#### MINUTES, OCONEE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING

The regular meeting of the Oconee County Council was held Tuesday, February 18, 1997 at 3:00 pm in Council Chambers with all Council Members and the County Attorney present.

The meeting was called to order by Supervisor - Chairman Orr who welcomed the guests and media.

The invocation was given by Mr. Timms.

Ms. Burrell made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Hughes, approved 5 - 0 that the minutes of the February 4, 1997 meeting be adopted as printed.

Upon request of Mr. Steven Brewer, Arts & Historical Commission, Mr. Hamilton made a motion, seconded by Mr. Timms that \$3,000 in line item number 10 006 00150 62501 be approved for performances in the schools at a cost of \$750 each for the following performances:

Ms. Hughes, Vice Chairperson, Personnel & Intergovernmental Committee, informed Council it was the recommendation of the committee that persons who had requested to be placed on the mailing list for the agenda and notification of all Council Meetings as well as to be placed on the agenda whether they wished to speak or not be sent a letter informing them of the dates and times of the regular meetings of Council, the agenda will be published in the Journal/Tribune on Saturday prior to the meeting on Tuesday, the agenda will be made available at the libraries, the city halls, the courthouse and anyone who wishes may come by the County Council Office and pick up a copy of the agenda and that the agenda will no longer be mailed to private individuals.

Council briefly discussed the need for a comprehensive land use plan in the county to be able to receive funds for the airport, some of the Council Members stated their opposition to zoning, however, there is a difference in zoning and land use, the airport is vital to the county as there are presently one hundred, nineteen businesses and industries who use the airport.

Mrs. Hughes made a motion, seconded by Ms. Burrell, approved 5 - 0 that Mr. Wayne Rholetter be appointed to represent District IV on the Aeronautics Commission.

Mr. Hamilton made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Hughes, approved 5 - 0 that Mr. Stan Cappiello's resignation as member of the Arts & Historical Commission be accepted and Mrs. Louise Bell be appointed to replace him.

Roads & Transportation Adjourn C. Members of the Blue Ridge Arts Council meet regularly with Bonnie Rushlow, Fine Arts Coordinator for the School District of Oconee County, to keep abreast of the school district's goals and objectives for arts programs in the schools. We feel that through this close coordination we can continue to provide the expertise and assistance in helping the Residency-Plus program closely align with the school district's strategic plan to provide a comprehensive, sequential discipline-based arts education for all students.

The School District of Oconee County has been an Arts in Basic Curriculum (ABC) model site since 1989. The district fine arts' plan has the following goal: "The School District of Oconee County believes that each child should be provided with a quality education in all of the disciplines. Therefore, it is our goal that each child have access to a comprehensive, sequential education in the arts. It is the intent of the school district to offer all children a disciplined-based arts education. Our goal is two-fold: to improve our current offerings and to expand our programs in the fine arts to include theatre/drama, dance, and an emphasis on creative writing as an art form." Because the Blue Ridge Arts Council encompasses all the arts areas, we are confident that we can continue to provide the schools with quality leadership in helping them to accomplish this goal.

Although students in the Oconee schools are taught by certified arts specialists, there is a dimension of their arts education which is missing. The residencies provide skills, knowledge, and exposure that they do not receive in their regular arts classes. In addition, many of the schools do not currently have specialists teaching dance, drama, and creative writing. The AEI program gives the students and classroom teachers a chance to investigate these disciplines. Working with professional artists gives them an opportunity to explore new media and techniques. It also introduces them to many different cultures, as well as arts-related careers. In addition to the benefits to the students, the residency can serve as a positive way to gain support for the arts in the school and community. It is our goal to make the AEI program a meaningful experience for all involved -- students, teachers, school, and community.

This is the first year that Blue Ridge Arts Council has participated in the AEI grant program. The Oconee County Arts and Historical Commission, which has generously supported the school district's artist residencies in the past, has continued this support through the Blue Ridge Arts Council this year. The Blue Ridge Arts Council and the School District of Oconee County believe that if the program is to have a lasting impact, we must provide as many substantive residencies for the students as possible. The following measures will be taken to ensure that this will happen: (1) All residencies must be planned to build upon the art programs that are already in existence. This will be accomplished through school and community input before, during, and after the residencies. (2) Teachers will be encouraged to follow-up the residencies with interdisciplinary instruction in their classrooms. It is important for each residency to be an integral part of the school's total program -- not just an "add-on enrichment activity." (3) The Multi-Site Coordinator and the In-School Coordinators will work with individuals in the schools and community to ensure that the AEI program has a lasting impact though community service opportunities and public relations efforts. In addition, on-site planning will be coordinated with other community-based agencies such as the housing authority project, the Oconee County Arts and Historical Commission, the Senior Citizens Center, Head Start, Tribble Center and others to ensure appropriate residencies, demonstrations, and performances. It is our hope that we will be able to provide more residencies in the future.

