MINUTES, OCONEE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING

The regular meeting of the Oconee County Council was held Tuesday, February 7, 1995 at 7:00 pm in Council Chambers with all Council Members except Mrs. Burrell present. Mr. Cain, County Attorney was also present.

Members of the press notified (by mail): Journal/Tribune, Keowee Courier, Westminster News, Anderson Independent, Greenville News, WGOG Radio, WBFM Radio, WCCP Radio, WZLI/WLET Radio, WYFF TV, WLOS TV & SC Black Media Group.

Press

Members of the press present: Ashton Hester - Keowee Courier, Dick Mangrum - WGOG Radio, Jennifer Barnett - Anderson Independent & Alan Adams - Journal/Tribune.

The meeting was called to order by Supervisor Call to -Chairman Crain who welcomed the guests and media. Order

The invocation was given by Mr. Strickland.

Invocation

Mr. Orr made a motion, seconded by Mr. Strickland, approved 4 - 0 (Ms. Burrell absent) that the minutes of the January 17, 1995 be adopted as printed.

Minutes

Mr. Cain, County Attorney, informed Council that the matter of Eagle Ridge (formerly known as Hidden Glenn) was scheduled to be heard by Judges Eppes Wednesday, February 8, 1995 at 2:30 pm in the main courtroom.

Eagle Ridge

Dr. Ed Byars informed Council that he hoped the matter would be laid to rest on Wednesday and the Judge would see fit to sign the consent order.

Mr. Strickland stated that the private airstrip was built without permission, Mr. Wulff who retired from the FAA after thirty (30) years, had informed Council that on a scale from 1 - 10, 10 being the highest, the safety of the airport would rate a level of five (5) and if Eagle Ridge was allowed to fly the safety level would drop to a level of two (2). He further stated that if the Judge signs the consent order he has no other choice but to go along with the Judge's decision.

To Mr. Strickland's inquiry, Dr. Byars replied that he had been fined by the FAA.

Mr. Cain further informed Council that Counsel for Dr. Byars had been in touch with the Chief Administrative Judge and he is in agreement for Judge Eppes to hear the matter.

At the request of Mr. Bob Busch, Law Enforcement Director, and Mr. Blake Taylor, Jr., Division Director, Inspections, Safety, and Inmate Affairs, Mr. Hamilton made a motion, seconded by Mr. Strickland, approved 4 - 0 (Ms. Burrell absent) that the SC Department of Corrections conduct a study to determine the number of personnel required to provide twenty-four (24) hour supervision and processing of inmates and to arrange full coverage of all designated security posts.

LEC

Upon request of Mr. Robert Winchester, Sewer Commission Director and Mr. Robert Gaillard, Planning Commission Director, Mr. Strickland made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hamilton, Grants approved 4 - 0 (Ms. Burrell absent) that the County apply for CDBG & ARC Grants in the approximate amount of \$618,850 for the expansion of a sewer line to serve Greenfield Industries. There are no local funds involved in these grants.

CDBG & ARC

Upon recommendation of Mr. Robert Winchester, Beacon Sewer Commission Director, Mr. Lamar Bailes, Sewer Commission Finance Chairman, and Mr. Tommy Crumpton, Sewer Commission Member, Mr. Strickland made a motion, seconded by Mr. Orr, approved 4 - 0 (Ms. Burrell absent) that the attached Amendment to Agreement and Consent Order by and between the Oconee County Sewer Commission and Beacon Manufacturing Company, Westminster, Oconee County, South Carolina, Oconee County Sewer Permit No. OC-000008 be adopted.

After considerable discussion, Mr. Hamilton made a motion, seconded by Mr. Williams, approved 4 - 0 (Ms. Burrell absent) that it be clarified and affirmed that Council's approval of the purchase of the sludge drying machine is made with the understanding and is expressly contingent upon Council's right to acquire this sludge at any point in the future without cost to Oconee County if deemed needed for any governmental purpose.

Sewer Commission

Ms. Linda Martin of A Community for an Alternative Waste Site, informed Council that they would like to re-schedule addressing Council as Dr. David L. Barkley and Dr. Kerry R. Brooks had been unable to attend the meeting.

Regional Landfill

Upon recommendation of Mr. Michael Willimon, Aeronautics Commission Chairman, & Mr. Barry Wood, Aeronautics Director, Mr. Strickland made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hamilton, approved 4 - 0 (Ms. Burrell absent) that approximately \$3,000 be taken from the local funds budgeted for a terminal building and a purchase order be issued to Talbert & Bright for a Preliminary: Engineer's Report for the purposes of obtaining a grant for the proposed terminal building at the airport.

