Community Development:

Relicensing:

•The relicensing is for the Keowee-Toxaway Hydro Electric Project (the nuclear station is licensed separately)

•Representatives of stakeholders began discussions aimed at developing an Agreement In Principle covering the elements of a new license in 2009

•The goal was to develop consensus on a balanced proposal—all interests would to the extent possible be addressed

•The draft Agreement in Principle will be complete later this month, with all stakeholders (including Oconee County) taking it under consideration

•After the Agreement in Principle is signed this summer, it will be used as a framework for creating a Relicensing Agreement scheduled to be signed in November of this year

•The Relicensing Agreement will be filed with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) as part of the relicensing process
