Regular Meeting May 23, 2024

- B. Region 2 Squads 2 & 6 (Tammy Wilbanks)
  - 1) Rescue 2 Two new members and one applicant; everything going well
  - 2) Rescue 6 Gator and Suburban running again; event had a decent turnout; no new members
- C. Region 3 Squads 4 & 5 (Brady Land)
  - 1) Rescue 4 Nothing to report
  - 2) Rescue 5 Getting new members
- D. Region 4 Squad 22 (Phyllis Raver) absent; Mike Carroll reported 4 new EMRs for total of 13
- E. Region 5 Squads 7 & 8 (Steve Zahn)
  - 1) Rescue 7 Busy season has begun; mutual aid call in Pickens and a carryout from Chau Ram; still not good response from members