Aeronautics

Also at the request of Mr. Willimon & Mr. Wood, Mr. Orr made a motion, seconded by Mr. Strickland, approved 4 - 0 (Ms. Burrell absent) that \$1,750 be transferred from line item 10 009 00150 00064 into line item 10 009 00150 00850 (from fertilizer & lime into building) for the Aeronautics Department to construct a temporary traffic control tower at the airport in anticipation of the traffic flow when the Panthers start using the Clemson football field. See attached letter to Mr. Gene Barnett, Air Traffic Manager, Greer, SC requesting personnel to man this tower.

AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT and CONSENT ORDER

WHEREAS, Oconee County, by and through the Oconee County Sewer Commission (the "Commission") and Beacon Manufacturing Company (the "Company") entered into an Agreement and Consent Order (the "Order") by the execution of the Order by the Commission (Oconee County and the Oconee County Sewer Commission) on December 6, 1994, and by the Company's execution of the Order dated November 30, 1994; and

WHEREAS, the Commission and the Company drafted the Order in a form such that it provided for the approval of the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control ("SCDHEC"); and

WHEREAS, the manufacturing facility in Oconee County, South Carolina which is an industrial user of the System and which is the subject of the Order (the "Facility") was acquired from the Company, now known as Acon Corporation, by Be-Ac, Inc., now known as Beacon Manufacturing Company ("Beacon"); and

WHEREAS, the Commission, the Company and Beacon desire to amend the Order to reflect this change.

NOW THEREFORE, the Commission hereby orders and the Company and Beacon hereby agree to the following:

- Paragraph 4 of the Order shall be deleted in its entirety and the following shall be inserted in its place:
 - 4. The Company's obligation to construct and operate the basin is contingent upon the issuance of permits to Beacon for construction and operation of the basin by S.C. DHEC; and
- Paragraph 5 of the Order shall be deleted in its entirety and the following shall be inserted in its place:

- 5. In consideration of the Company's and/or Beacon's adherence to the compliance schedule set forth in Item 3 above, as well as the Company's and/or Beacon's performance of all other terms and provisions hereof, it is agreed that from the date of execution of this Amendment to Agreement and Order by the Commission, the Company and Beacon, until the earlier of (a) four hundred twenty (420) days from the date of such execution, or (b) the completion of construction of the flow equalization basin, the Commission hereby establishes and grants unto the Company and/or Beacon an interim permit discharge limitation of 600,000 gallons per day for which discharge amounts no surcharge shall be assessed by the Commission. This provision shall not be construed as a waiver of any surcharges which may have occurred prior to the date of execution of the There shall be no rebate of surcharges accrued and paid by the Company prior to the effective date of the Order.
- 3. Paragraph 10 of the Order shall be deleted in its entirety and the following shall be inserted in its place:
 - 10. By agreement of the parties, except as otherwise provided, this Order shall be considered final and effective, and the effective date shall be, upon approval by the Commission, the Company and Beacon, and shall not be appealable by any party.
- 4. The following Paragraph 16 shall be added:
 - 16. The Commission, the Company and Beacon acknowledge and consent to the transfer from the Company to Beacon and the assumption by Beacon, of all the Company's rights and obligations as set forth in the Agreement and Consent Order and this Amendment to Agreement and Consent Order.
- 5. All remaining terms, conditions and provisions of the original Agreement and Order by and between the parties shall be binding upon the parties to such Agreement and Order and to this Amendment thereto and continue in full force and effect upon the parties to this Amendment to Agreement and Order.

Dear Mr. Crain:

On Thursday, January 12, 1995, I called your office to request that our organization, A Community for an Alternative Waste Site (ACAWS), meet with Oconee County Council on February 7, 1995, at 7:00 PM. Your administrative assistant suggested that I follow up my telephone call with a letter giving details as to the nature of our request.

We have information which we have shared with Pickens and Anderson county councils, and would like to share with Oconee. Our subject is the proposed tri-county landfill and solid waste recovery facility. The presentation will take 20-25 minutes. We would like to have a few additional minutes at the end to answer questions from council members.

There are two parts to our presentation. The first is by Dr. David L. Barkley, Professor and Economic Development Specialist, Clemson University. He has worked with several counties in the state in developing plans for municipal solid waste disposal. He will discuss the economic advantages and disadvantages associated with various methods of disposing of municipal solid waste.

Dr. Kerry R. Brooks, Associate Professor, Department of Planning & Landscape Architecture, Clemson University, will discuss the population density of the proposed landfill site in Pickens County. Dr. Brooks' area of expertise include land use planning and development and use of Geographic Information Systems (GIS).