Information concerning artist/student interaction, teacher-artist mentorship, overall educational value of residency, and strengths and weaknesses of residency will be used by the Multi-Site Coordinator in evaluating the program for the final report.

D. The Blue Ridge Arts Council has worked closely with the School District of Oconee County for over twenty years. During the past seven years, we have formed a partnership with the school district to offer a number of exciting programs. With the expansion of the AEI program the Council agreed to assume the responsibilities of the Residency-Plus program.

As the Multi-Site Coordinator, the Executive Director of Blue Ridge, Reeta Singh, works closely with Bonnie Rushlow, Fine Arts Coordinator for the school district, to facilitate the operation of the Residency-Plus program. Ms. Singh will be responsible for assisting the twenty schools with the booking of appropriate residencies, facilitating the logistics of the artists' visits (contracts, travel from school to school, motel accommodations, payment, etc.), helping to coordinate matching funds (school district, schools, Oconee County Arts and Historical Commission, and "projects" program), assisting with the training of the In-School Coordinators regarding their responsibilities, assisting with publicity, and preparing the final report for the South Carolina Arts Commission. Additional assistance associated with the Residency-Plus program will be provided by the Multi-Site Coordinator to those sites which have special needs.

The Blue Ridge Arts Council will work with the schools and the artists to plan community service projects. These may include teacher workshops/inservice meetings, PTA programs, parent visits, community arts organization participation, and other community service involvement. We are especially excited about the opportunity to be involved with a group of children who live in the county public housing projects, the Senior Activity Center and Head Start, and the Tribble Center, a school for the mentally disabled. Ms. Singh will work with the Coordinator of Community Relations for the S. C. Regional Housing Authority #1, Melvin Martin; the Director of Activities at the Senior Activity Center, Edna Pitts; the director of the Head Start program, Ruth Whittel; and the Director of Tribble Center, Marvin Grey, to facilitate a program which will meet the needs of the children and seniors.

There will be many opportunities available for the artists to share their expertise with the community. Ms. Singh will coordinate programs for the Blue Ridge Arts Council membership and the community as a whole.

The principals and teachers at each school know the importance of providing appropriate space and equipment for the visiting artists. Every effort will be made to accommodate the needs of the artists. The In-School Coordinators will work with the artists to make sure that the proposed space and equipment are appropriate. The Multi-Site Coordinator will stress the importance of providing optimal space and equipment when finalizing the logistics of the residencies.

Each school and community organization will be responsible for conducting an evaluation after each residency. This process will be handled by the In-School Coordinator. Evaluation forms furnished by the South Carolina Arts Commission will be used. The Multi-Site Coordinator will utilize the information provided to principals, teachers, visiting artists, students, and community members to analyze the success of the residencies and plan for future AEI programs. Information concerning artist/student interaction, overall educational value of residency, and strengths and weaknesses of residency will be used by the Multi-Site Coordinator in evaluating the program for the final report.

Please find attached a copy of a letter I sent to Tim Cain at your suggestion. I hope it meets with your approval. I must stress to you the need for quick action on the franchise renewal. The Franchise Agreement (Ordinance No. 82-1) between Northland Cable Television, Inc. ("Northland") and the County of Oconee will expire on April 5, 1997. We first wrote the county, 34 months in advance of the expiration, to request that formal renewal proceedings be commenced pursuant to section 626(a) of the Communications Act of 1934, 47 U.S.C 546 (the "Act"). Since than Norman, Tim and I worked out what I believe to be a good compromise document, that I believe You and Council will find acceptable.

In a related matter, you had indicated an interest in our servicing the five forks area west of Walhalla and Westminster, currently served by Galaxy. We have been pursuing this matter and have found some interest from the Galaxy people, in having us take it over. I have been told that the only thing standing in the way is the fact that our franchise about to expire.

