  - Mr. Jamie Gilbert-Oconee Economic Alliance
    - i. Recognizes the importance of Agriculture to the local economy
    - Mainly work with industrial and manufacturing companies.
       Recruitment, negotiations, etc.
      - 1. Crystal geyser-bottled water
      - 2. Mine America-poultry processing equipment company opening a distribution (and potentially manufacturing) facility in the county
      - 3. Attending the poultry expo show next year to recruit poultry equipment companies
      - 4. John Deere, CAT, Komoto suppliers in the county

- iii. Would like to have a discussion about what the Ag Board would like to see
  - Ms. Alexander-offload grain site on the rail site in Seneca.
     There are also potential possibilities that could come with the establishment of the Poultry Research Center in Clemson.
  - 2. Mr. Whiten- satellite location for Trucks on 59 with grain storage, cotton gins, fertilizer storage
  - 3. Mr. Owens- The Canton Mill closing has had a detrimental impact on the timber market. Recently, there was a shortage of milk cartons that affected schools across the county. The Canton Mill produced the paper for the milk cartons.
  - 4. The general consensus of the Ag Board is that the timber industry would also like to see some form of energy production through wood as fuel.
  - Recruitment and Expansion of companies is what Economic Development is good at. There needs to be a partnership with folks who are educated on matters of Agriculture in order to be most effective.
  - 6. There is some interest in the county for a biodiesel plant. Economic development would support a biodiesel plant and poultry processing as long as there is a viable location.
  - 7. Beef and pork processing is also a pressing issue
  - 8. Mr. Blanton-what is the possibility of having an ag person on the economic development board?
    - a. Ask Amanda Brock or County Council
  - Mr. Blanton-signage for the promotion of agriculture in the County-Agriculture produces 159 million in revenue every vear.

# Oconee 2017 Ag Census

updated data should be released very soon

- 815 Farms (down 8% from 2012)
- 62,499 Acres in farmland (also down 8% from 2012)
- Avg. Farm size, 77 acres
- Value of Farm Products Sold: \$159,422,000!
  - Increase of 31% since 2012 (this is a volatile number because of markets, quantities are a much better number to look at vs. values).
- As of 2017 Ag Census:
  - Over 7.2 million Broilers
  - Over 14,500 Cattle and Calves
  - About 50,000 layers



# Present Challenges to the Ag & Timber Industry

- Development
  - According to Global Ag Productivity 175 Acres is lost every hour!
     According to DTN: 1.9 million acres were lost in 2022 alone.
  - How to maintain land values, providing for the farmers and maintain the rural character? Proper Land Use Zoning, Conservation Easements/PDRs, more stringent regulation/requirements for development, larger minimum land requirements per new house
- Ag Risks: Market Price Risk, Legal/Regulation, Human Risk, Production Risk
  - Education and habit changes
  - Economic Development to build and expand the ag infrastructure.
    - Mills, processing facility(ies), agrotourism, etc.
