The meeting was called to order by Supervisor -Chairman Crain who welcomed the quests and media.

Upon request of Mr. Howard Adams, Sewer Commission Chairman & Mr. Robert Winchester, Sewer Commission Superintendent, and upon concurrence of Ms. Marianne Dillard, Purchasing Agent, Mr. Strickland made a motion, seconded by Mr. Williams, approved 5 - 0 that the bid process be waived and the design for the Greenfield Sewer Project be completed by Goldie & Associates as per Section B. Mr. Hamilton made a motion, seconded by Ms. Burrell, approved 5 - 0 that Resolution 96-2, "A RESOLUTION OPPOSING THE "HOG FARM BILL" - H. NO. 3446" be adopted on first and final reading.

Mr. Orr made a motion, seconded by Mr. Strickland, approved 5 - 0 that a resolution adopted by the Oconee County Planning Commission for Council to fund Ordinance 90-7, "OCONEE COUNTY BUILDING CODE ORDINANCE" be accepted as information.

Upon request of Mr. Marion Lyles, Airport Manager, Mr. Strickland made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hamilton, approved 5 - 0 that a feasibility study be completed regarding new "T" hangars at the airport at an approximate cost of \$4,000.

This recommendation was adopted 5 - 0.

Upon request of Mrs. Kay Olbon, Personnel Coordinator, Mr. Strickland made a motion, seconded by Mr. Williams, approved 5 - 0 that \$1,500 be taken from contingency and placed in line item 10 028 00150 00068 (advertising) to complete this fiscal year.

Upon recommendation of Mr. Jim Smith, Public Buildings Director, & Ms. Marianne Dillard, Purchasing Agent, Mr. Williams made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hamilton, approved 3 - 2 (Mr. Orr & Mr. Strickland voting against) that the bid for a mower for Public Buildings be awarded to Powell Brothers Tractor & Equipment Co., Inc. at a cost of \$6,550.95 which includes a two (2) year warranty. Upon recommendation of Mr. Lee Davis, Motor Pool Foreman, Mr. Tommy Crumpton, Rock Crusher Director & Ms. Dillard, Mr. Hamilton made a motion, seconded by Mr. Orr, approved 5 - 0 that the bid for a Cline Engine for the Rock Crusher be awarded to Boggs Tractor Co., Inc. at a cost of \$14,600. Attached find the following documents relative to the above referenced project for your review.

- A) Preliminary Engineering Report by Goldie & Associates with estimated project budget.
- B) Letter of commitment from the Office of the Governor of South Carolina in the amount of \$265,000 for an economic development grant.
- C) Letter of commitment from the State Budget and Control Board for a grant of \$150,000.

The Sewer Commission has approved contributing the local match of \$218,850 for the total project budget of \$633,850.

With the above commitments in hand we are ready to proceed with the formal design of this project; and, since Goldie & Associates completed the PER for the grant application, the County traditionally has selected the same firm to design and administer the project.

The waiving of formal bidding of professional services requires the concurrence of the County Purchasing Agent, that it is in the County's best interest to do so.

The Sewer Commission has made the recommendation that we use Goldie & Associates, since they are familiar with the project, are local, developed the PER for the grant application, and the proposed fees for design are in the 7-8% range of the total estimated project costs.

I have asked for time on the agenda for the February 20 County Council meeting to address this issue. If you need anything further, please call.

ORDINANCE

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH FOR OCONEE COUNTY PROVISIONS TO IDENTIFY AND MONITOR HAZARDOUS MATERIALS AND PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE.

SECTION 1. PURPOSE.

- (A) It is the intent of this Ordinance to develop a data base of information concerning the location and storage of hazardous materials in Oconee County. This data base will be used to protect all emergency personnel from injury or death from an explosion or fire because of unknown dangerous materials present.
- (B) It is further intended to use this data base to protect the natural environment through the monitoring of use and storage of hazardous materials within Oconee County.
- (C) It is further intended to locate and identify those businesses that should report extremely hazardous substances under SARA Title III, to form site plans and assure compliance.

SECTION 2. SCOPE.

