# Presidential Message Commemorating the 50th Anniversary of World War II

Fifty years ago, this nation was at war.

Fifty years ago, Americans fought along side men and women from 32 other countriesallied together against clearly defined forces of evil and tyranny.

Fifty years ago, those who stayed behind to fight the battle on the home front had no doubts about the rightness of our cause and had no hesitance about rising to the occasion.

Everyone, from our industrial leaders, to our mothers and sisters—who overnight became a battalion of "Rosie the riveters,"—everyone committed themselves to a world they knew was worth saving; to values they knew were worth preserving.

Fifty years ago, Americans fought and won that war. And when our men and women came home to rejoin those who had fought the war with them, they were hailed as heroes-not fighting for empire or treasure, but fighting for freedom against what was wrong, and for what was right.

The wrong was Hitler and the Blitzkrieg, his maniacal war of expansion. The wrongs were the concentration camps and the willful extermination of millions of human beings. The wrongs were the attacks on Pearl Harbor, the death marches in the Philippines, and the enslavement of defenseless nations.

The right, was a free world's belief in the human spirit and liberty, and the just plain down home concept of human decency.

There is an American tradition, and it comes out of the farm country of the south, and the open spaces of the far west, out of the cities of the east, and the factory towns of the midwest, and that is the tradition of standing up for human decency. That's what World War II was all about. That is it's legacy, and as we commemorate the 50th Anniversary of that war and it's victory, I hope all Americans will rededicate themselves to learning from the lessons of that fateful conflict and reaffirm the values of human decency.

In the next two years, Hillary, Tipper, Al and I, hope to join all of you in playing a part in the commemorative events marking the 50th Anniversary of World War II. I've asked the Secretary of Defense to coordinate the events of the 50th Anniversary, and I urge all veteran, government, civic, business and social organizations to join together in demonstrating that a grateful nation remembers.

They who stood their ground before us have guaranteed us a right to enjoy being part of the land of the free. It is both appropriate and necessary that we remember and thank them.

Dear Supervisor & Council Members:

A few months ago I wrote a memo to you stating that our part-time funds were getting low and I was trying to watch our part-time budget line carefully so as not to work into a deficit. This part-time budget was cut last year from \$25,000 to \$10,000. I did not appeal because I was off the board for almost three months.

Be aware there will be primaries, runoffs, and a special election around September 27th to fill the senate seat. Absentee precincts are already established, as of January 1st. We have Republican, Democratic, special election and General Election absentee precincts already established. There will be one maybe two watershed districts established, house district lines may be changed in Oconee County. The state has mentioned that the boards stay open from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM two Saturdays before an election. We members of the state SCARE Executive Committee are fighting this. I have tried to speak to the mandated laws that are passed on to the counties to fund. I have tried my best.

We will need an additional \$1,500 in our part-time account to continue to operate. We will only use what is needed. This is to finish out this budget year.

Mrs. Louise Gaillard, Board Member, will appear before you in my place. Jean Ward and I will be in Columbia attending sessions on absentee voting.


FLOOR PLAN - ELECTRICAL


