIDGE AND CULVERT CAPITAL PROJECT FUND, FOR THE GENERAL CAPITAL PROJECT FUND, AND FOR THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CAPITAL PROJECT FUND, ALL IN OCONEE COUNTY FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2013 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2014" IN CERTAIN LIMITED REGARDS AND PARTICULARS, ONLY; AND OTHER MATTERS RELATED THERETO

WHEREAS, Oconee County, South Carolina (the "County"), a body politic and corporate and a political subdivision of the State of South Carolina (the "State"), acting by and through its duly elected County Council (the "County Council"), has heretofore adopted and enacted Oconee County Ordinance 2013-01, "An Ordinance to establish the budget for Oconee County and to provide for the levy of taxes for ordinary county purposes, for the Tri-County Technical College Special Revenue Fund, for the Emergency Services Protection Special Revenue Fund, for the Road Maintenance Special Revenue Fund, for the Victim Services Special Revenue Fund, for the Bridge and Culvert Capital Project Fund, for the General Capital Project Fund and for the Economic Development Capital Project Fund, all in Oconee County for the Fiscal Year beginning July 1, 2013 and ending June 30, 2014" (the "Budget Ordinance"); and

WHEREAS, Oconee County has installed, or is the process of installing a Metro Ethernet, known as Oconee FOCUS, pursuant, in part, to a federal grant, and will provide services from that ethernet to other providers, for a fee, who will then provide direct service ("Last Mile") to users in Oconee County; and

WHEREAS, Oconee County and Oconee FOCUS are not a "Common Carrier", as defined in Federal telecommunications law, and will not be a Common Carrier and do not wish to become a Common Carrier, with respect to Oconee FOCUS, and therefore will individually negotiate every contract for service or services with respect to Oconee FOCUS; and

WHEREAS, County Council desires to establish the parameters and guidelines under which pricing will be established for negotiated contracts for service and services under Oconee FOCUS, and delegate to the Oconee County Administrator the direction and authority to implement those parameters and guidelines and to negotiate and to execute such individually negotiated contracts on behalf of Oconee County; and

WHEREAS, Attachment A to the Budget Ordinance is the list of Council-approved provisos to the Budget Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the County needs to amend Attachment A to the Budget Ordinance, in order to add a proviso (Section 18, currently), including the parameters and guidelines to be used by the Oconee County Administrator in negotiating and executing the individually negotiated contracts under Oconee FOCUS, as an attachment to such Provisos; and

WHEREAS, Oconee County, acting by and through the Oconee County Council, therefore desires to amend Attachment A to the Budget Ordinance to include a proviso (Section 18, currently), including the parameters and guidelines to be used by the Oconee County Administrator in negotiating and executing the individually negotiated contracts under Oconee FOCUS reflected in the attachment to this Ordinance, as an attachment to such Provisos; and to direct and authorize the Oconee County Administrator to individually negotiate and execute individual contracts under Oconee FOCUS in accordance with the proviso (Section 18, currently) to Attachment A of the Budget Ordinance and the attachment to this Ordinance:

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby ordained, by Oconee County Council, in meeting duly assembled that:

1. Attachment A to the Budget Ordinance is hereby amended by adding a new proviso ((Section 18, currently) and attachment thereto) to the Budget Ordinance in the form and contents of the attachment to this Ordinance.

2. The Oconee County Administrator is hereby authorized and directed to negotiate and execute individually negotiated contracts for Oconee FOCUS in accordance with this Ordinance and its Attachments.

3. Oconee County and Oconee FOCUS are not and are not to become "Common Carriers" for the purposes of Federal telecommunications law or any other law.

4. All other parts, terms, and provisions of the Budget Ordinance, including all attachments thereto, not otherwise specifically amended, directly or by implication, by this Ordinance, remain in full force and effect.

5. All other parts and provisions of the Oconee County Code of Ordinances not amended hereby, either explicitly or by implication, remain in full force and effect.

6. Should any part or provision of this Ordinance be deemed unconstitutional or unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such determination shall not affect the rest and remainder of this Ordinance, all of which is hereby deemed separable.

7. All ordinances, orders, resolutions, and actions of Oconee County Council inconsistent herewith are, to the extent of such inconsistency only, hereby repealed, revoked, and rescinded.

8. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after third reading and enactment by Oconee County Council.

The new proviso Section 18 to be added to Attachment A ("Provisos") of Oconee County Ordinance 2013-01, will read as follows:

**Section 18.** The Oconee County Administrator is authorized and directed to negotiate and execute, on behalf of Oconee County, South Carolina, a body politic and corporate and a political subdivision of the State of South Carolina, individually negotiated contracts for service and services under Oconee FOCUS, in accordance with the parameters and guidelines attached to these provisos as Attachment 2 (to the provisos (Attachment A) of the Oconee County budget ordinance).

#### Oconee County Pricing Considerations August 27, 2013 Rev 2

### Goals

Priced low enough to:

- Encourage providers to leverage Oconee FOCUS assets to deliver new services.
- Lower market entry barriers for new and alternative providers.
- Make retail services competitive with other regions of the country.
- Enable the provider to obtain sufficient margins to cover their operating expenses and provide a reasonable profit.

Priced high enough to:

- Generate sufficient revenues to cover ongoing operations and maintenance expenses.
- Generate sufficient revenues to repay \$3.8 million in matching funds expended by Oconee County.
  - If anchors are not charged for services, avoided costs (based on market rates for received services) need to count against the matching funds.
- Cover incremental operation and maintenance (O&M) and equipment costs.

### **Base Service**

The base service provided by Oconee FOCUS is a Metro Ethernet with the following options:

- Port Rates of 1Gbps or 10Gbps
- Committed Interface Rates (CIR) for transport of 50 Mbps, 100 Mbps, 250 Mbps, 500 Mbps, 1 Gbps, and 10 Gbps
- Virtual Private Network (VPN) based on various best effort and CIR transport rates.
- Distance of circuit demarcation to hub or other customer site. Typical prices based on 0 to 10 miles, 11 to 25 miles, 26 to 35 miles, and 36 to 50 miles.
- Access to commodity Internet bandwidth

In addition Oconee FOCUS can provide a Passive Optical Network (PON) port for providers serving residential or small commercial with their own last-mile connection.

### Considerations

- 1. Each contract must be individually negotiated. Oconee FOCUS does not publish or follow set "rates".
- Oconee FOCUS prices are "wholesale", and must consider the Internet Service Provider (ISP) expenses and profit when doing a comparison to "retail" services in Oconee County and other regions.

- 3. Other firm's tariffs provide a general idea of what pricing is, but will tend to overstate actual negotiated contracts.
- 4. Cost-based calculations conducted for Oconee County provide a starting point for contract discussions.
- 5. Connection costs must be considered for all connection agreements.

Oconee County Staff will calculate and maintain illustrative examples, for use by the Oconee County Administrator in Oconee FOCUS contract negotiations and discussions (each of which will be individually done and each of which will be proprietary information, of the County and of the other party to each contract) of prices charged in similar markets for similar services.

Further the calculated pricing will not include initial set up fees, drop costs, or CPE costs. These costs should be included in the set-up fee and based on a cost plus calculation.

In addition, the Oconee County Administrator may take other pricing considerations into account, as long as they are consistent with the goals and conditions of these guidelines.

## STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA COUNTY OF OCONEE

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2013, by and between OCONEE COUNTY, South Carolina (hereinafter "the COUNTY") and, Thrift Development, Inc. (hereafter "the CONTRACTOR").

### 1. SCOPE OF WORK

a. For and in consideration of the Lump sum prices hereinafter specified, (see Attachment A Bid Form), CONTRACTOR agrees to perform on behalf of the COUNTY certain road construction and asphalt surfacing at the direction of Oconee County, the total of such work not to exceed \$311,844.35 dollars. The Roads and Bridges Manager of Oconee County shall elect roads to be constructed by the CONTRACTOR at the prices stated in the contractor's bid proposal.

#### 2. PROGRESS PAYMENTS

Payments are to be made for work described above on the tenth (10th) day of the month or as mutually agreed to in writing by the County and the Contractor. However, CONTRACTOR agrees to pay, as liquidated damages, the sum of one thousand (\$1000.00) dollars per day for all days in excess of agreed completion date listed below under Section 3, Contract Period.