(A) This Ordinance shall apply to all materials which are highly flammable, or which may react to cause fires or explosions or which by their presence create or augment a fire or explosion hazard, or which because of the toxicity, flammability, or liability of explosion render fire fighting, rescue, or public safety operations abnormally dangerous or difficult, or create a threat to public health or safety.

This Ordinance shall also apply to flammable or combustible liquids which are chemically unstable and which may spontaneously form explosive compounds, or undergo spontaneous reactions of explosive violence or with sufficient

evolution of heat to be a fire hazard. Hazardous materials shall include such materials as flammable solids, corrosive liquids, radioactive materials, oxidizing materials, potentially explosive materials, poisonous gases, and hazardous materials known or suspected of chronic toxicity, as defined in this article. This Ordinance shall not include heating fuels, lubricating oils, hydraulic oils, lubricating greases or compressed gases located on residential property for personal use.

- The storing, handling, and dispensing of materials covered by this Ordinance (B) shall be conducted pursuant to the requirements of any and all local, state and federal applicable codes.
- (C) This Ordinance recognizes that transporters of hazardous materials must comply with all United States Department of Transportation regulations, such hazardous materials regulations governing both interstate and intrastate activities.

SECTION 3. DEFINITIONS.

(A) For the purposes of this Ordinance, the following definitions as identified by the United Nations Classification System shall apply:

Class I

- Division 1.1 Explosives with a mass explosion hazard.
- Division 1.2 Explosives with a Projection hazard.
- Division 1.3 Explosives with predominantly a fire hazard.
- Division 1.4 Explosives with no significant blast hazard.
- Division 1.5 Very insensitive explosives.

Class 2

- Division 2.1 Flammable gases (can be ignited easily).
- Division 2.2 Nonflammable gases.
- Division 2.3 Poison gases (any gas of such nature that small amount of the gas, when mixed with air dangerous to life).

Class 3

- Division 3.1 Flashpoint below minus 18°C (0°F)
- Division 3.2 Flashpoint minus 18°C and above but less than 23°C (73°F). Division 3.3 Flashpoint of 23°C and up to 61°C (141°F).

- <u>Class 4</u> Flammable solids; Spontaneously combustible materials; and materials dangerous when wet.
- Division 4.1 Flammable solids (a solid substance, other than one classified as an explosive, which is liable to cause fires through friction, through absorption of moisture, through spontaneous chemical changes, or as a result of retained heat from manufacturing or processing).
- Division 4.2 Spontaneously combustible materials.
- Division 4.3 Materials that are dangerous when wet.

Class 5

- Division 5.1 Oxiders (evolves oxygen either spontaneously or with mild heating).
- Division 5.2 Organic Peroxides.

Class 6 Poisonous and Etiologic (infectious) materials

- Division 6.1 Poison A: A liquid so toxic that an extremely small amount of the vapor formed by the liquid is dangerous to life.
 - Poison B: Less toxic liquids and solids that are hazardous either by contact with the body (skin absorption) or by ingestion.
 - Poison C: Liquids or solids that evolve toxic or strongly irritating fumes when heated or when exposed to air.
- Division 6.2 Etiological (infectious) materials.

<u>Class 7</u> <u>Radioactive materials</u>

Any materials or combination of materials that spontaneously emits ionizing radiation.

Class 8 Corrosives

Any acids, alkaline caustic liquids, and other corrosive liquids which when in contact with living tissue will cause severe damage of such tissue by chemical action; in case of leakage, will materially damage or destroy other containers of other hazardous commodities by chemical action and cause the release of their contents; or are liable to cause fire when in contact with organic matter or with certain materials.

- (B) Extremely hazardous substances are those substances designated as such by the administrator of the United States Environmental Protection Agency.
- (C) For the purpose of registration, the following Registration Categories are hereby established and defined:

CATEGORY A: Includes any facility which uses, produces or stores extremely hazardous substances as defined by Section 302 of the Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act of 1986 (SARA Title III); and meets or exceeds the Threshold Planning Quantity (TPQ) under the Extremely Hazardous Substanceslist, or under the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA) of 1980 list.