If there is any thing I can do to expedite the renewal, please let me know. As always, if I or any of my staff can help you in any way, with any matter please don't hesitate to call on us.

Re: Northland Cable Television, Inc./ County of Oconee, South Carolina - Request for Franchise Renewal

Dear Mr. Cain:

In a brief discussion I had with Harrison Orr, I asked what I need to do to get our franchise renewal back on track. He suggested that I contact you, work out the last details and get it back to him.

To my recollection, the last item in discussion, is the definition of a "Cable Mile". This comes up in regard to the requirement to extend service to any unserviced area of the county. In this case the requirement is 18 subscribers per cable mile or 35 potential subscribers per cable mile. These terms are in Section 5 (B) & (D) of the proposed franchise.

My desire is that we avoid misunderstandings and measurements that take unusable routes or would require us to extend beyond required engineering standards. I also don't want to appear to be avoiding extensions by unreasonable technicalities. In my attempt to balance these pitfalls, I submit the following.

#### Section 2. Definitions.

K) "Cable mile" A unit of length equal to 5,280 feet or 1,760 yards (1,609 meters), used to measure the length of cable construction necessary to extend service to one or more potential subscribers. Beginning at a point within 150' of a potential subscriber and extending on or along public easements or dedicated rights-of-way to which Grantee can gain reasonable access, to the closest point of connection with the Cable Transmission System that will allow for extension of service for that distance and still remain within the reasonable signal standards as specified by Grantee and the FCC.

Please let me know if this is acceptable and when it may be convenient to get together to finalize this document.

IN COMPARING THE SUBMITTED BIDS FOR A 1997 4 X 4 FOUR-DOOR VEHICLE, THE CHEVY TAHOE AND FORD EXPEDITION WERE THE TWO VEHICLES MEETING MINIMUM SPECIFICATION AND BEING CLOSE IN PRICE. UPON FIRST GLANCE, THE EXPEDITION APPEARS TO BE THE LONE CHOICE DUE TO PRICE, BUT THE TAHOE HAS SEVERAL ADVANTAGES TO OFFSET ITS \$2,291.73 IN ADDITIONAL COST. PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING CONSIDERATIONS:

-THE OVERALL INTERIOR OF THE VEHICLE IS MORE SPACIOUS AS EVIDENCED BY THE FIGURES SUPPLIED BY THE MANUFACTURER'S OF EACH VEHICLE. THE TAHOE HAS 4.4 CUBIC FEET MORE CARGO AREA AND THE REAR CARGO OPENING IS 10.10 INCHES WIDER THAN THAT OF THE EXPEDITION. THERE IS ALSO MORE HEAD AND SHOULDER ROOM IN THE TAHOE. THESE FACTORS BECOME IMPORTANT AS THE INTENDED USE OF THIS VEHICLE IS FOR SURVEILLANCE AND EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM USE AND EQUIPMENT STORAGE; THESE ACTIVITIES REQUIRE THE QUICK ACCESS OF NUMEROUS PIECES OF EQUIPMENT THAT ARE BULKY AND EXPENSIVE AND THE TRANSPORTING OF SEVERAL TEAM MEMBERS IN FULL RAID STYLE GEAR. FURTHER MORE, THE INTERIOR OF THE TAHOE HAS MORE OPEN FLOOR SPACE FOR THE MOUNTING OF RADIOS AND OTHER SPECIALIZED EQUIPMENT.

- -THE TAHOE HAS A 255 HORSE POWER ENGINE WHILE THE EXPEDITION ONLY HAS 230 HORSE POWER. THE ADDITIONAL HORSE POWER WILL BE NECESSARY TO FACILITATE THE TOWING OF TRAILERS, FOUR WHEELERS AND BOATS UTILIZED BY THE DEPARTMENT.

- -THE SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT CURRENTLY UTILIZES A TAHOE AND IT HAS PROVEN ITSELF TO BE VERY CAPABLE OF HANDLING THE TASKS REQUIRED OF IT WHILE NOT BEING A MAINTENANCE BURDEN. THE EXPEDITION IS A NEW LINE VEHICLE AND HAS NO TRACK RECORD AS TO ITS PERFORMANCE AND MAINTENANCE REQUIREMENTS.