The COUNTY shall retain 10% of all payments to insure payments insure full compliance with the contract.

#### 3. CONTRACT PERIOD

The Contract Period and effective term of the Agreement shall run on or about January 13, 2014, until June 30, 2014, unless the parties mutually agree in writing to extend the same.

#### 4. OBLIGATIONS OF CONTRACTOR

- a. The CONTRACTOR shall furnish, for a contract price specified herein, all labor, materials, equipment, machinery and supplies necessary to perform and complete construction and asphalt surfacing of the roads according to the general plans and specifications, to cause to be paid subcontractors, material, men and suppliers for such equipment, as well as any lessors thereof.
- b. CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all Federal, state and local laws and regulations with regard to road construction and paving.
- c. CONTRACTOR shall employ certified personnel and equipment to prepare daily analysis reports that provide information regarding plant mix, including bitumen content, gradation, marshal stability. The COUNTY shall be supplied with a copy of this daily analysis report. If CONTRACTOR is running State work and COUNTY work simultaneously, the CONTRACTOR will submit a copy of the State's analysis report in lieu of a separate report for the COUNTY work. COUNTY reserves the right, at its discretion, to employ a qualified independent testing agency to perform testing at the plant site or from the product delivered to the job site, using

CONTRACTOR'S equipment at no additional cost to the COUNTY, to verify that specified mix design is being batched.

- d. Prior to any payments, CONTRACTOR will furnish to the COUNTY a performance bond and payment surety in the penal sum of \$311,844.35 dollars issued by a good and sufficient surety company licensed to do business in the State of South Carolina. Said bond shall be acquired by the CONTRACTOR at its own expense and provide appropriate provisions warranting that the construction and work performed by the CONTRACTOR or its employees or subcontractors shall be free of defects in workmanship and materials for a period of one (1) year from date of acceptance of the total contract by the COUNTY.
- e. CONTRACTOR will furnish to the COUNTY proof to the satisfaction of the County that the CONTRACTOR is licensed to do business in the State of South Carolina.
- f. CONTRACTOR shall submit proof of valid policies currently in force for worker's compensation insurance for all employees of the CONTRACTOR, as well as public liability insurance of at least \$2,000,000 limit.
- g. CONTRACTOR shall furnish at all times in all phases of construction qualified key personnel including, but not limited to, operators, laborers, one foreman, plus sufficient trucks and drivers.
- h. CONTRACTOR may assign only one crew at a time per road to COUNTY work, unless approved by the Oconee County Roads and Bridges Manager at least 24-hours prior to second crew beginning work. No asphalt work is authorized without an Oconee County Inspector on site. Any work done without an Oconee County Inspector present is subject to removal and replacement solely at the CONTRACTOR'S expense.

# 5. DUTIES AND OBLIGATIONS OF THE COUNTY

- a. COUNTY shall pay CONTRACTOR for work and service performed by it according to the provisions of this agreement in the manner specified herein.
- b. The COUNTY warrants that it has sufficient and valid right-of-ways for the roads upon which CONTRACTOR is to perform services. The COUNTY will, on a regular basis, consult with and be available for direction and designation of work to be done according to the terms of the Agreement, in such a matter as to prevent undue stoppage or delay of work on the part of the CONTRACTOR.
- c. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this agreement, the parties understand and agree that nothing herein shall require the COUNTY to designate any specific amount of work for the CONTRACTOR and its crew to perform and may elect to work or cause to be reworked only such of its roads as it deems to be in the best interests and needs, not to exceed the maximum contract sum specified herein, all without the consent of the CONTRACTOR.

# 6. GOVERNING LAW

- a. The parties mutually agree that the terms and conditions hereof shall be governed by and construed under the laws of the State of South Carolina, and that any controversy hereunder shall be submitted to and come within the jurisdiction of the Courts of Oconee County, S.C.
- b. The specifications and bid package #13-07, which was duly awarded by the Oconee County Council are hereby made an integral part of this contract by reference and is to be adhered to unless specifically altered by this contract.

TO ALL OF WHICH the parties have heretofore agreed, and in witness whereof have hereunto placed their Seals and cause these present to be executed by their officers and agents authorized to do so this date and date first above written.
