The regular meeting of the Oconee County Council was held Tuesday, September 03, 1996 at 7:00 pm in Council Chambers with all Council Members and the County Attorney present.

The meeting was called to order by Supervisor - Chairman Crain who welcomed the guests and media.

Ms. Burrell made a motion, seconded by Mr. Williams, approved 5 - 0 that the minutes of the August 20, 1996 meeting be adopted as printed.

After further discussion, Mr. Strickland made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hamilton, approved 5 - 0 that a public hearing regarding Ordinance 96-8 be scheduled Thursday, September 26, 1996 at 7:00 P.M. in the courtroom.

Mr. Hamilton made a motion, seconded by Mr. Strickland, approved 5 - 0 that Council go on record urging the Legislative Delegation to introduce legislation as quickly as possible that will more clearly delineate the counties ability to enact such legislation.



Dear Ms. Reidhead and Mr. Hesterberg,

I write with a special request concerning the the grant awarded to the Lunney Museum in November 1993 for the stabilization of the carriage house roof. Due to extenuating circumstances, we have been unable to complete the project for which this grant was intended. Requests for quotes were sent out to several qualified vendors by the Oconee County Purchasing Department on two occasions, and failed to secure a contractor interested in undertaking the work. Unfortunately, our progress in resolving this matter was brought to a halt with the resignation last spring of Betty Plisco, our director, and the project manager for the grant. We were behind schedule at that time, and though other contractors have been consulted since, it does not appear likely that we will be able to undertake this restoration as envisioned in the original application.

We did not anticipate these problems, and would like to ask that you consider the unusual factors contributing to the delay. We have another restoration project in progress for which we are currently seeking funds, and we would like you to consider applying our present grant to that project. Last spring we repaired the roof of the Lunney house, and installed crickets at the chimneys. This spring, thanks to extra money received from the Oconee County Council, we have been able to repoint the masonry of three of the chimneys, leaving one large chimney in need of repair. We would like to request that the funds set aside for the carriage house grant be applied instead to the current project, allowing us to complete the chimney work that is urgently needed.


We have been fortunate to have been able to use the services of the Meadors Construction Corporation of Charleston, South Carolina to repoint the chimneys. We were able to seek the services of this firm because they are currently working on a project in Greenville. As required by the county, we sought proposals from several qualified vendors, and the Meadors company was the only firm to return a quote. They are restoration specialists. Their master mason is a man in his seventies with more than fifty years of experience. He specializes in historic preservation.

This request represents an urgent need. We have been informed by the masons and by the consulting architect that the mortar of the remaining chimney is in bad condition. Because of the restoration project in progress in Greenville, this experienced crew is available to undertake our job during a limited period of time. Also, the scaffolding materials are in place at the site, and it is a relatively simple matter to transfer the materials to the last chimney at this time.

The Oconee County Council has made additional funds available for the work that we have just undertaken. They waived the procurement requirements to allow us to include additional chimney work that exceeded our original budget. With these ATAX funds, we would need to request special permission from them to continue and complete this special work with this contractor, as they did on the previous occasion. Without assistance, we do not have sufficient funds to undertake this remaining work.

As you are aware, our facility is a major tourist site in our county. Our historic facility requires special maintenance and upkeep. We have a special opportunity to complete an important project that cannot be done by local contractors. We appreciate your consideration of this important matter.

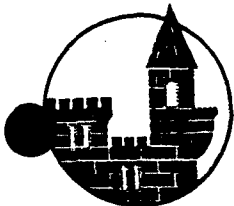

The Lunney Museum attracts more than two thousand visitors each year, approximately 28% of whom are tourists. Lunney Museum brochures are stocked at all SC Welcome Centers, the Museum is mentioned in the SC Tourism Guide and in brochures put out by the Pendleton Historic District and by Discover UpCountry. It is also listed in the SC Federation of Museum Guide and has been the subject of numerous articles which reach a wide regional audience. A listing in the Newsletter for Time-Share participants has brought Visitors from all parts of the United States to the Museum. A very complimentary article in an AAA Travel Guide with distribution throughout the Midwest has also generated Visitors. In addition our own OCMA newsletter is sent quarterly to more than 600 people in twenty-five states and two foreign countries. The Museum routinely hosts participants in various Clemson University workshops and was the site of the South Carolina Federation of Museum's meetings in spring of 1994, which brought Museum professionals and their families from both Carolinas to the area for their annual meeting. Museum presentations for local civic and service groups serve as a reminder for local residents to bring out of town visitors to the Lunney.

All of the Visitors enjoy the interpretation of the life and times of a small Southern town prior to World War I. The Lunney home and its outbuildings are listed on the National Register of Historic buildings and represent an outstanding example of the Arts and Crafts period of architecture and decoration. This historic property is one a very few in the Upstate with all of its structures intact and virtually unchanged.

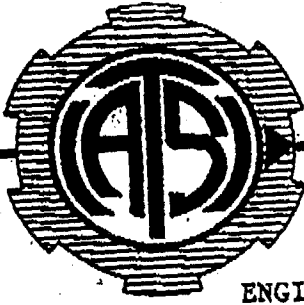