We will need an overhead projector for our charts and maps. Do you have one that we may use? If not, we will arrange to bring one with us. I believe that you will find the presentation informative and interesting. We look forward to meeting with you on the seventh.







This letter is a follow-up to our letter dated January 16, 1995 regarding the Package B Construction Contract. Per our discussion with Marianne Dillard, we are executing a letter with Justice General Contractors which will extend the warranty of the concrete slab which holds the recycling containers at the Mountain Rest site from the contractual period of one year to five years. This warranty change is to compensate for the fact that the compressive strength of the concrete is less than that specified. The specifications require 4,000 psi concrete and the initial cylinders indicate a strength of about 3,000 psi. Zupan and Smith, the concrete supplier, has done extensive additional testing of the slab including taking core samples and using other empirical investigative methods to determine the strength. They also measured the thickness of the slab which has ranged from 7.23 and 7.76 inches thick, which is thicker than the six-inch contractual requirement.

The two options available are to require removal and replacement of the slab or to get an extended warranty. Because the recycling slab is not a critical structural component and the slab does have moderate strength at 3,000 psi, we have opted to execute the extended warranty as opposed to making Justice tear out the slab.

As with Package A, the Contract cannot be totally closed out until the paving is completed, unless a separate contractual agreement is executed between Justice and the County. We see no reason to execute such an agreement and again suggest that the County pay Justice the balance of the contract except for the remaining cost of the asphalt plus an additional 20 percent retainage as agreed to. The Contract would then be on hold until the paving is completed. After the paving is completed, the Final Pay Request would be executed and the contract closed.

The purpose of this letter is to recommend that the County take occupancy of the three staffed convenience centers in Package A (Metromont, Pine Grove, and Salem Sites).

The following is a brief summary of the recent past activities regarding the project and the issues remaining to fully close out the contracts.

HDR performed a final inspection on November 21, 1994, and related punch list correction items to Zorn Company, Inc. under letter dated December 6, 1994. Zorn Company, Inc. indicated via letter dated January 5, 1995, that the punch list items had been completed as of December 28, 1994.

- There have been concerns over the stability of the gravel parking lots. Mr. Hirst of your staff has operated vehicles at each site to verify that they are acceptable at this time.
- As you know, by joint agreement we have deferred the paving of the Metromont and Salem Sites until a time mutually agreed to, anticipated to be in the spring or early summer of 1995.

HDR recommends that the County take occupancy of the sites and open the sites to the public at which time you choose. HDR continues to complete the final contractual paperwork as indicated below.

• HDR will execute a change order which will address changes that have been made to the site by Zorn Company which were improvements to the sites, including some drainage work at Salem, extending a driveway at Metromont, running the phone service underground at each site, and modifying the site lighting at Salem. HDR will prepare and execute a change order for these items for the contractor's and County's signature.

- Zorn Company, Inc. will prepare the Final Partial Pay Request indicating that the County will hold 120 percent of the paving cost of Metromont and Salem Sites. As stated above, at a time mutually agreed to by all parties, Zorn will proceed with the paving of the Metromont and Salem Sites and will be paid the balance of their contract.
- The one-year warranty period will expire December 28, 1995, which coincides with the letter received from Zorn indicating that the punch list items were completed on December 28, 1994.
- The one-year warranty period for the paving at the Metromont and Salem Sites will extend one year from the date of acceptance of the paving.
- As mutually agreed between HDR Engineering and Zorn Company, in the
 event the gravel parking areas become a serious problem over the next few
 months indicating poor performance on Zorn's part, we will meet to discuss
 necessary actions and Zorn will make necessary improvements. Oconee



The purpose of this letter is to bring you up to date on the current activities regarding Package B of the Staffed Convenience Centers and to advise you on the probable completion dates for the Richland and Mountain Rest sites.

The Mountain Rest site is substantially complete and as of January 12 all that remained was to place mulch in some areas. Per our agreement, Justice will pave the Mountain Rest site when weather conditions are more appropriate.

As you know, some of the areas of the paved parking lot at the Richland site do not drain properly. Also, some of the removable handrails sections were difficult to take out because the pipe sleeves Justice used were too small in diameter. We have worked jointly with Justice to resolve both problems in the following way:

- Justice will pour a new concrete curb at the retaining wall which will increase the height of the curb to allow additional pavement to be placed which will direct the water away from the wall as originally intended. The new curb will have new larger pipe sleeves to facilitate removal of the removable handrail.
- Justice will install two temporary area drains in the two low spots of the asphalt which at this time retain water.
- Justice will come back when weather conditions are favorable and place the additional asphalt required to make the drainage right, at which time the temporary drains will be paved over.