CATEGORY B: Includes any facility which produces Hazardous substance(s) and/or stores Hazardous Substances(s) for wholesale and /or any facility which uses Hazardous Substance(s) as defined in Section 3 (a) of this Ordinance and meets or exceeds quantities listed in Section 3 (E) of this Ordinance.

CATEGORY C: Includes any facility which handles or stores any Hazardous Substance(s) as defined in Section 3 (A) of this Ordinance and meets or exceeds quantities listed in Section 3(E) of this Ordinance for retail sale to the general public.

- (D) For the purpose of registration, the term Hazardous Substances does not include:
 - 1. Any food, food additive, color additive, drug or cosmetic regulated by the Food and Drug Administration.
 - 2. Any substance to the extent it is used for personal, family or household purposes.
 - 3. Any substance to the extent it is used in medical research laboratory or a hospital or other medical facility under the direct supervision of a technically qualified individual.
 - 4. Any substance to the extent it is used by a food service facility in the preparation of such food for human consumption.
 - 5. Any substance to the extent it is stored and used by the facility for janitorial and housekeeping purposes only.

(E) A registration shall be required with the Oconee County Emergency Preparedness Agency for the use, handling, production, and/or storage of any quantity of Hazardous Chemicals as defined under Section 3 (A), which meets or exceeds the below-listed amounts.

NOTE:

A registration shall also be required for those facilities which adhere to Section 3, Category (A) of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. REGISTRATION REQUIRED

- A. No registration shall be valid after the last day of the year in which it was issued.
- B. Government agencies are not exempted from compliance.
- C. This ordinance shall not apply to small farming operations (raising cattle, crops for personal and livestock consumption) provided the storing, handling, and use of hazardous materials is for farming purposes only. Commercial farming, dairy, chicken, and cattle operations are not exempted from compliance.
- D. Registrations are nontransferable.

SECTION 5. OFFICIAL'S RIGHT OF ENTRY

- A. The appropriate official designated by the County Supervisor as his authorized representative may at all reasonable times request access to any building whether completed or under construction, or to any property for the purpose of making an inspection or investigation to enforce any of the provisions of this Ordinance and, if denied, and a belief exists as to probable cause that hazardous materials are present, then such official shall have the authority to seek a search warrant to allow inspection of the premises.
- B. If an emergency or threat to public safety appears to exist, the County may petition for a court order enjoining the owner or occupant of the premises from conducting business or storing product in question.
- C. No person, owner, or occupant of any building or premise shall fail, after proper credentials are displayed, to permit entry into any building or onto any property by the appropriate official designated by the County Supervisor, or a duly authorized agent, for the purpose of inspections pursuant to this Ordinance. Any person violating this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction sentenced to a \$200.00 fine or 30 days in jail for each offense.

SECTION 6. SAMPLING PERMITTED

The appropriate officials may verify the contents of any substance container by requiring a sample for analysis if the holder of owner, or owner of a substance container is unable to identify or substantiate the contents through the production of trade-accepted manifests and/or acceptable documentation. Sampling and/or the cost of sampling shall be the responsibility of the holder or owner of the substance container. Sampling analysis shall be in accordance with standard laboratory techniques.

SECTION 7. VEHICLE INSPECTION

No materials shall be transported in any vehicle which has physical, mechanical or electrical defects which could cause or contribute to fire or explosion or which are improperly placarded, as provided in the United States Department of Transportation Regulation. The appropriate Officials designated by the County Supervisor and any County law enforcement officer shall have the authority to inspect a vehicle transporting materials for such defects or violations and shall prohibit a defective vehicle or improperly placarded vehicle transporting materials on roads and highways within the County.

SECTION 8. DISPOSAL

Disposal of materials shall be by methods meeting all requirements of state and federal law.

SECTION 9. REIMBURSEMENT.

In the event of a spill or release of any hazardous material, as defined by this Ordinance, which would require Oconee County to commit its hazardous material resources, the party or parties (includes transporters of hazardous materials in and through Oconee County) responsible for such spill or release shall pay all costs incurred by Oconee County, including all legal fees, in its efforts to mitigate any risks to life, property and/or the environment caused by such spill or release. The Oconee County Supervisor, or his designee shall have the sole authority to commit Oconee County's hazardous material resources.