Justice is proceeding with placement of the new curb and installation of the area drains. We anticipate that this work will be completed prior to your next council meeting and HDR will prepare a letter recommending the County takes occupancy of both the Mountain Rest and Richland sites prior to the next Council meeting. At a time agreed to by all parties (expected to be late spring or early summer) Justice will pave the Mountain Rest site and place the additional pavement at the Richland site.

Dear Mr. Crain:

The recent investigation of your firm conducted by Investigator May under the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) covered the period November 1992 to November 1994. The investigation disclosed that your employees are subject to the requirements of the Act.

The investigation disclosed violations of FLSA section 6, resulting from the failure to pay employees at least the applicable minimum wage for all hours worked and FLSA Section 7, resulting from the failure to pay statutory overtime pay for hours worked in excess of 40 hours per week. These violations resulted in underpayments totalling \$1,001.98 to 10 employees.

Investigator May has advised me that you have agreed to comply fully with all the provisions of the FLSA in the future and that you have agreed to pay the above-described back wages in full within 30 days after receipt of this letter, and upon approval by the Oconee County Council.

We would like to direct your attention to section 16(e) of the FLSA and Regulations, Part 578. As you will note, section 16(e) provides for the assessment of a civil money penalty for any repeated or willful violations of section 6 or 7, in an amount not to exceed \$1,000 for each such violation. No penalty is being assessed as a result of this investigation. If at any time in the future your firm is found to have violated the monetary provisions of the FLSA, it will be subject to such penalties.

WHEREAS, the fish hatchery is located near the borders of Georgia and North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, the fish hatchery has produced trout for federal waters in South Carolina, Georgia, and North Carolina since its construction in or about 1937; and

WHEREAS, the fish hatchery produces approximately 1 million rainbow and brown trout annually, and as such provides an essential natural resource for the mitigation of fishery resources adversely affected by Federal Water Development Projects; and

That the President of the United States, the United States Congress, and the United States Fish And Wildlife Service, Department of Interior, are hereby urged to continue full federal funding and support for the Walhalla National Fish Hatchery.



As your are aware, Sunbelt Human Advancement Resources, Inc. (SHARE) began to operate the low-income federal block grant programs in Anderson County, effective January 1994, as a part of our expanded opportunities as the local Community Action Agency (CAA).

The SHARE Board felt that this would be a good time to realign its membership by county as it relates to the demographic overview (Appendix A) and financial overview (Appendix B) of SHARE's Service Area (Greenville, Anderson, Oconee and Pickens Counties) for FY '94.

In this connection, I want to confirm that the SHARE Board adopted a plan on November 30, 1993 and reaffirmed on January 20, 1994 which will allocate four (4) representatives from each of the three sectors (public, poor, and private) to Greenville County and one (1) representative from each of these sectors to Anderson, Oconee and Pickens. We had not informed Oconee County Council of these specific plans pending resolution of all concerns addressed by the Division of Economic Opportunity (DEO), Office of the Governor.

In particular, Oconee County will be allocated one (1) representative from each of the three sectors (public, poor and private) for a total of three (3) representatives on the SHARE Board. The poor (client) and private sector representatives will be determined in the appropriate manner prior to our next regular Board meeting in March 1994. The public sector of the SHARE Board currently has its allotted number of public sector representatives. In order not to have more than one-third of the Board being from the public sector, the Board is hereby committed to a goodwill transition whereby all public representatives of the Board will be appropriately appointed with term expiration dates, subject to reappointment effective January 1995. Vacancies in this sector will be filled first by Anderson County and then by Oconee County should any occur prior to full Board transition in January 1995. Public representatives are appointed by County Council in each of the respective counties in accordance with SHARE's By-Laws.

In order not to force current members of the public sector to vacate their seats prior to January 1995, SHARE approved a motion on January 20, 1994 whereby the public sector representative to the SHARE Board may be appointed by Oconee County now to attend meetings and be seated and/or granted voting privileges as appropriate seats are vacated by public sector representatives in Greenville and Pickens Counties during 1994.

We want you to know that SHARE wants to strengthen its partnership with Oconee County. We look forward to receiving the name of Oconee County Council's representative to the SHARE Board. A statement issued by the Division of Economic Opportunity (DEO), Office of the Governor, is enclosed to clarify requirements regarding public sector appointments to CAA Boards (Appendix C).