SECTION 10. ENFORCEMENT AND ADMINISTRATION.

The Oconee County Emergency Preparedness Agency will be responsible for administration of this Ordinance and maintaining registrations.

SECTION 11. DISPOSITION OF FUNDS COLLECTED.

- A. All funds collected pursuant to this ordinance shall be remitted to the County Treasurer and credited to the County's General Fund.
- B. The funds generated by this Ordinance will be allocated to the Local Emergency Planning Committee as described by the Community Right-to-Know Act, SARA Title III. The Committee will use these funds to purchase hazardous material equipment, develop a hazardous material response capability and conduct training needed for combating all hazardous material incidents.

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- C. Replenishment of materials for the HAZ-MAT team will be expedited through the County Purchasing Office to ensure adequate materials are available for appropriate response.

SECTION 12. NOTICES AND ORDERS.

Whenever the Fire Marshal or a duly authorized agent designated by the County Supervisor finds in any building or upon any premises dangerous or hazardous conditions (any condition that does not meet Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC), Occupational Health & Safety Association (OSHA), National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), or Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) requirements regarding chemical material containment), there shall be issued such notice or orders to remove or remedy the conditions as may be necessary for the protection of life and property from fire and smoke or explosion.

SECTION 13. VIOLATION AND PENALTIES.

(A) Any person or person acting as agent for an incorporated business that operates or maintains any occupancy, premises or vehicle subject to this Ordinance, who fails to rectify any existing violation of this Ordinance on premises under his control, or who fails to take immediate action to abate a violation of this Ordinance when ordered or notified to do so by the

appropriate official designated by the County Supervisor or his duly authorized representative, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and sentenced to pay a fine of \$200.00 or thirty (30) days in jail for each offense.

(B) Any person or person acting as agent for an incorporated business that fails to register material(s) covered by this Ordinance is in violation of the Ordinance and is subject to the penalties and fees as previously outlined in Section 13 (A).

SECTION 14. ORDINANCE LEGALITY.

(A) If any section, subsection or clause of this Ordinance is found to be unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, the validity or the remaining section, subsections and clauses shall not be affected thereby.

Walhalla National Fish Hatchery

Dear Mr. Cain:

This letter follows up our telephone conversation several days ago in which we discussed the potential acquisition of the property at the Walhalla National Fish Hatchery in Oconee County. The Department already has entered into an agreement with the United States Fish and Wildlife Service, whereby the Department will assume responsibility for operation of the hatchery for a period of twenty-five (25) years. However, the Department hopes to make the arrangement even more permanent and has contacted Congressman Graham's office about seeking legislation to permanently transfer the property.

As you know, some controversy has arisen in the past about the status of Oconee County's reversionary interest in the fish hatchery property. At the time the County donated the property to the federal government back in the 1930's, the County retained a right of reverter in the event the federal government ceased using the property as a fishhatchery. Over the years, management responsibility for a portion of the property was transferred from the Fish and Wildlife Service to the United States Forestry Service. In the 1960's, the County gave its deed to the Forestry Service, which purported to grant the County's reversionary interest to that federal agency. As I understand the controversy, which is mainly a controversy among federal agencies, an issue arose over the scope of the County's grant of its reversionary interest. At your request, I enclose herewith copies of all documents in my possession relating to the various conveyances of the property where the fish hatchery is now located. Additionally, I have enclosed with this letter a copy of the current agreements between the Department of Natural Resources and the United States Fish and Wildlife Service over transfer of management responsibility for the fish hatchery to this Department.

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In order to avoid any future controversy over the County's reversionary interest in the fish hatchery property, if any, the Department hereby requests that Oconee County convey whatever reversionary interest it might currently retain to the Department of Natural Resources. Thus far, the Department has received excellent cooperation from all federal agencies involved; however, in the event Congress does transfer title of the property to the State, the Department of Natural Resources thinks it important to tie up any loose end in connection with the County's reversionary interest.

As County Attorney, I appreciate your willingness to work with the Department on this matter. If I can provide any additional information to you, please contact me.

Thank you again for your attention to this matter.
